

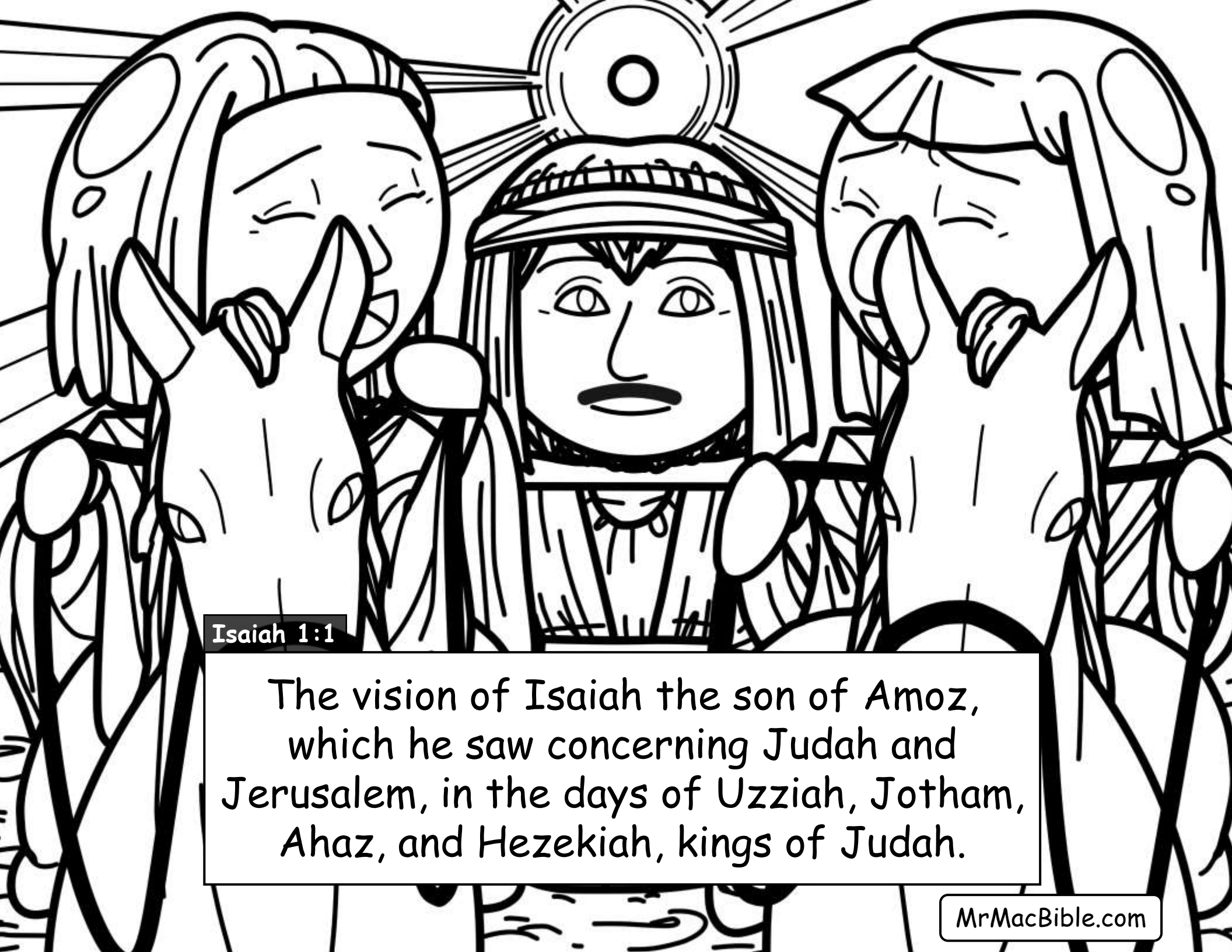

you will eat the good of the land;"



