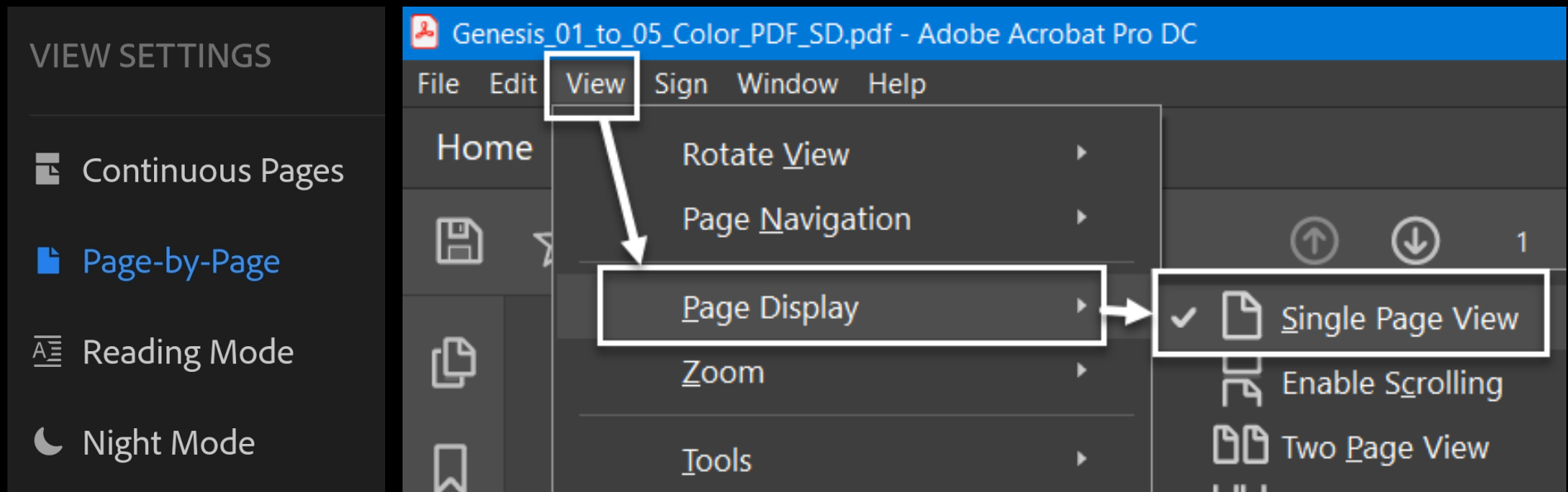

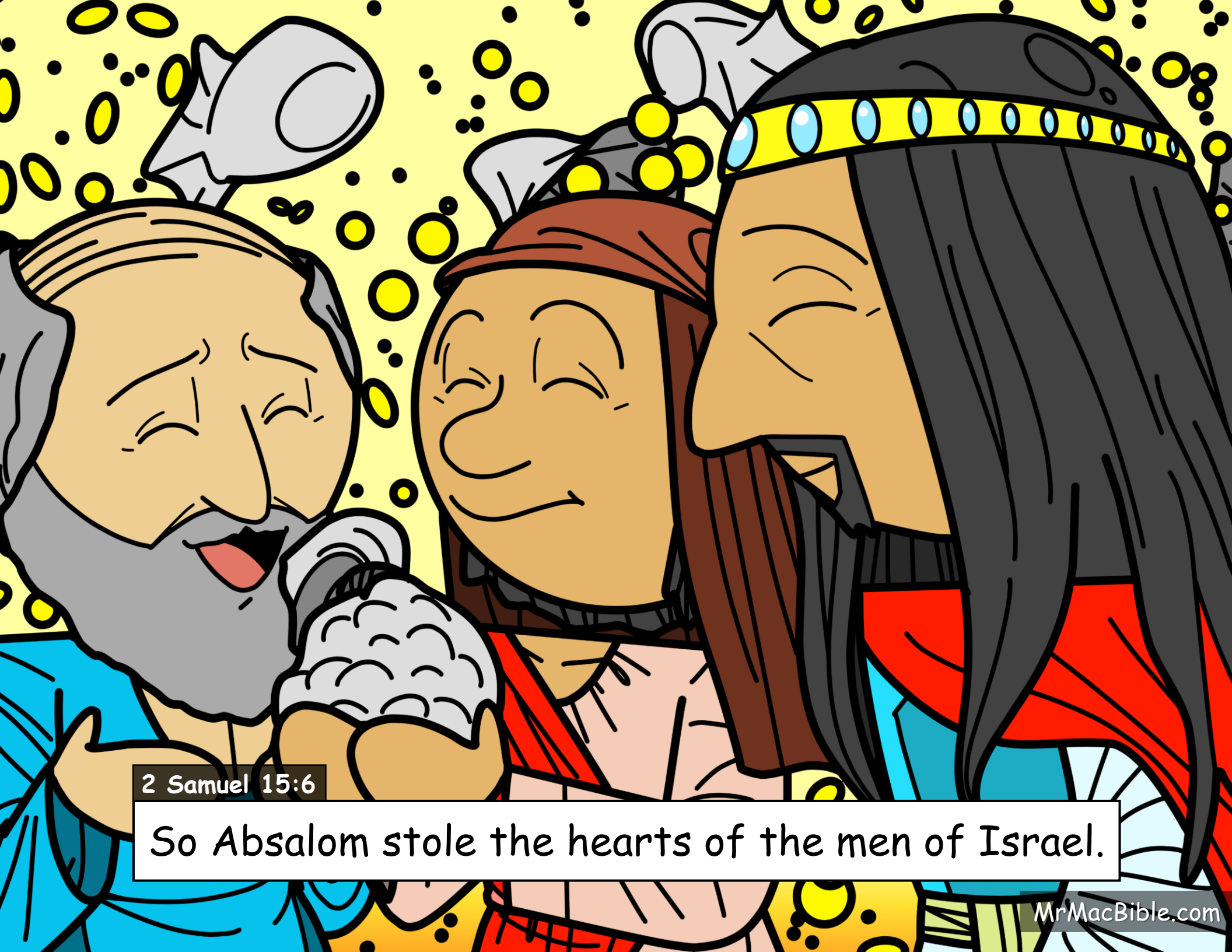
# Absalom's War!

2 Samuel 15:14

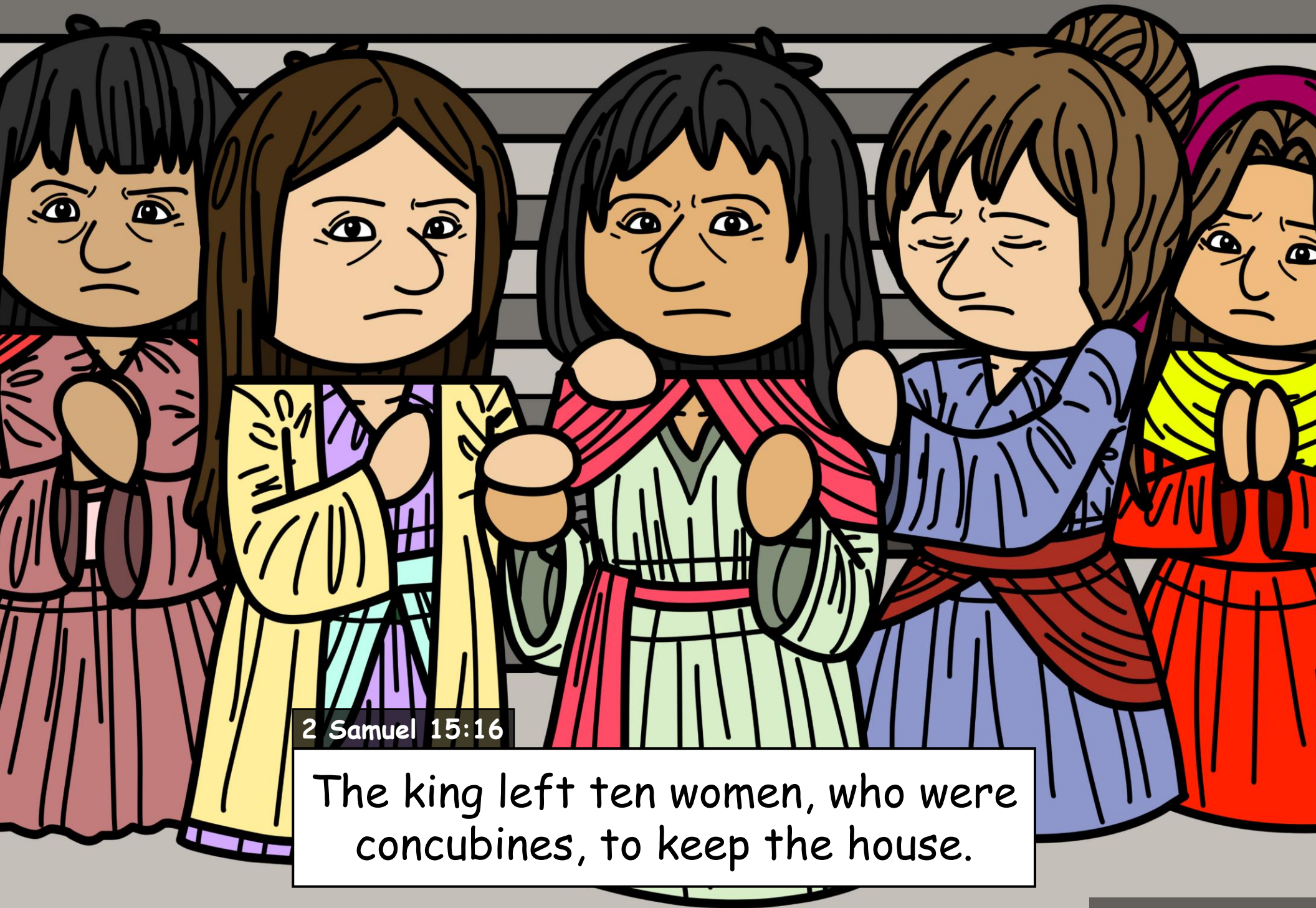
