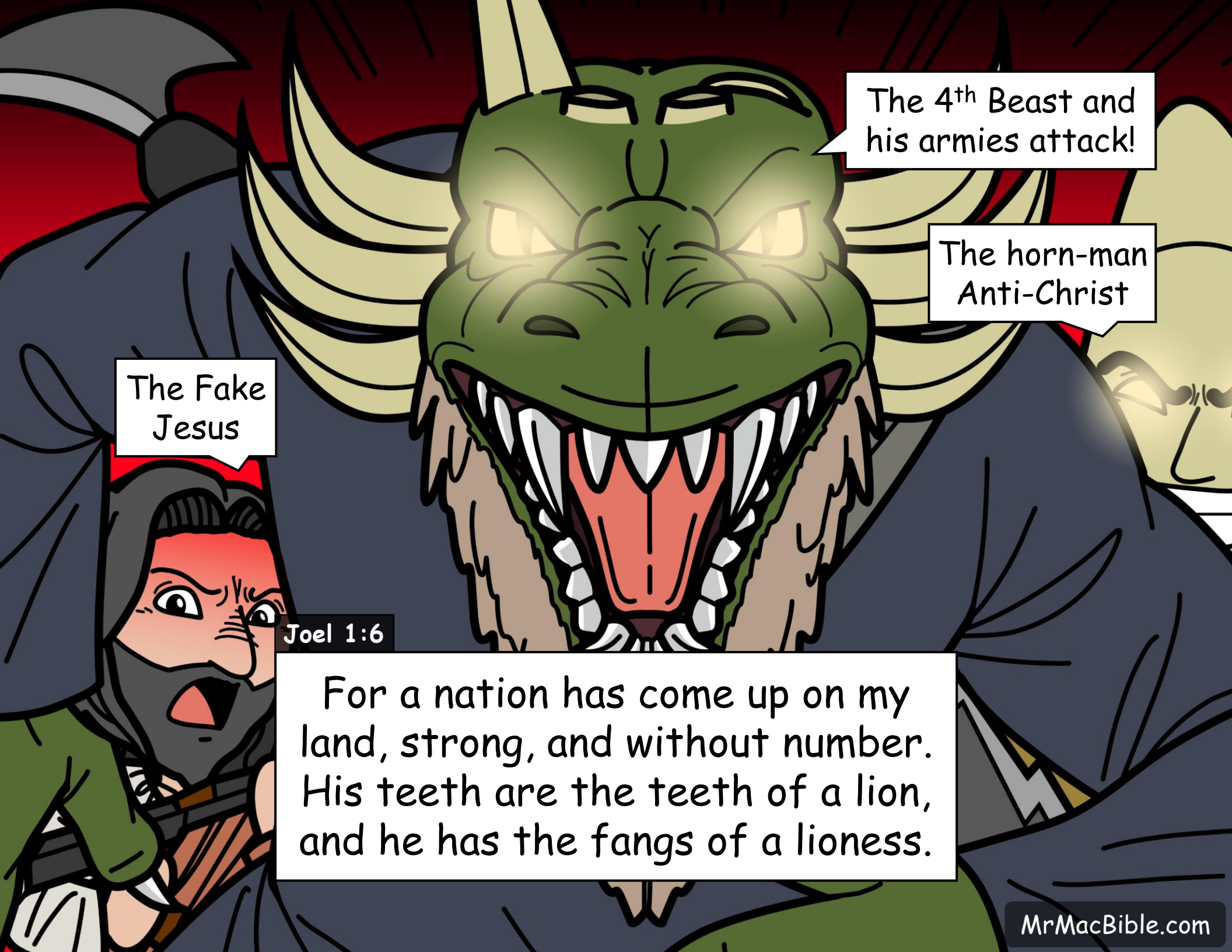

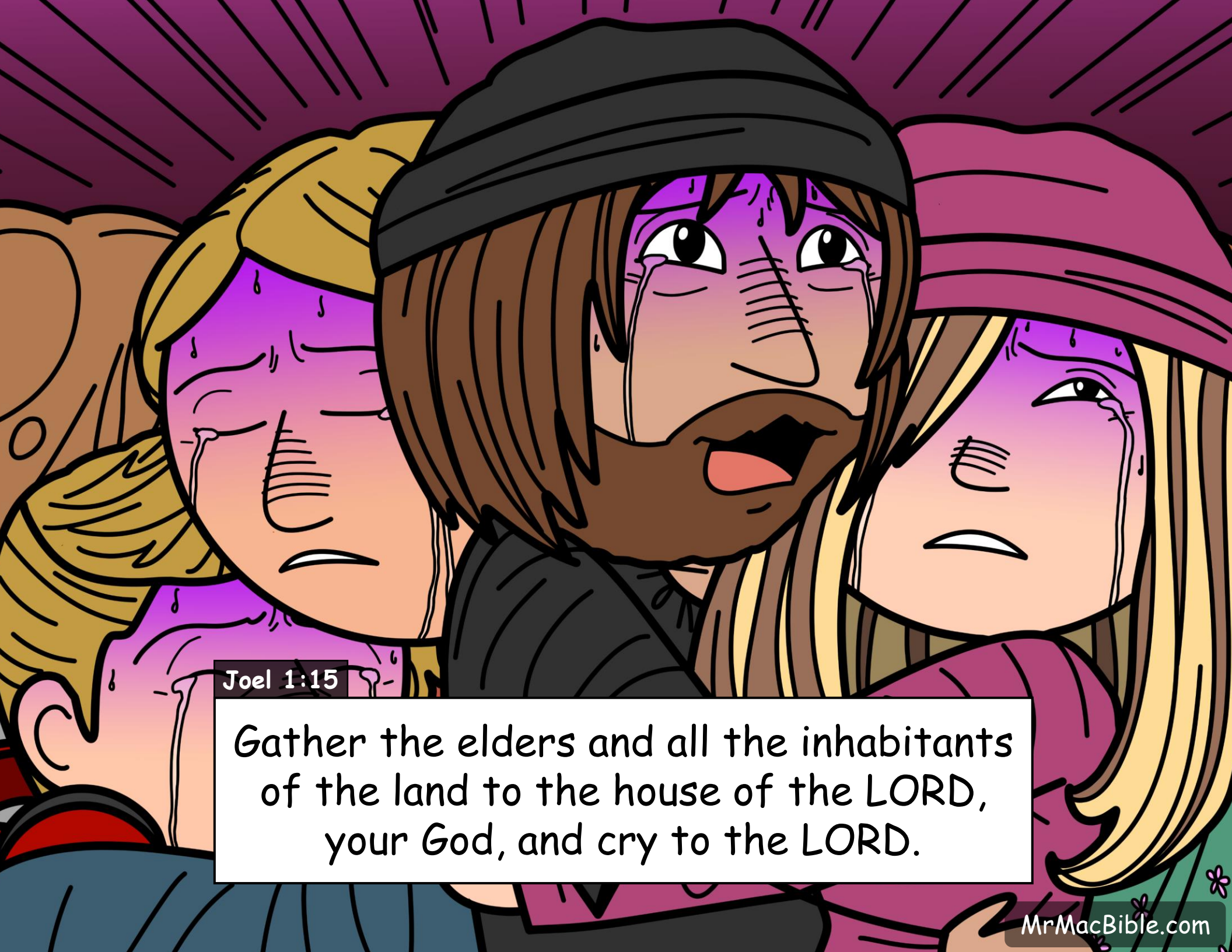