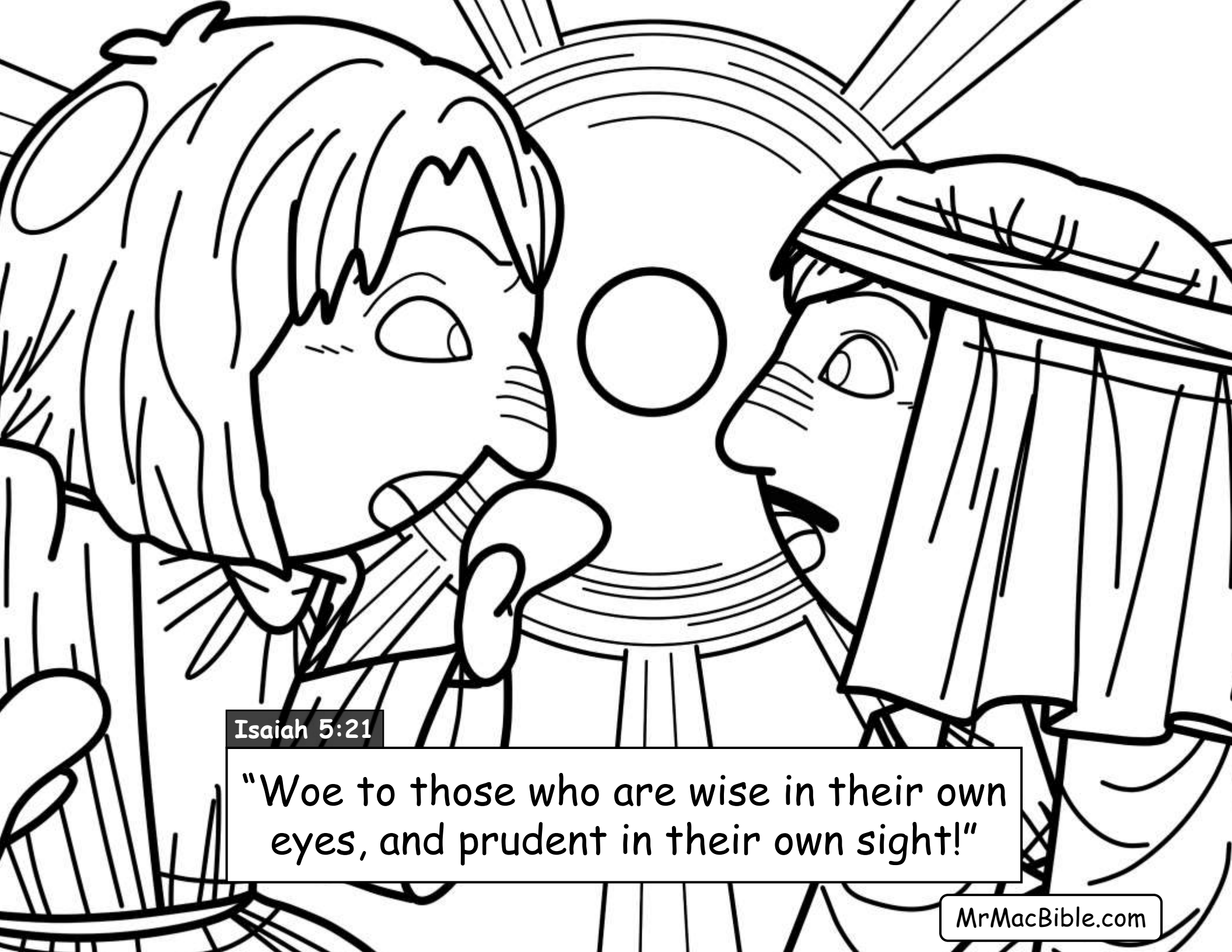

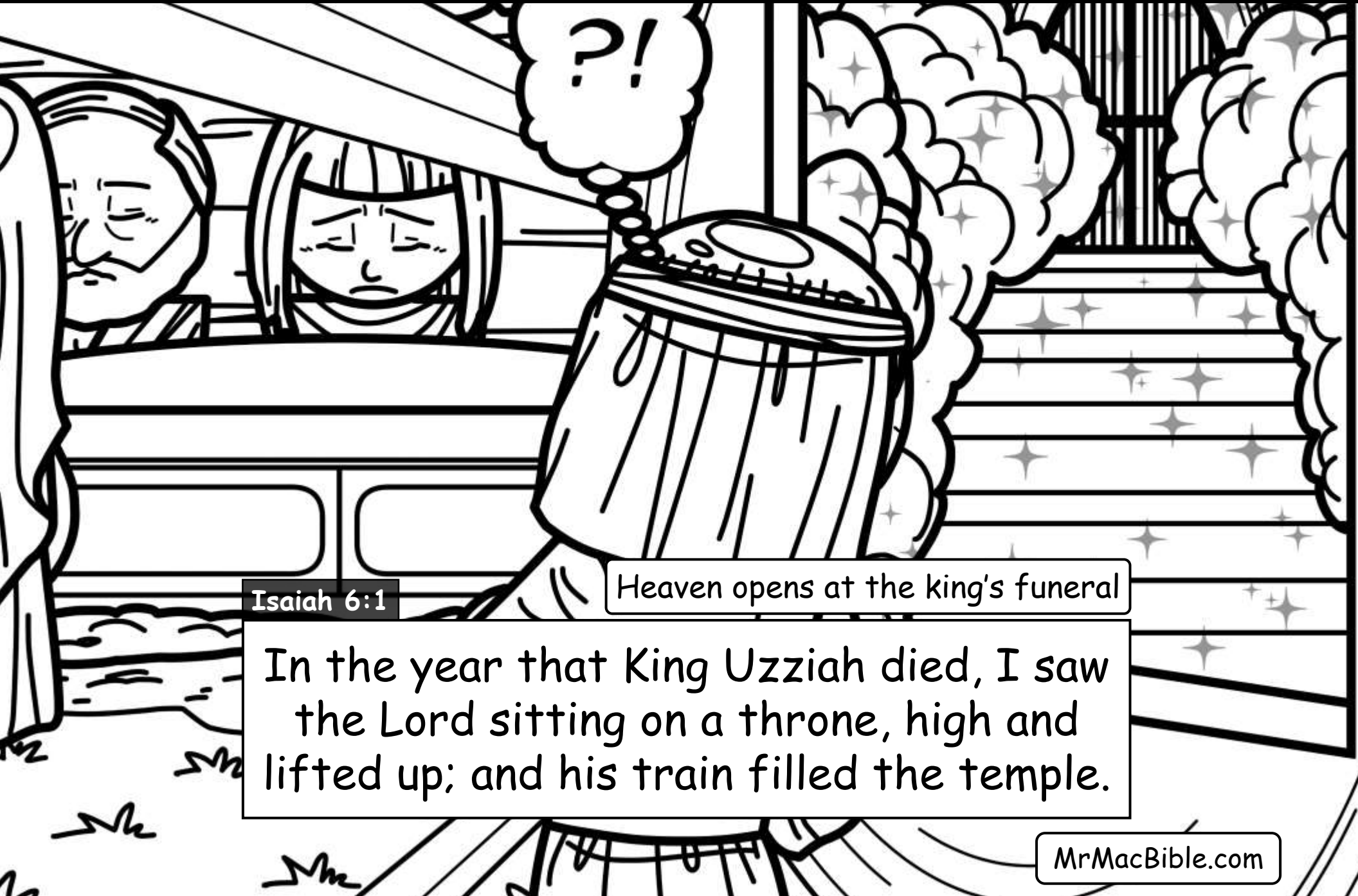

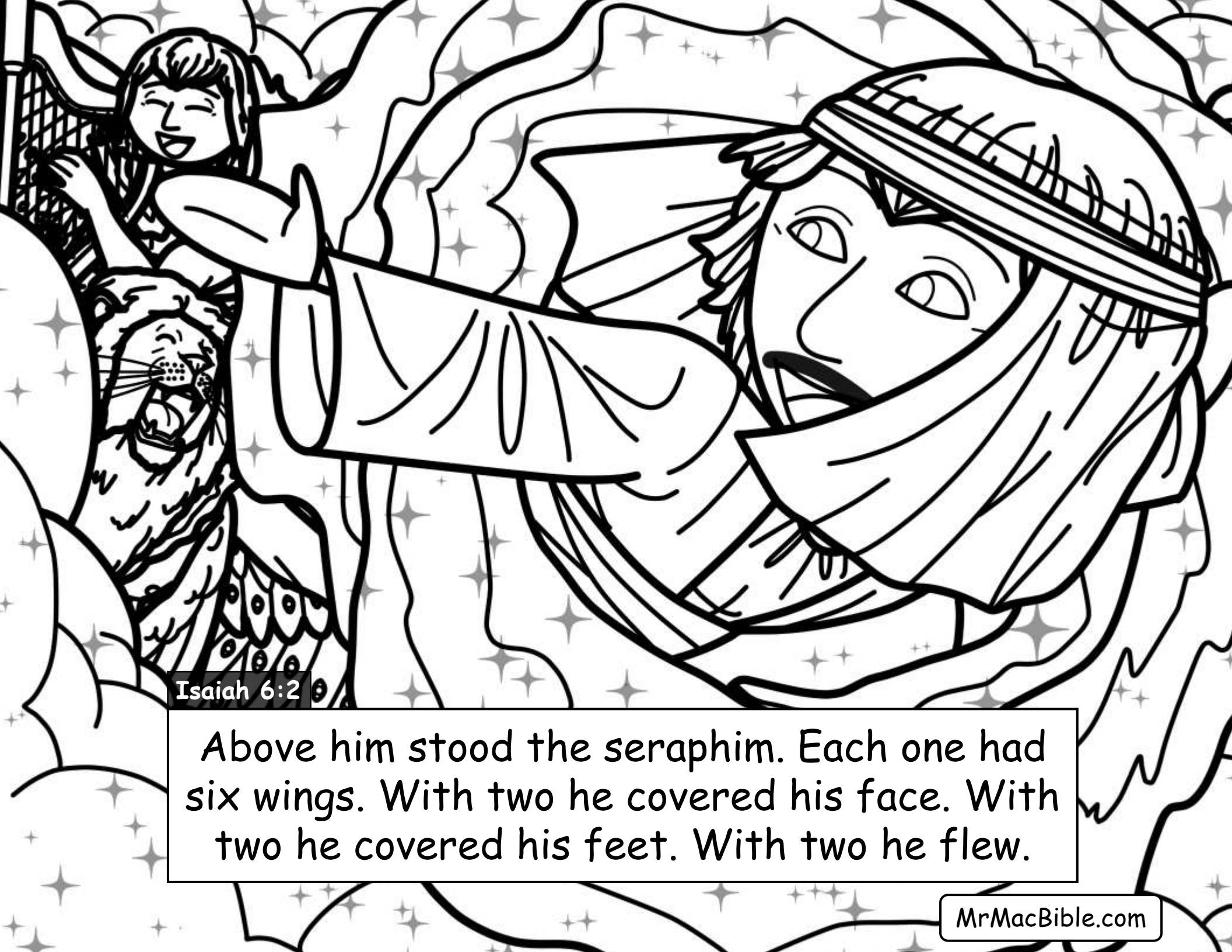

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up; and his train filled the temple.




Isaiah 6:2

house was filled with smoke.

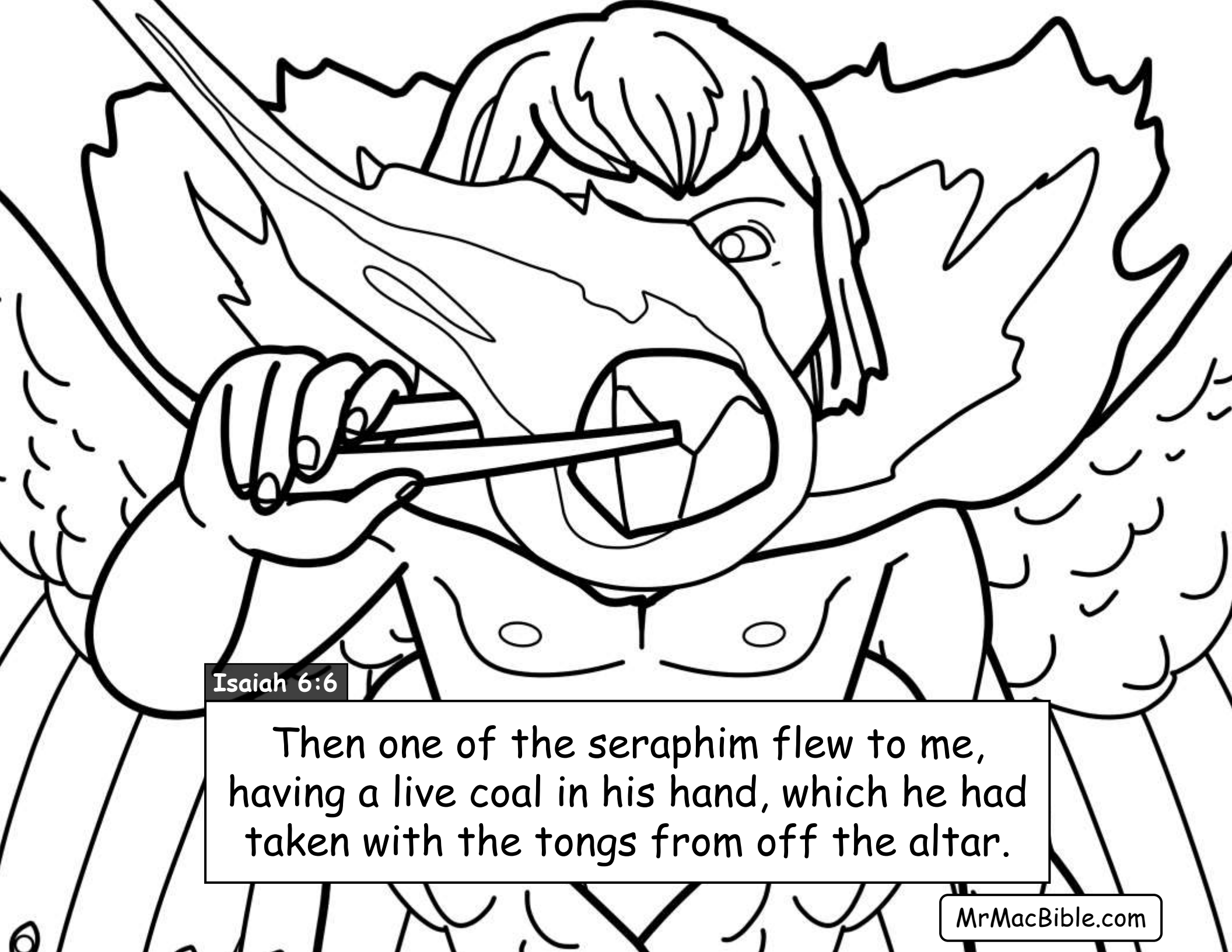

Isaiah 9:1...

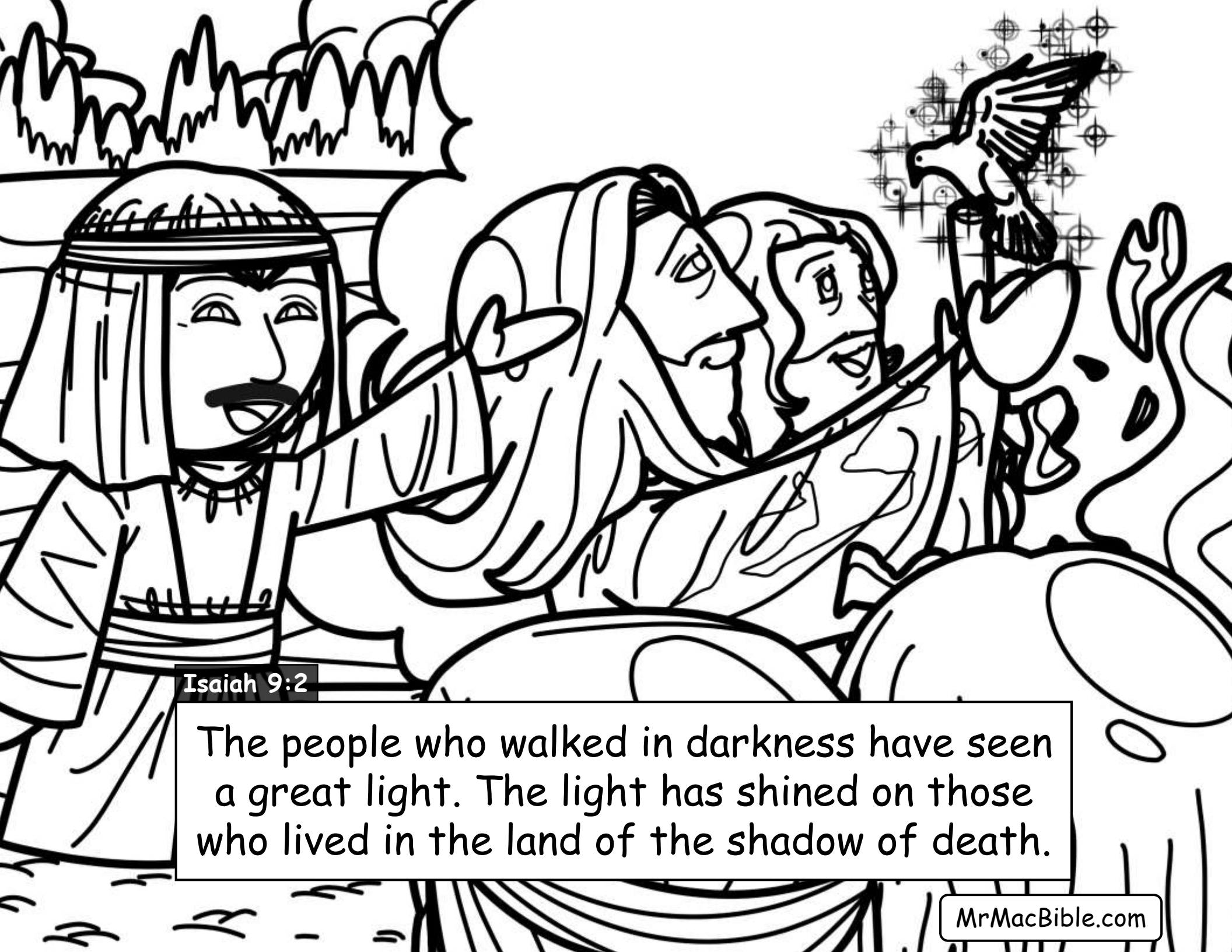
Isaiah has been preaching God's message of "turn from your sins or get judgement" to the people of Jerusalem for many months. Will there be any good news? Oh yes!