David said to all his servants who were with him at Jerusalem, "Arise! Let's flee, or else none of us will escape from Absalom."

The king left ten women, who were concubines, to keep the house.

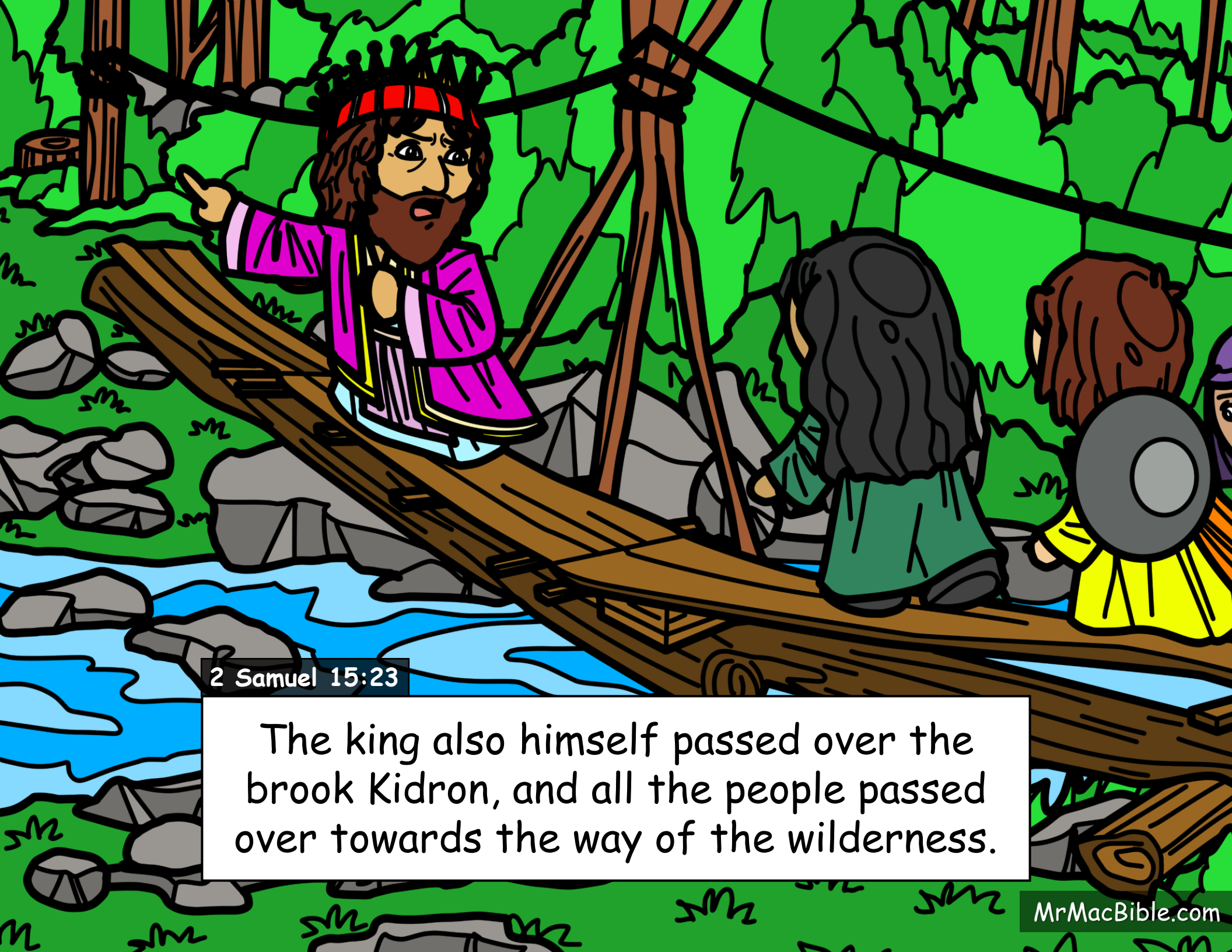




2 Samuel 15:23