Joel 1:6

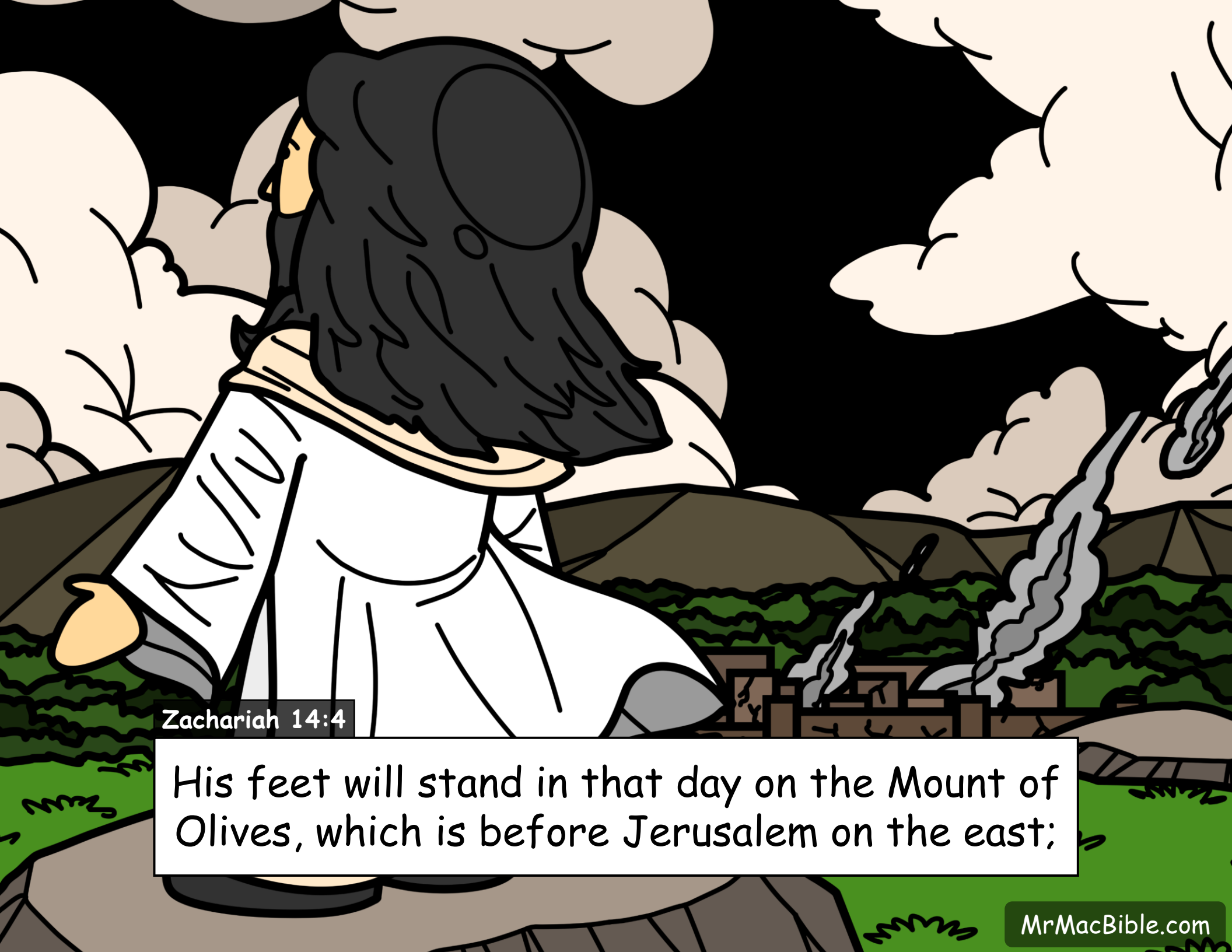
Zachariah 14:2

Then the LORD will go out and fight against those nations, as when he fought in the day of battle.