Isaiah 9:2

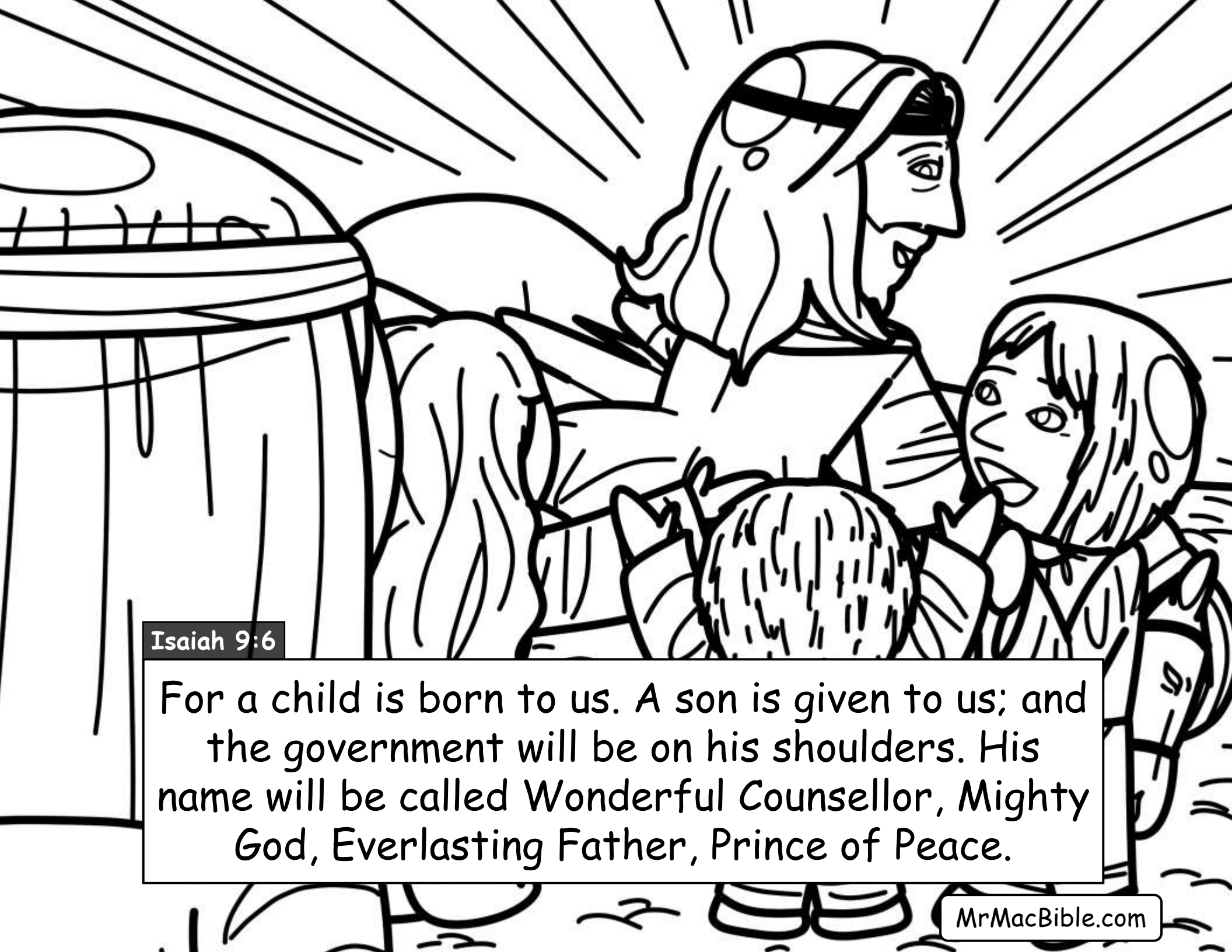
The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light. The light has shined on those who lived in the land of the shadow of death.

You have increased their joy.




Isaiah 9:6

Isaiah 9:7

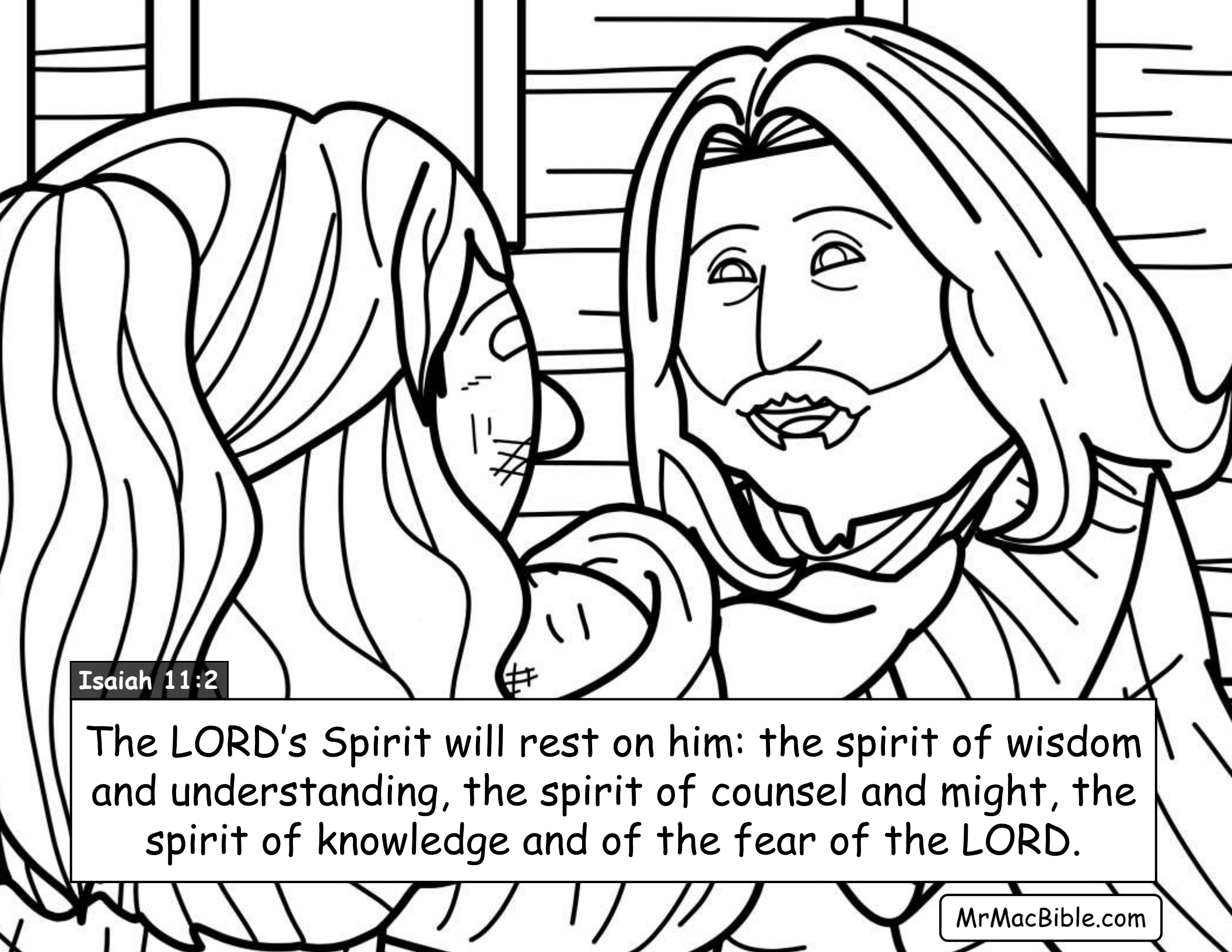

The wolf will live with the lamb, and the leopard will lie down with the young goat, the calf, the young lion, and the fattened calf together; and a little child will lead them.