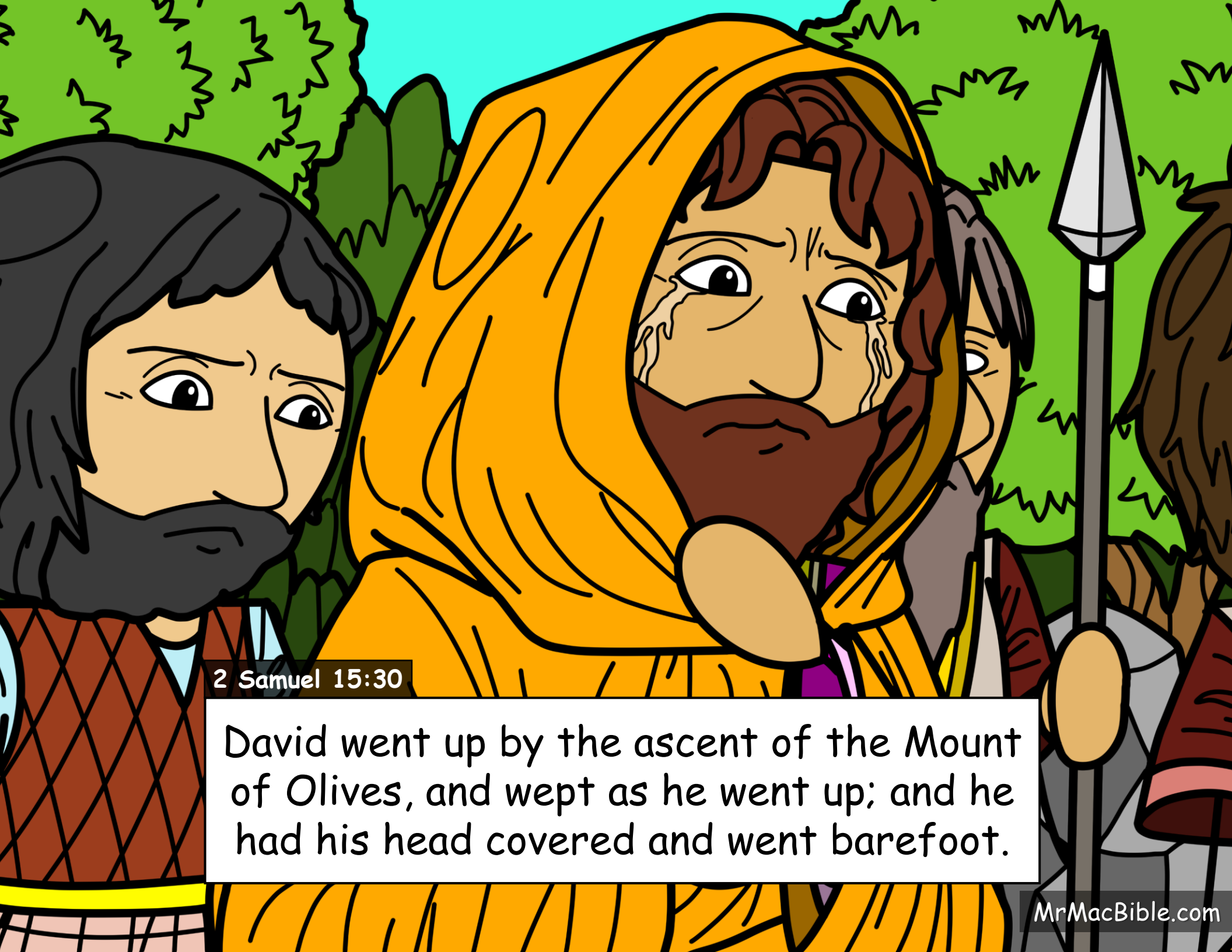
"...but if he says, 'I have no delight in you,' behold, here I am. Let him do to me as seems good to him."