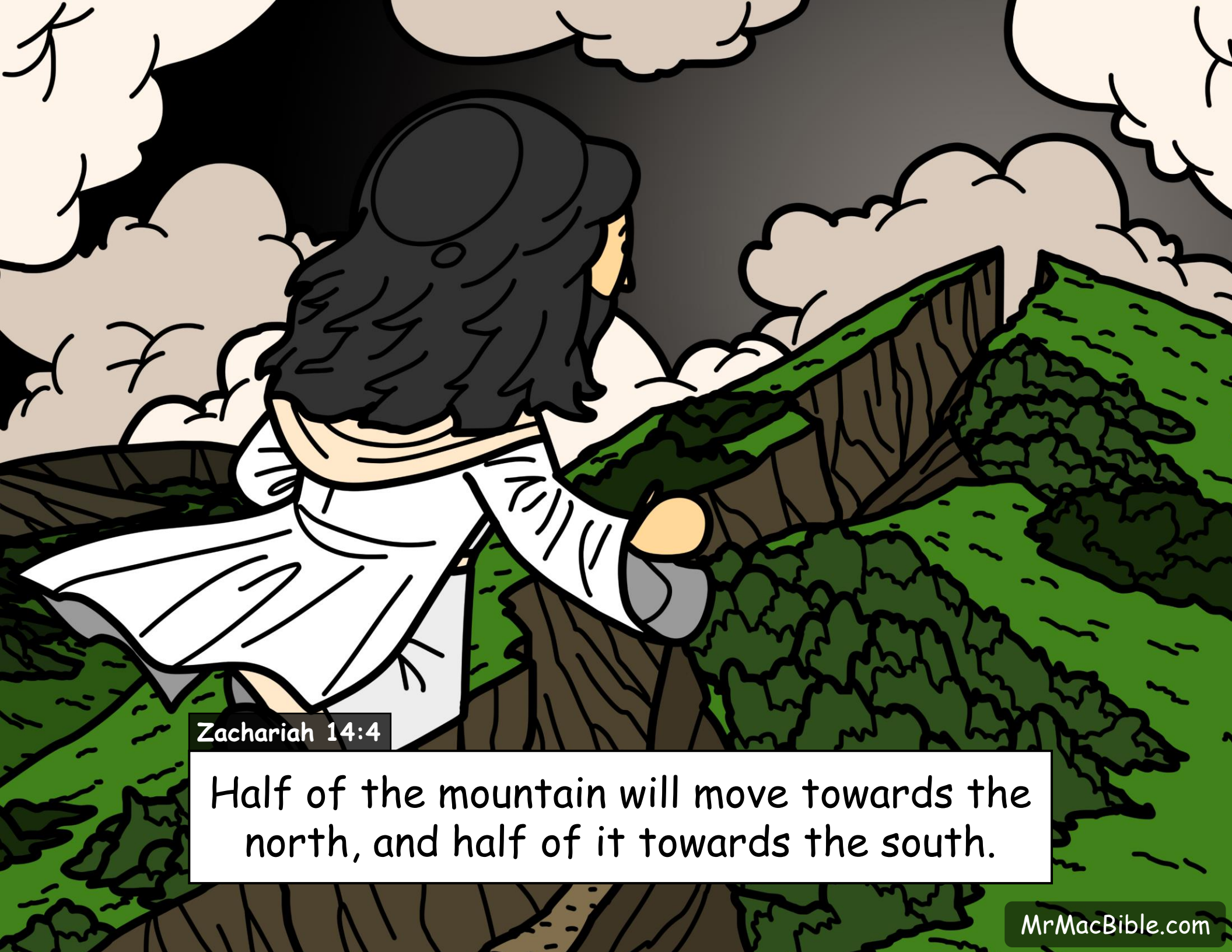
Zachariah 14:4

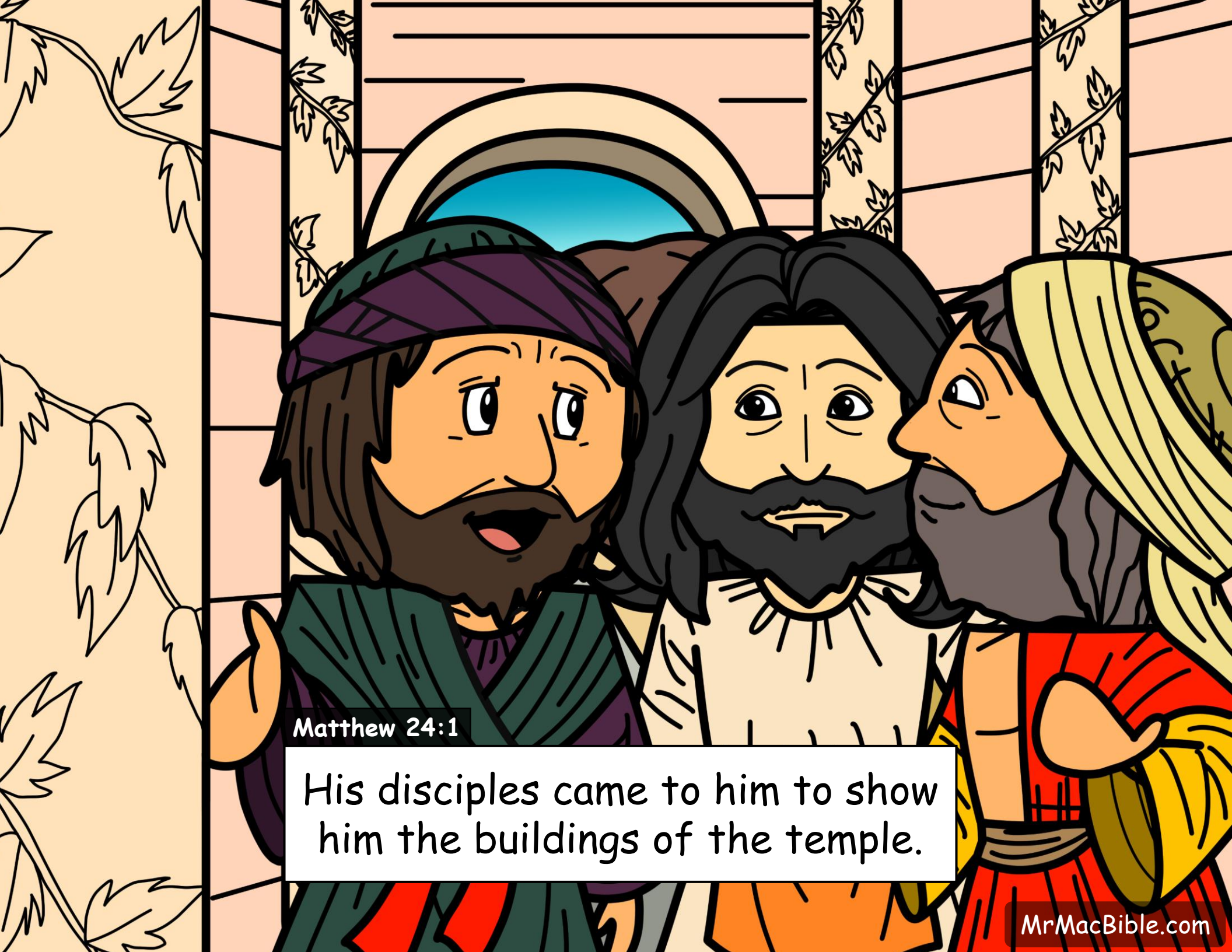