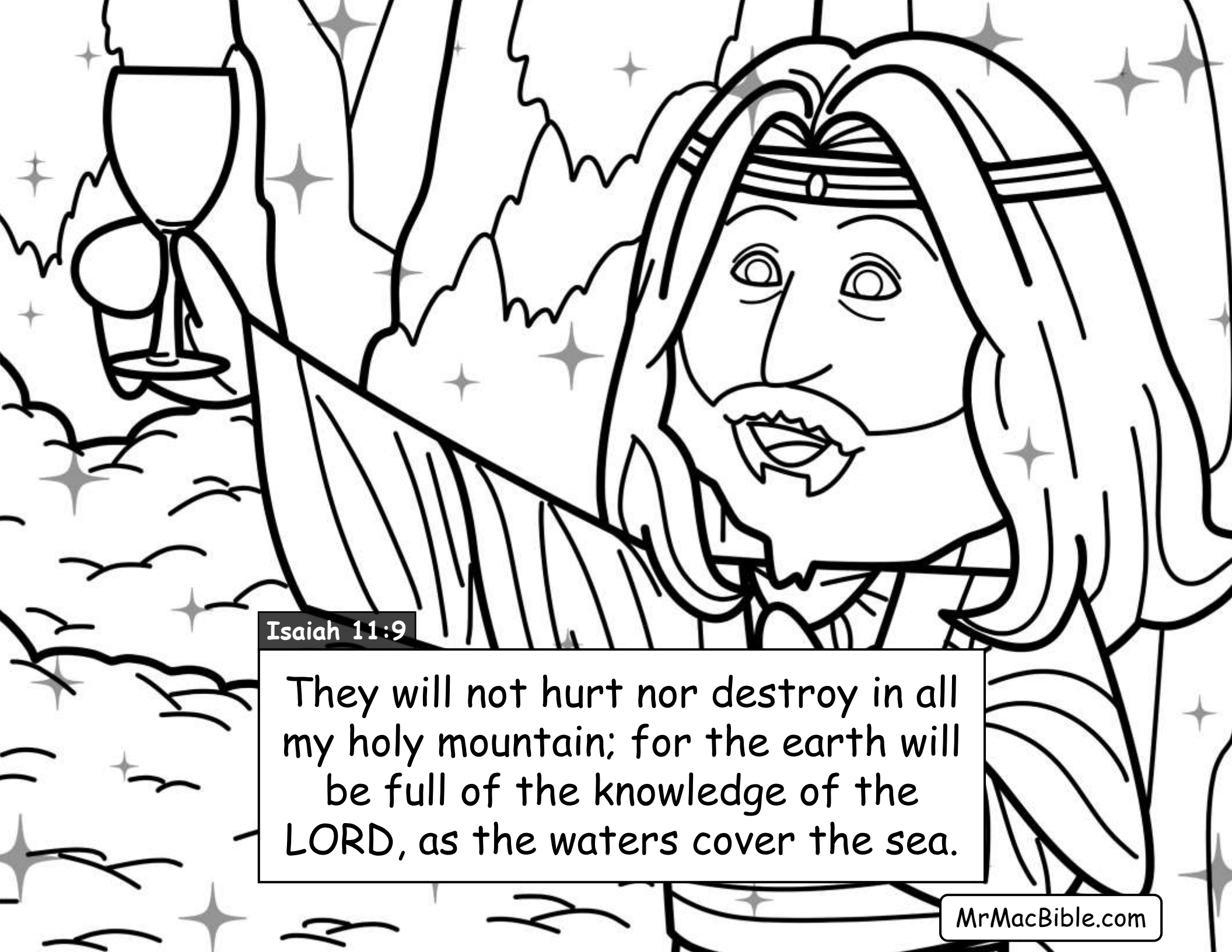

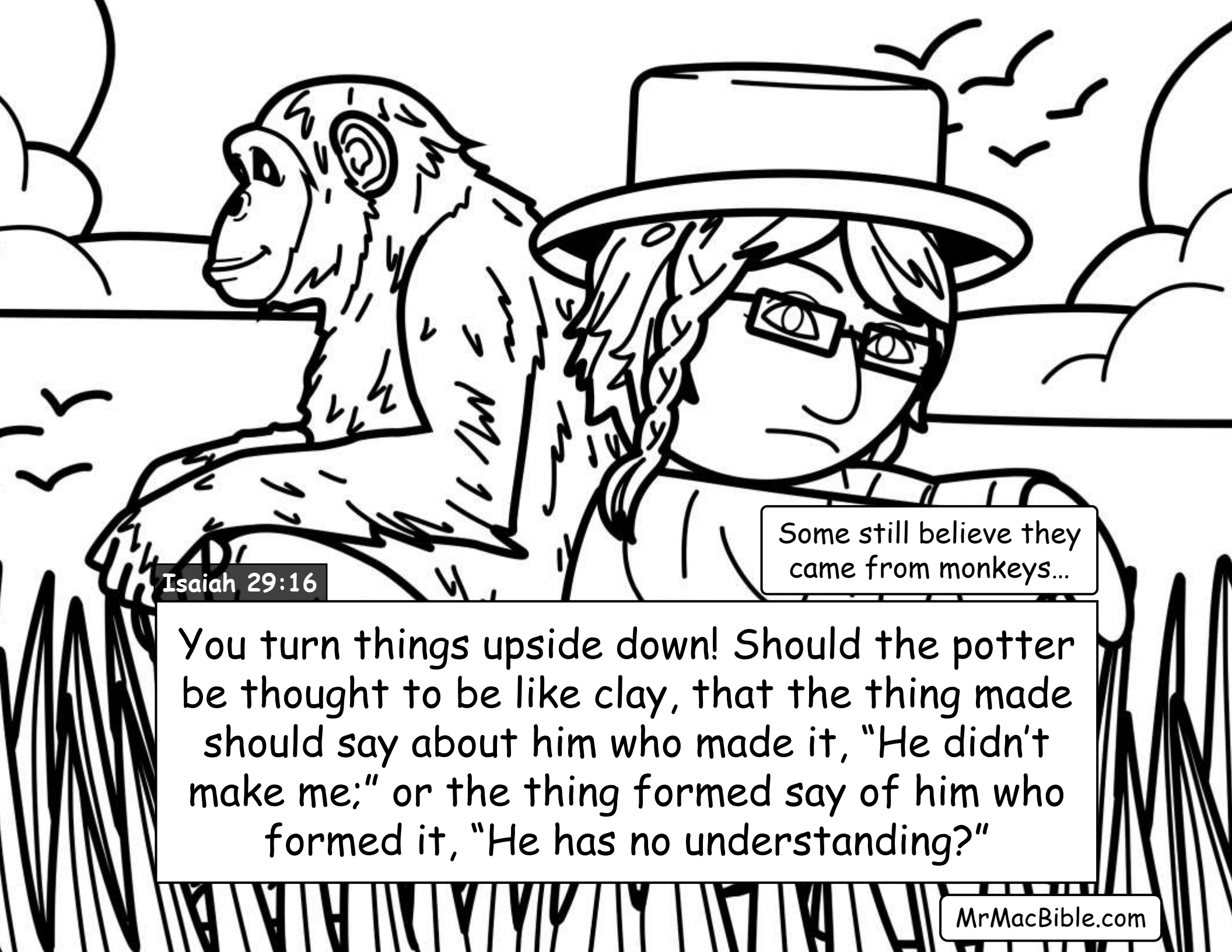
Isaiah 29:14

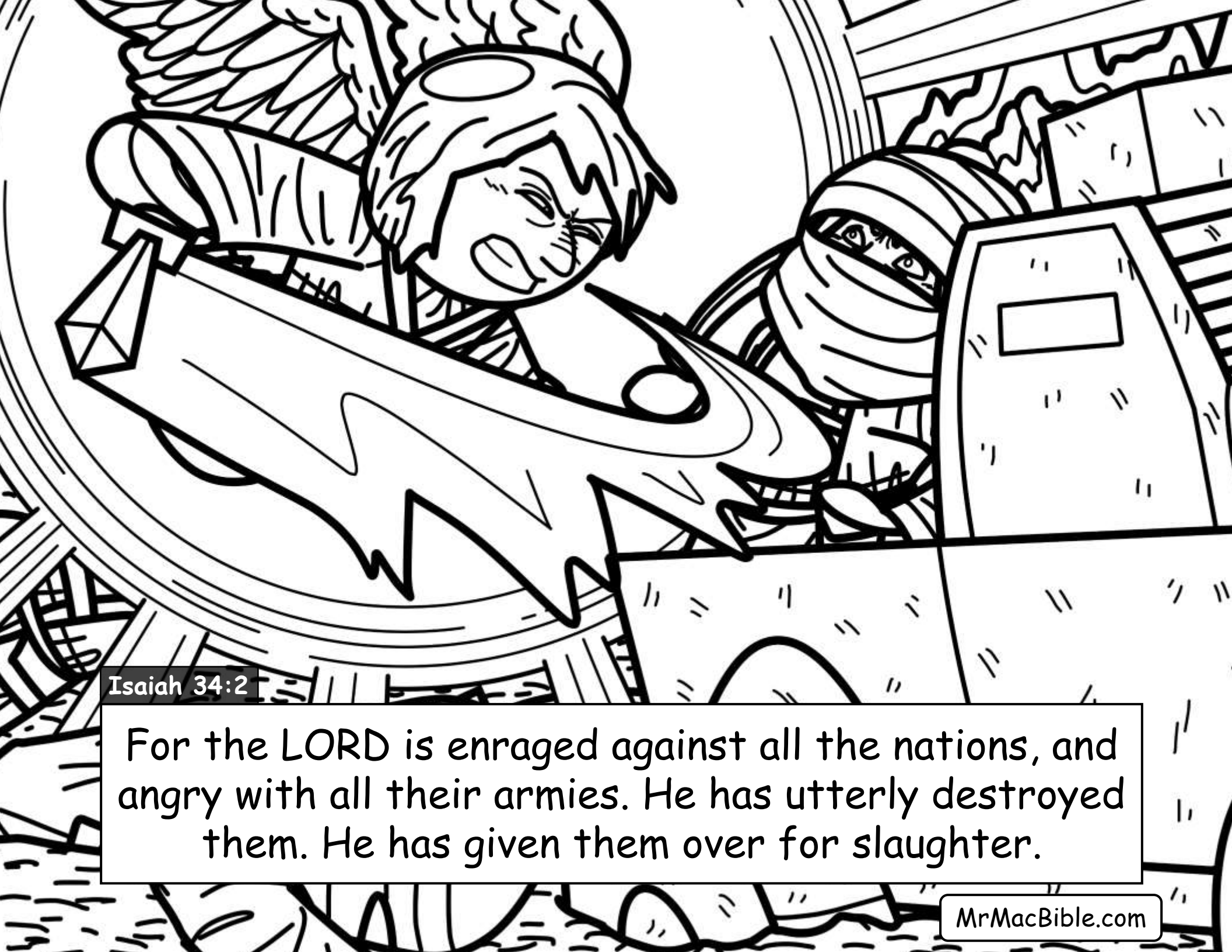
Background:

For the LORD is enraged against all the nations, and angry with all their armies. He has utterly destroyed them. He has given them over for slaughter.