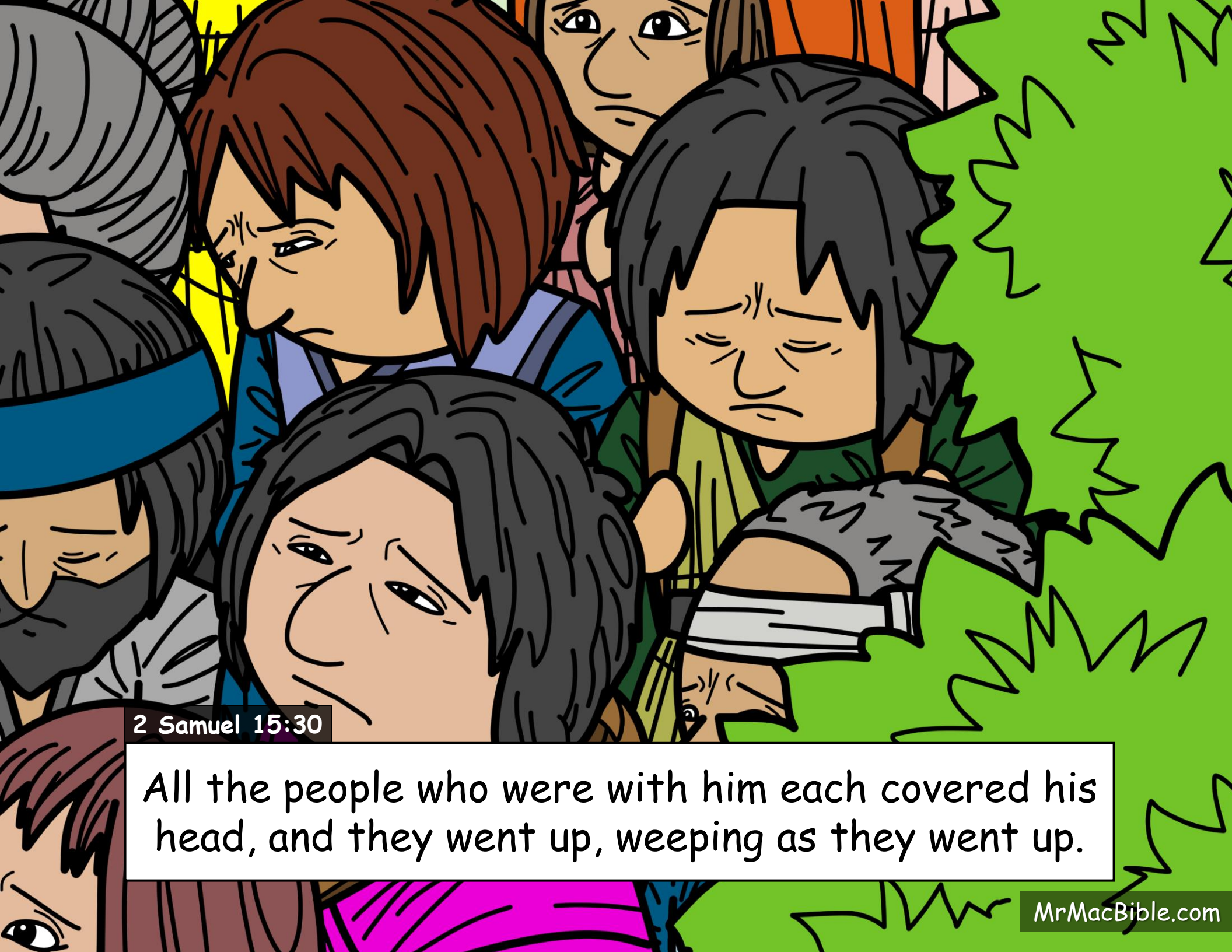
Zadok therefore and Abiathar carried God's ark to Jerusalem again; and they stayed there.