Background:

and of the end of the age?"



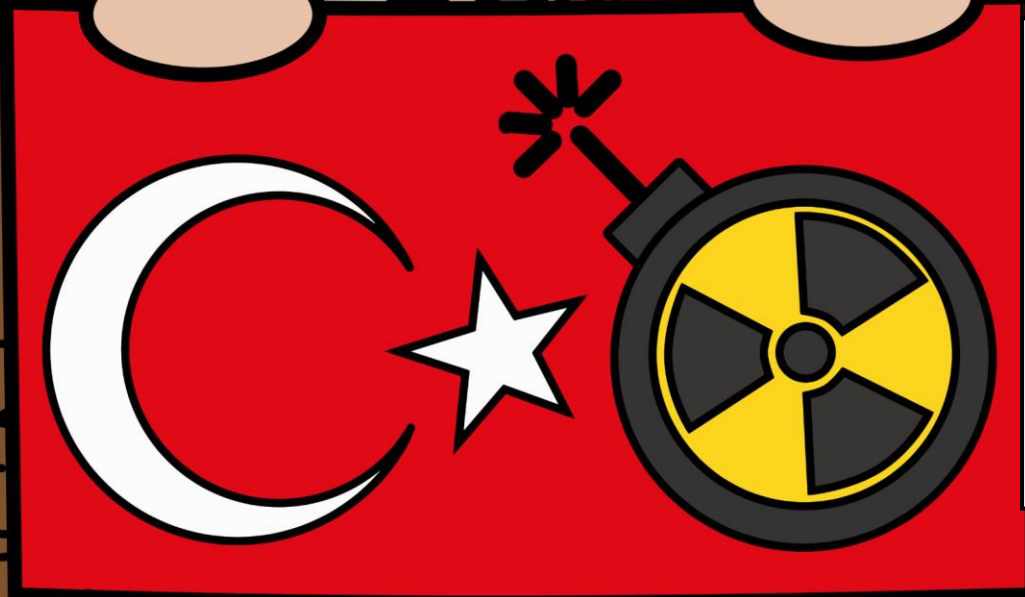