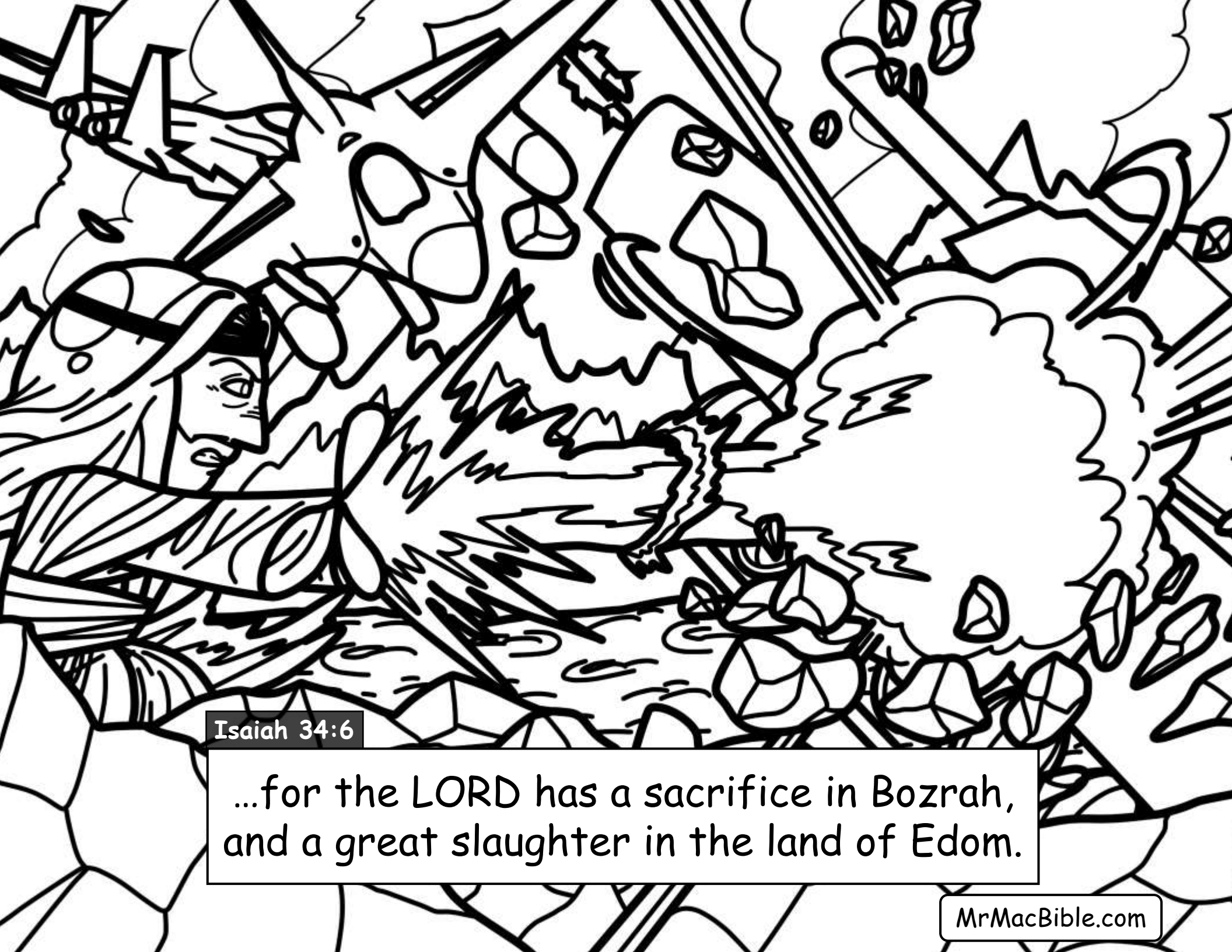
Isaiah 34:4

All of the army of the sky will be dissolved. The sky will be rolled up like a scroll, and all its armies will fade away, as a leaf fades from off a vine or a fig tree.



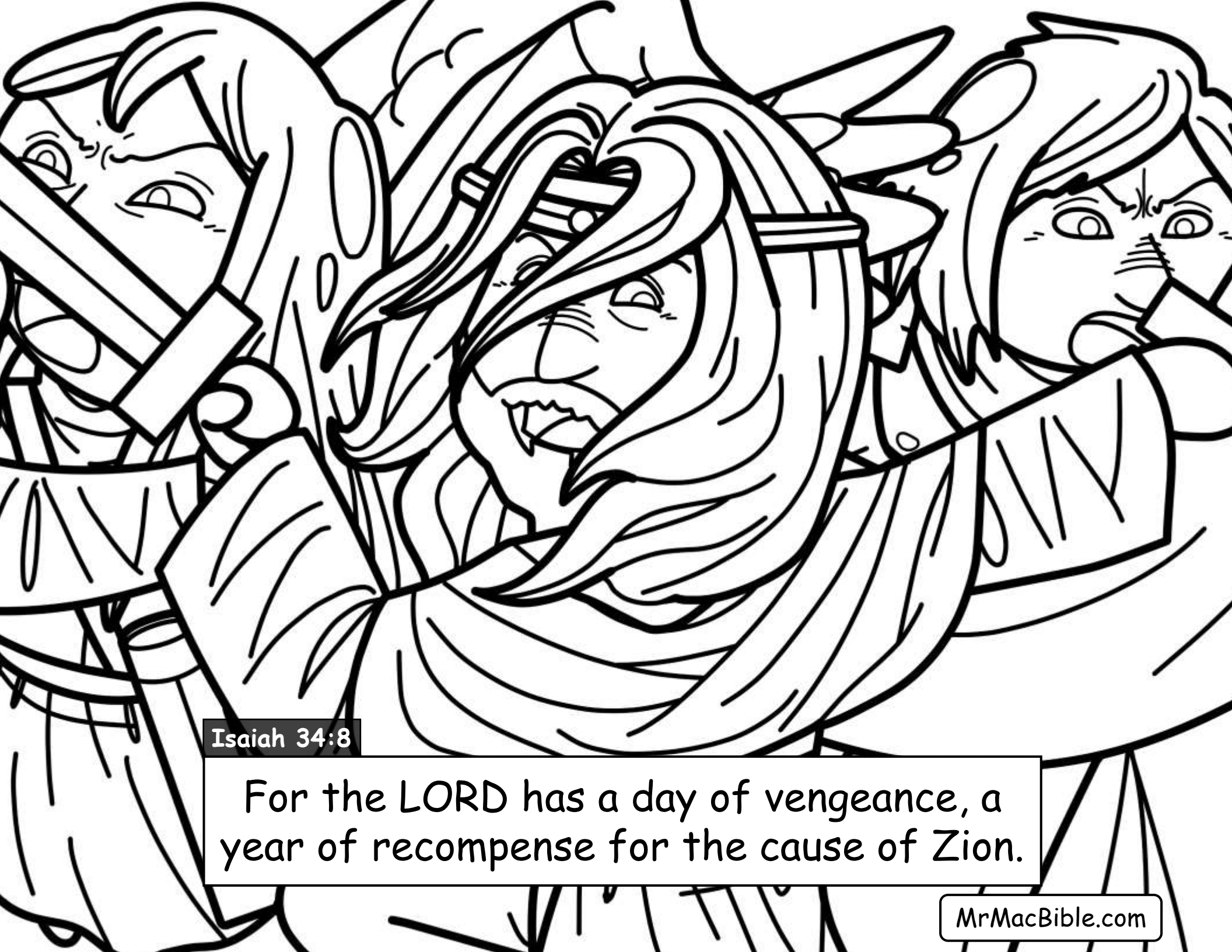
Isaiah 34:5

the people of my curse, for judgement.