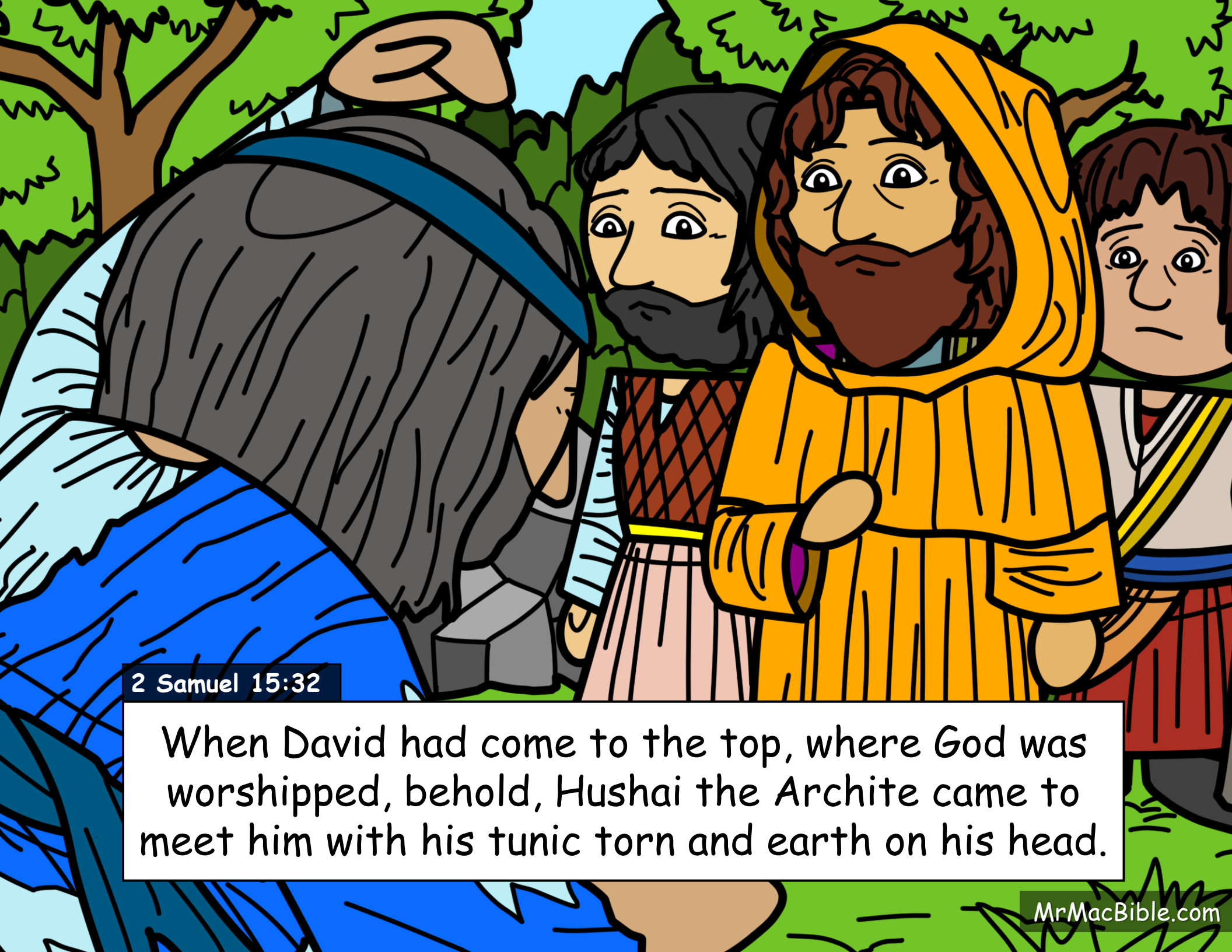
David went up by the ascent of the Mount of Olives, and wept as he went up; and he had his head covered and went barefoot.