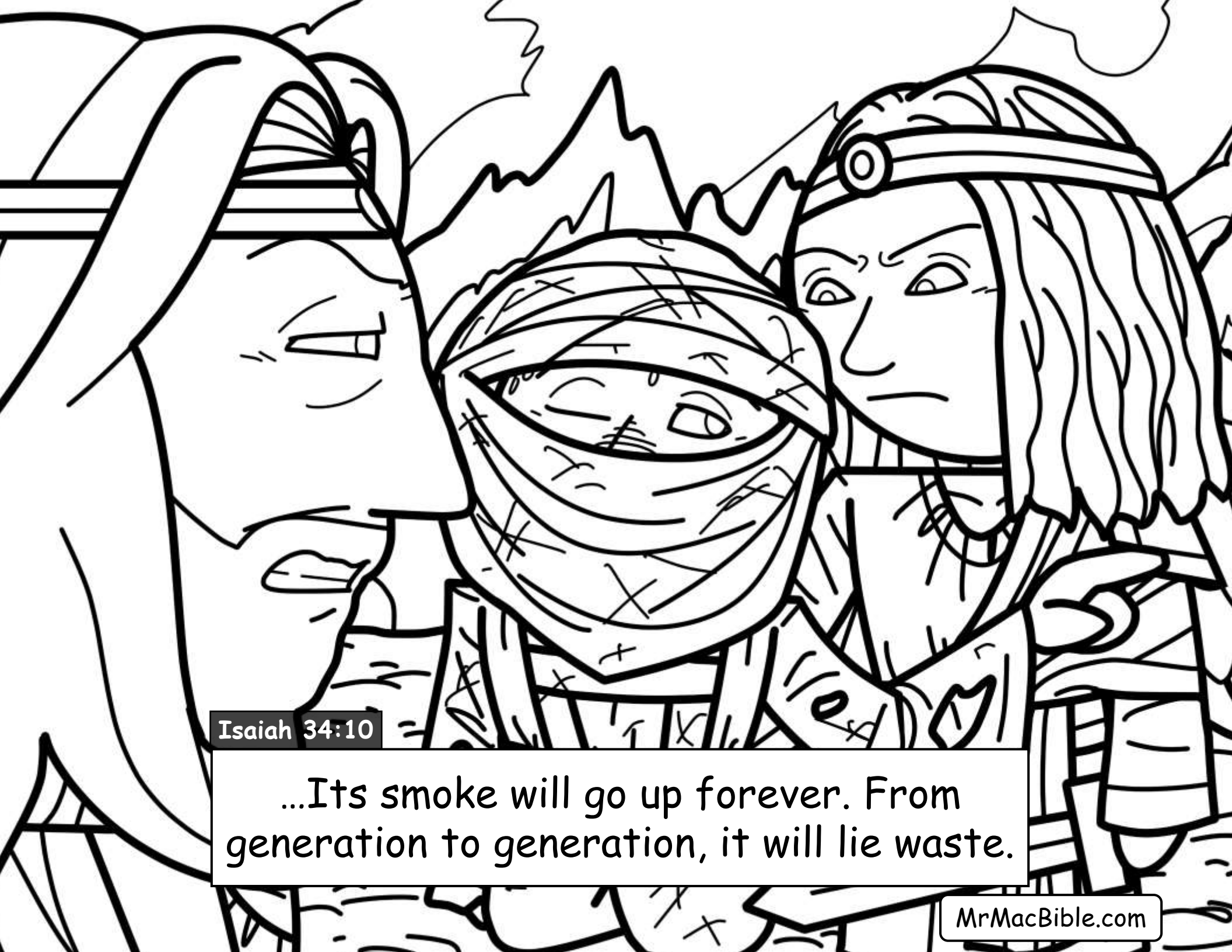
Isaiah 34:6

Isaiah 40:5

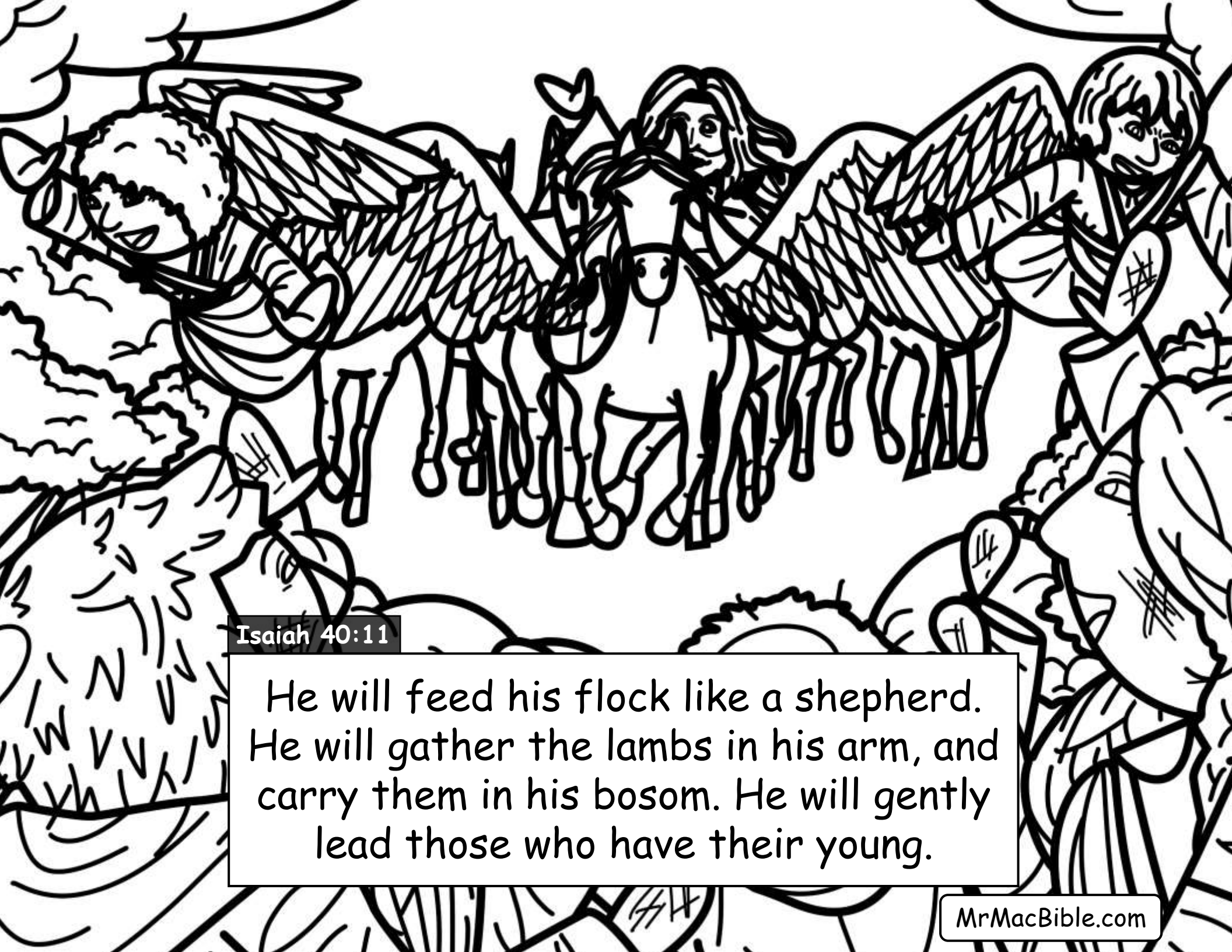
"The LORD's glory shall be revealed,

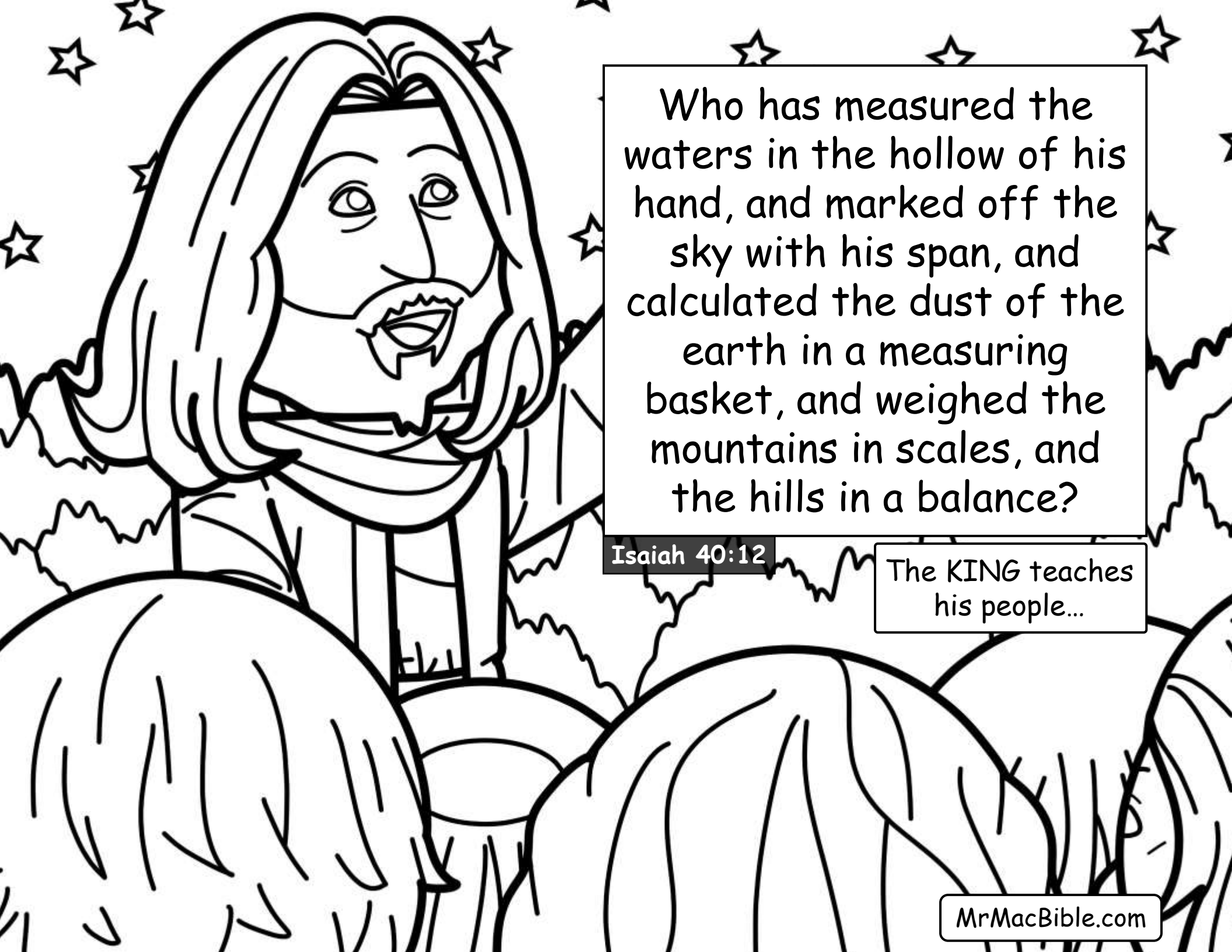
Isaiah 40:10

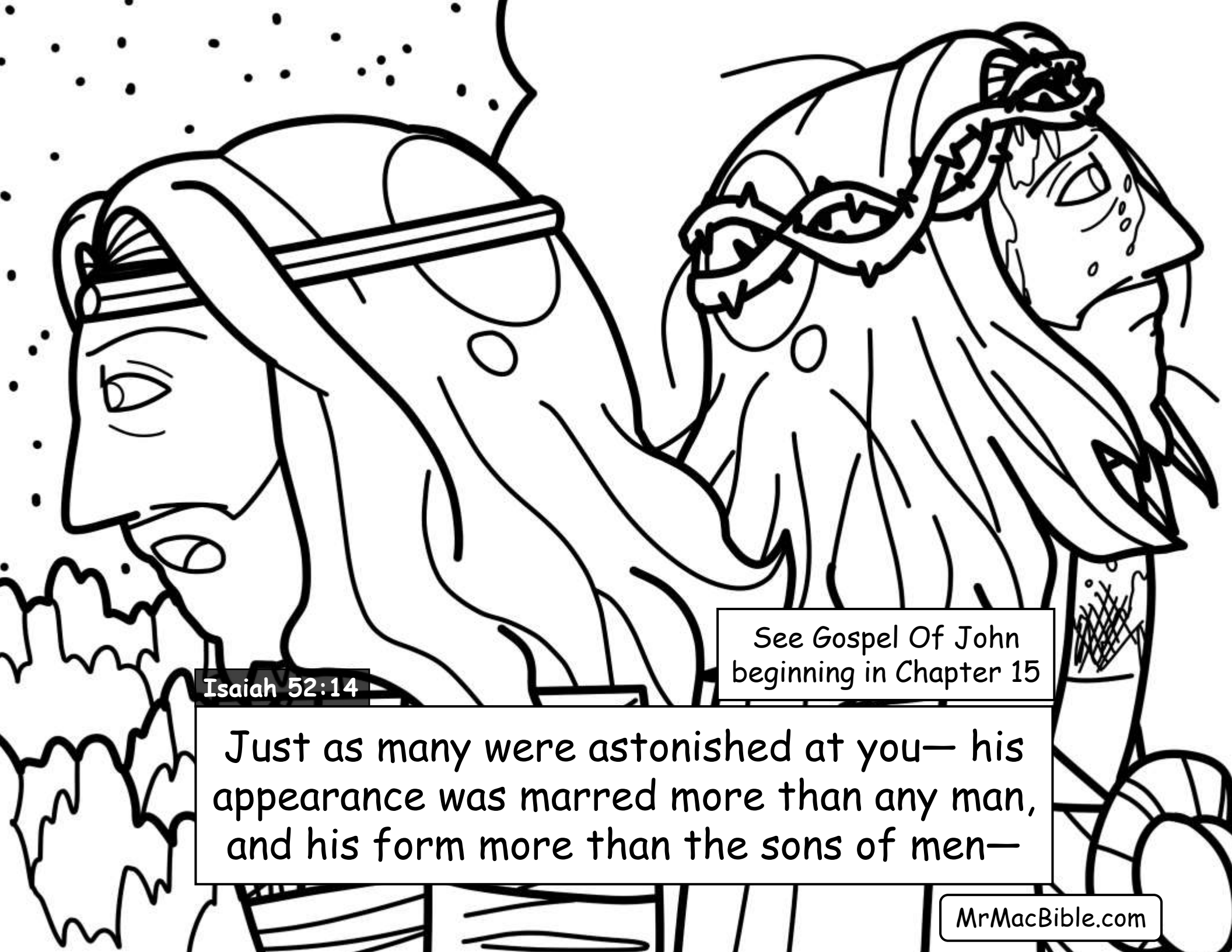
Background:

Isaiah 52:13

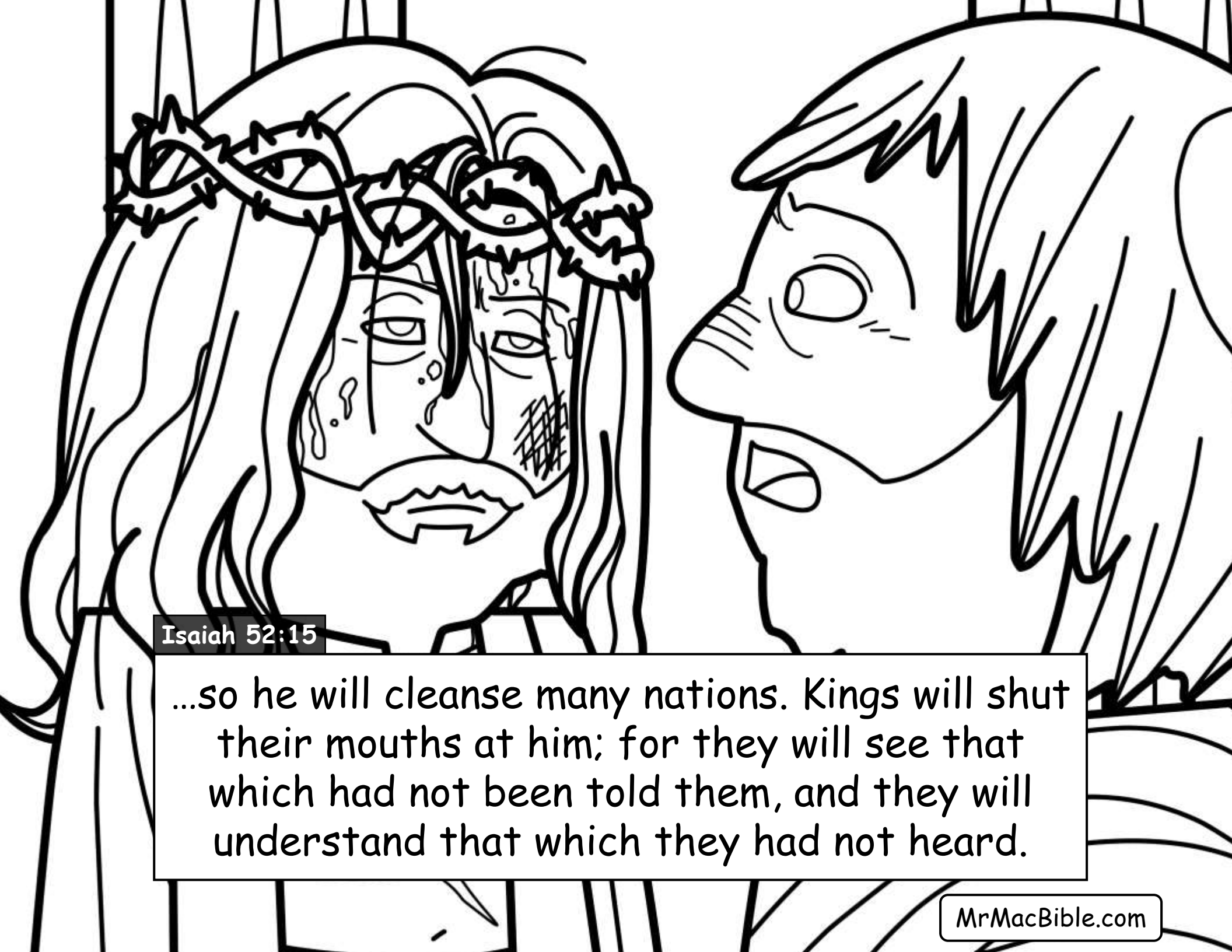
Behold, my servant will deal wisely. He will be exalted and lifted up, and will be very high.



Isaiah 52:14

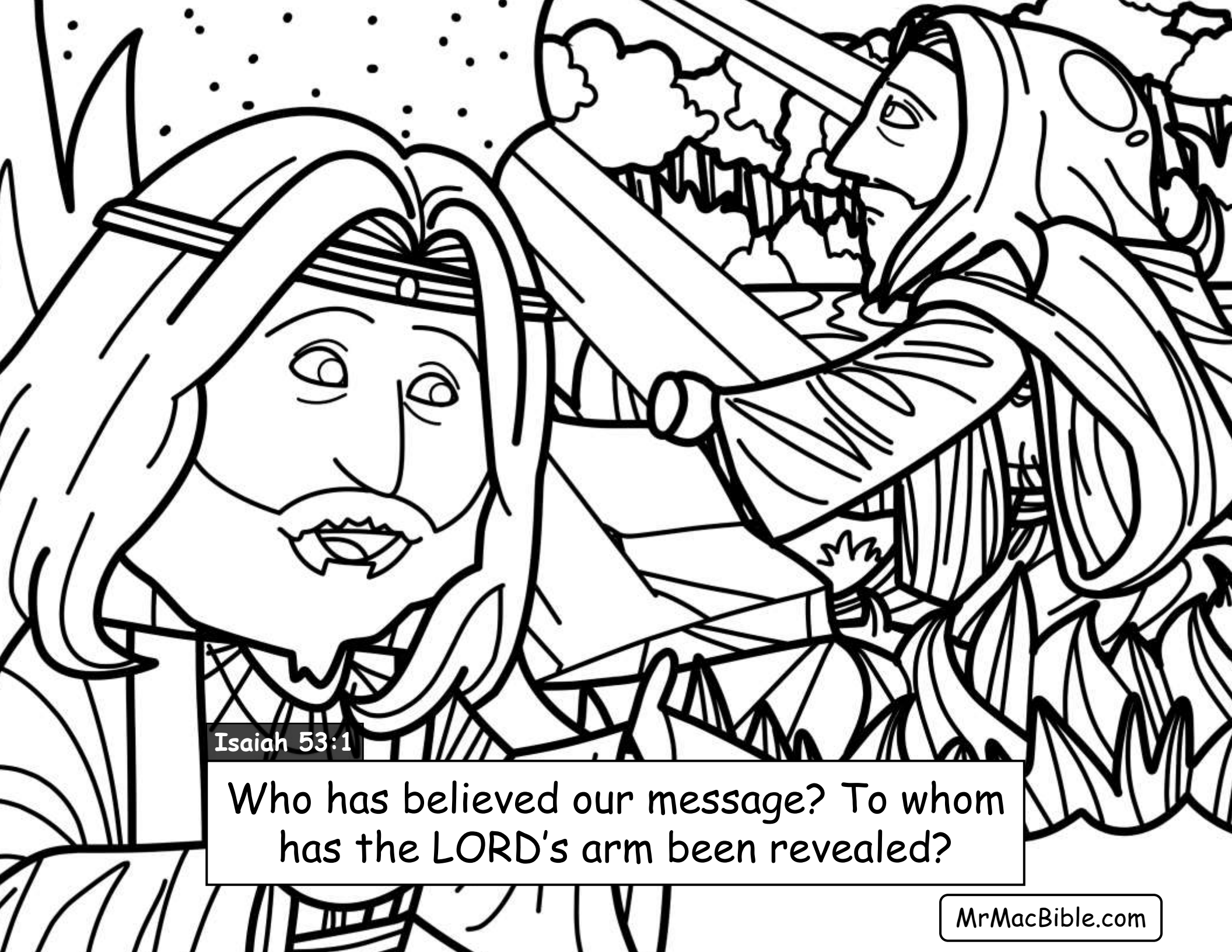
See Gospel Of John

Isaiah 53:1

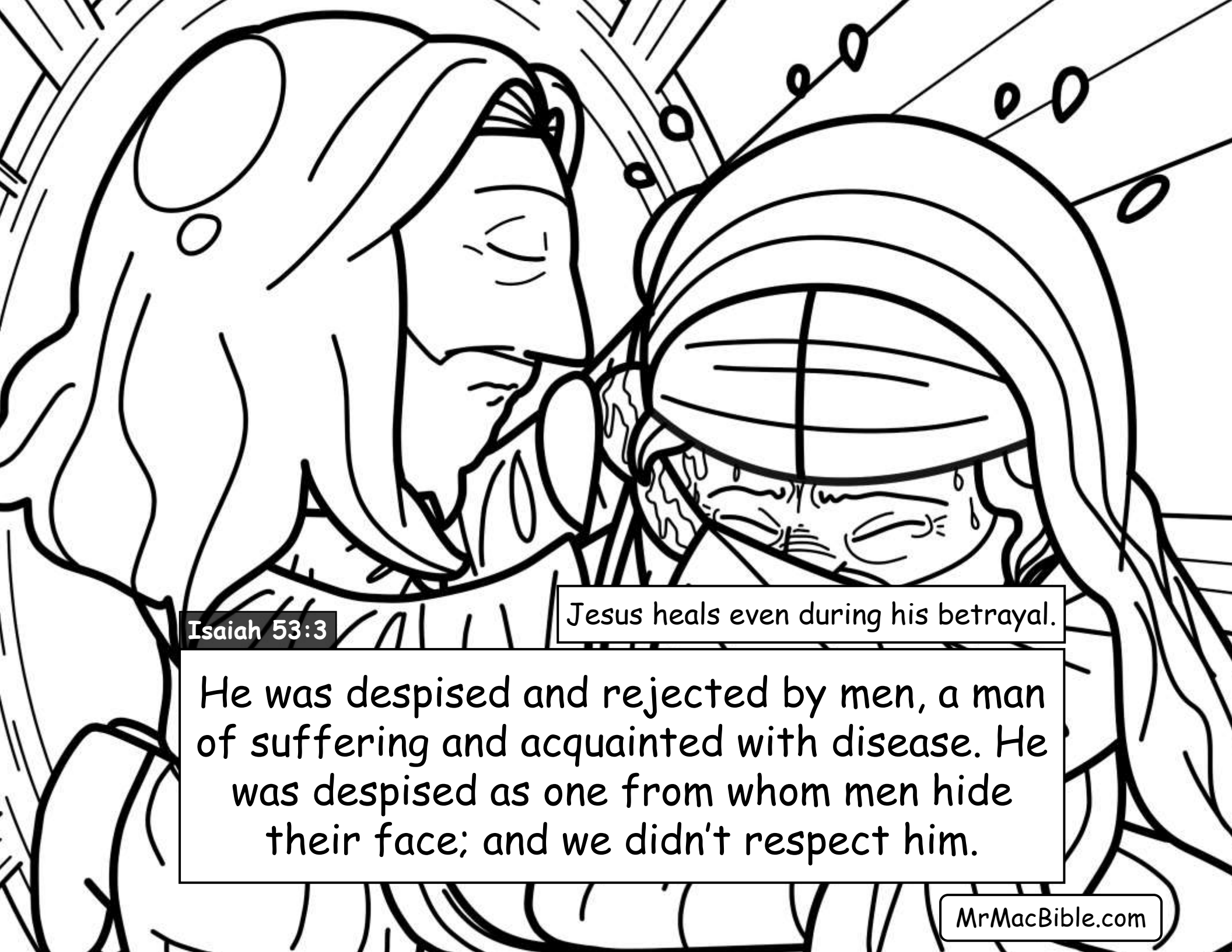
Who has believed our message? To whom has the LORD's arm been revealed?

He was oppressed, yet when he was afflicted he didn't open his mouth. As a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and as a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he didn't open his mouth.




Isaiah 53:8

Mary Magdalene was the first to see Jesus after his resurrection from the dead!

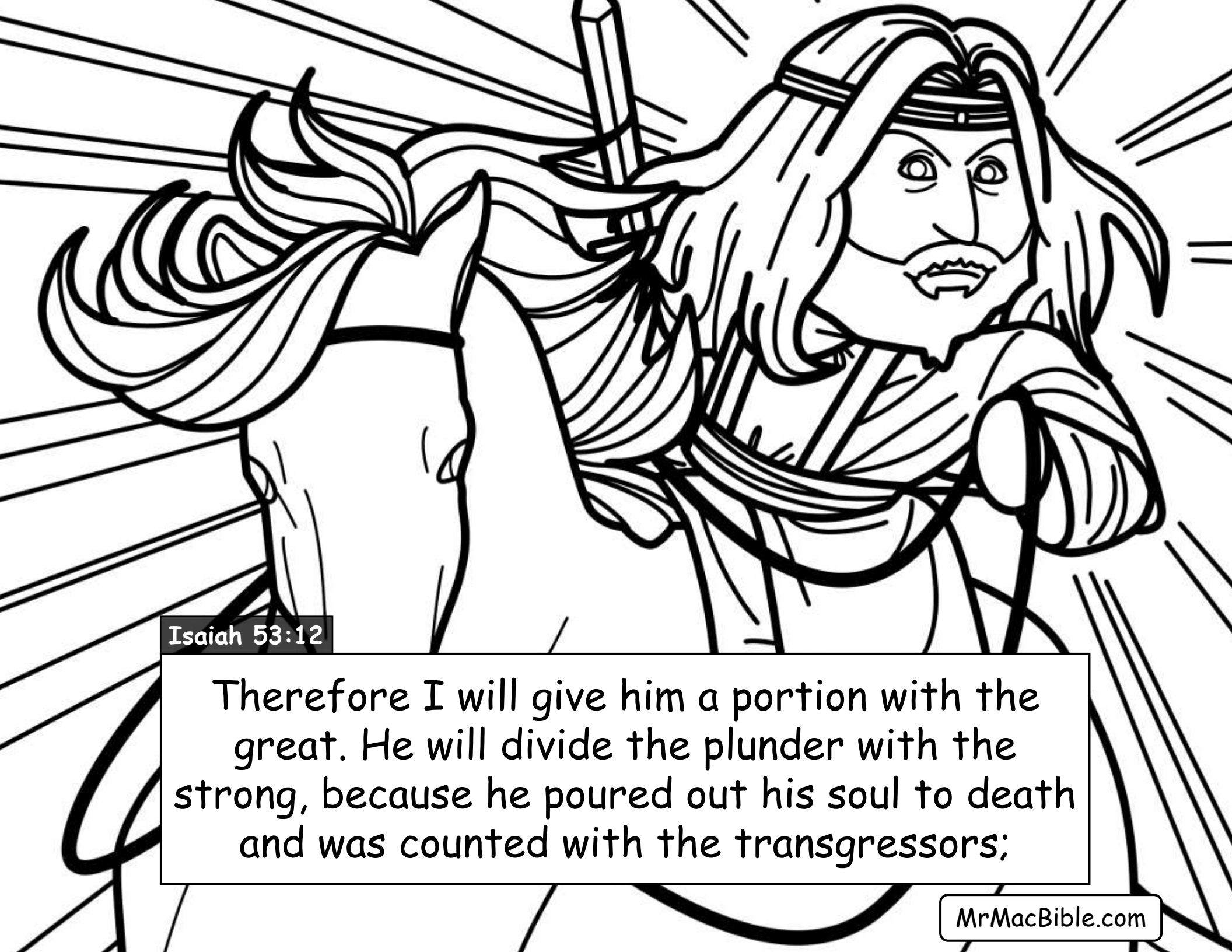
Isaiah 53:10

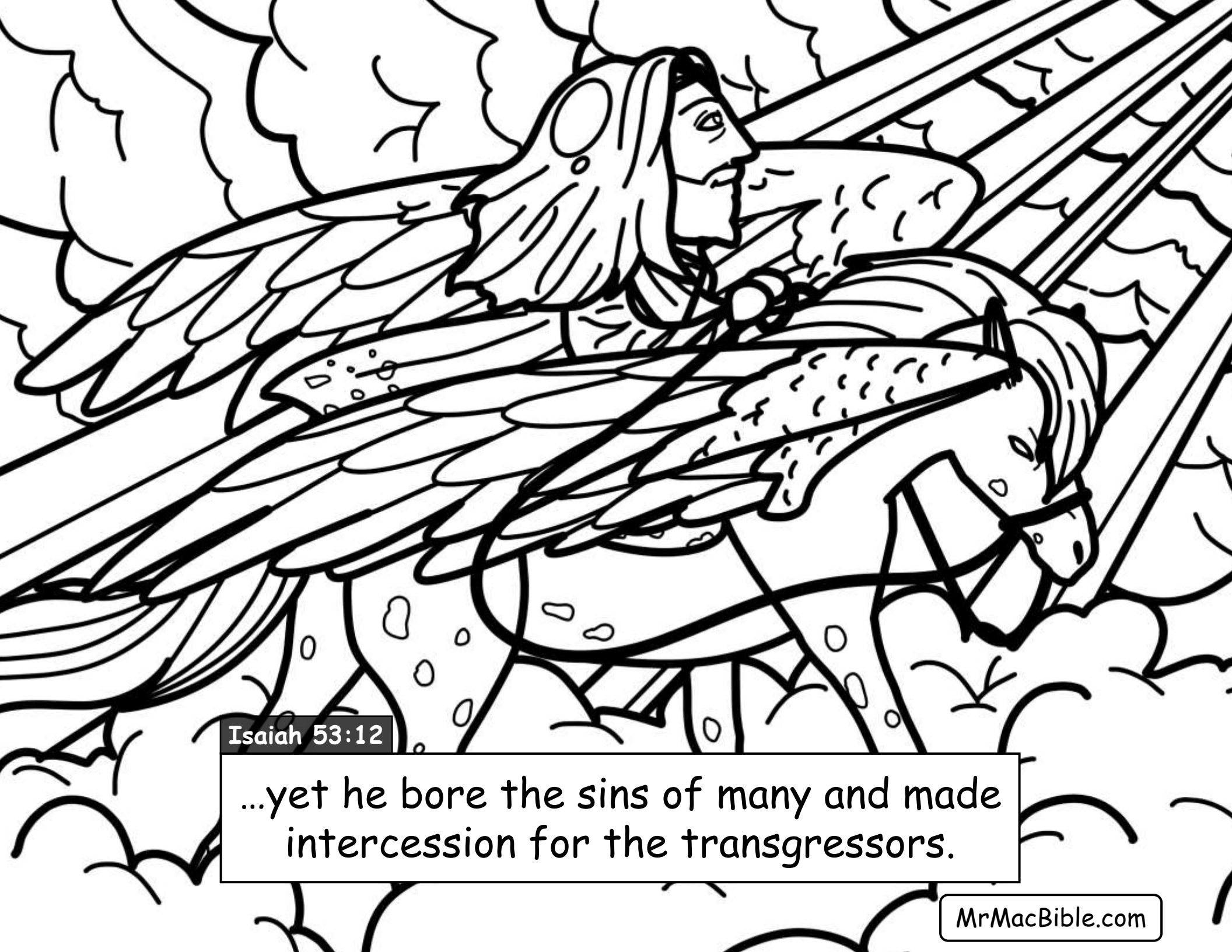
Isaiah 53:11

Isaiah 53:12


...yet he bore the sins of many and made intercession for the transgressors.

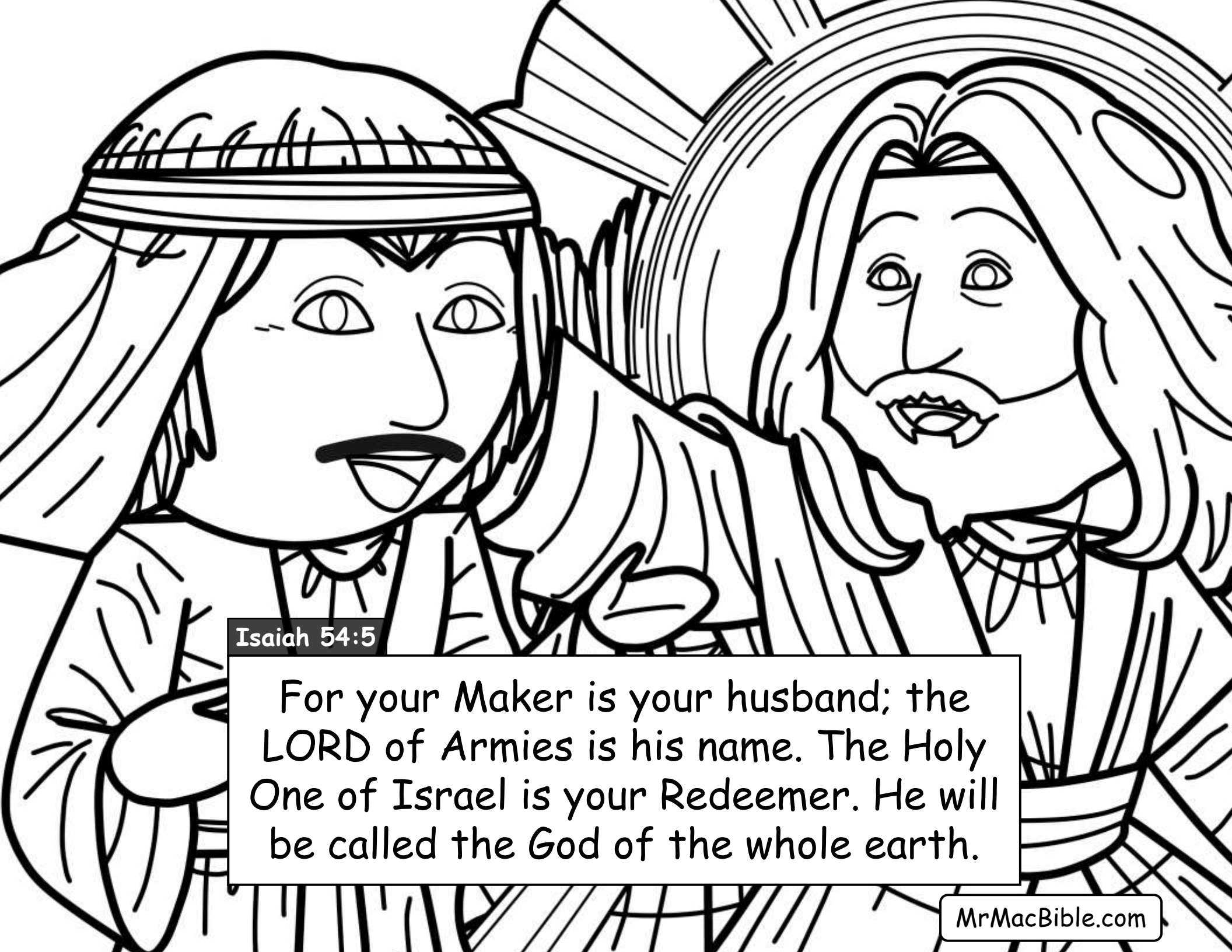

Isaiah 54:5


For your Maker is your husband; the LORD of Armies is his name. The Holy One of Israel is your Redeemer. He will be called the God of the whole earth.