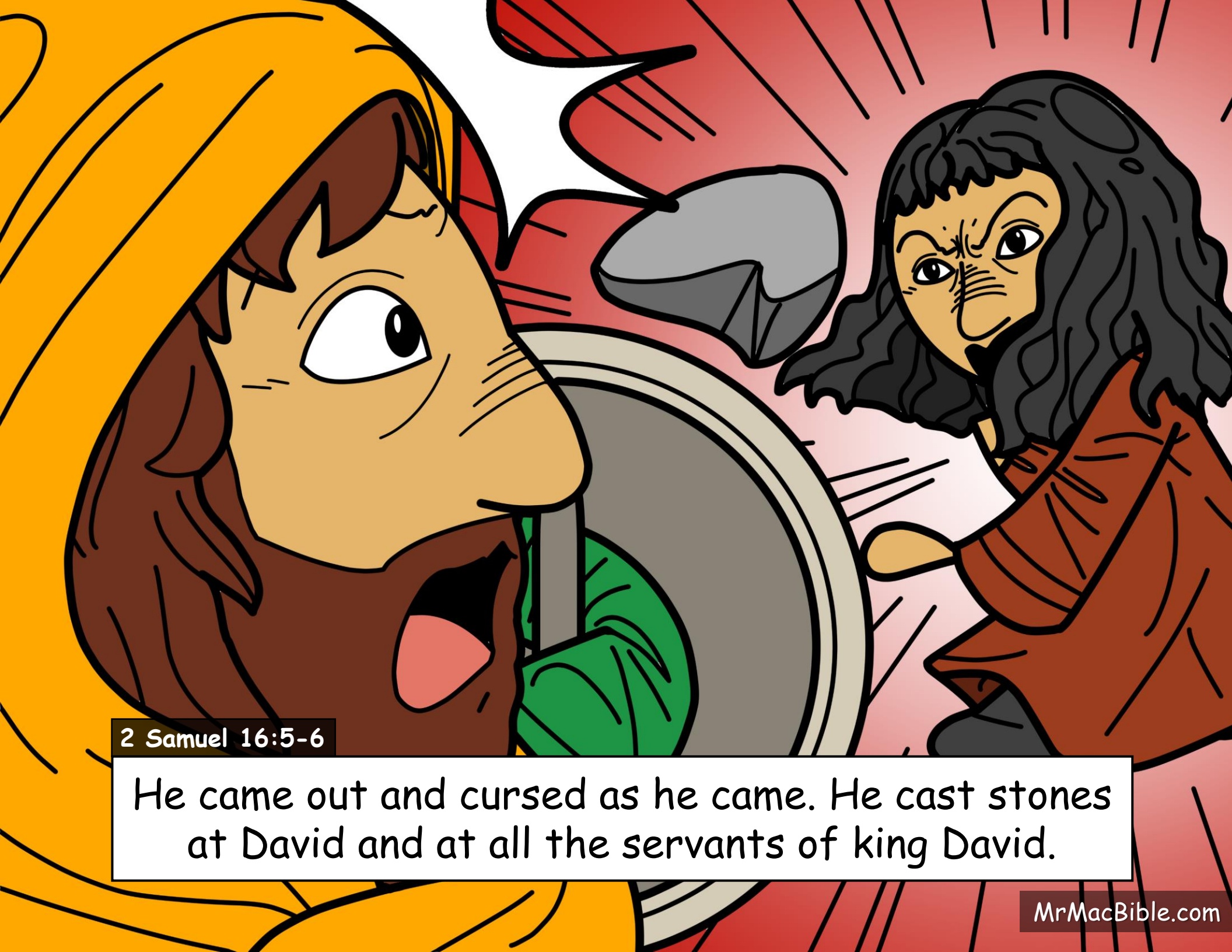


When king David came to Bahurim, behold, a man of the family of Saul's house came out, whose name was Shimei, the son of Gera.

2 Samuel 16:5-6

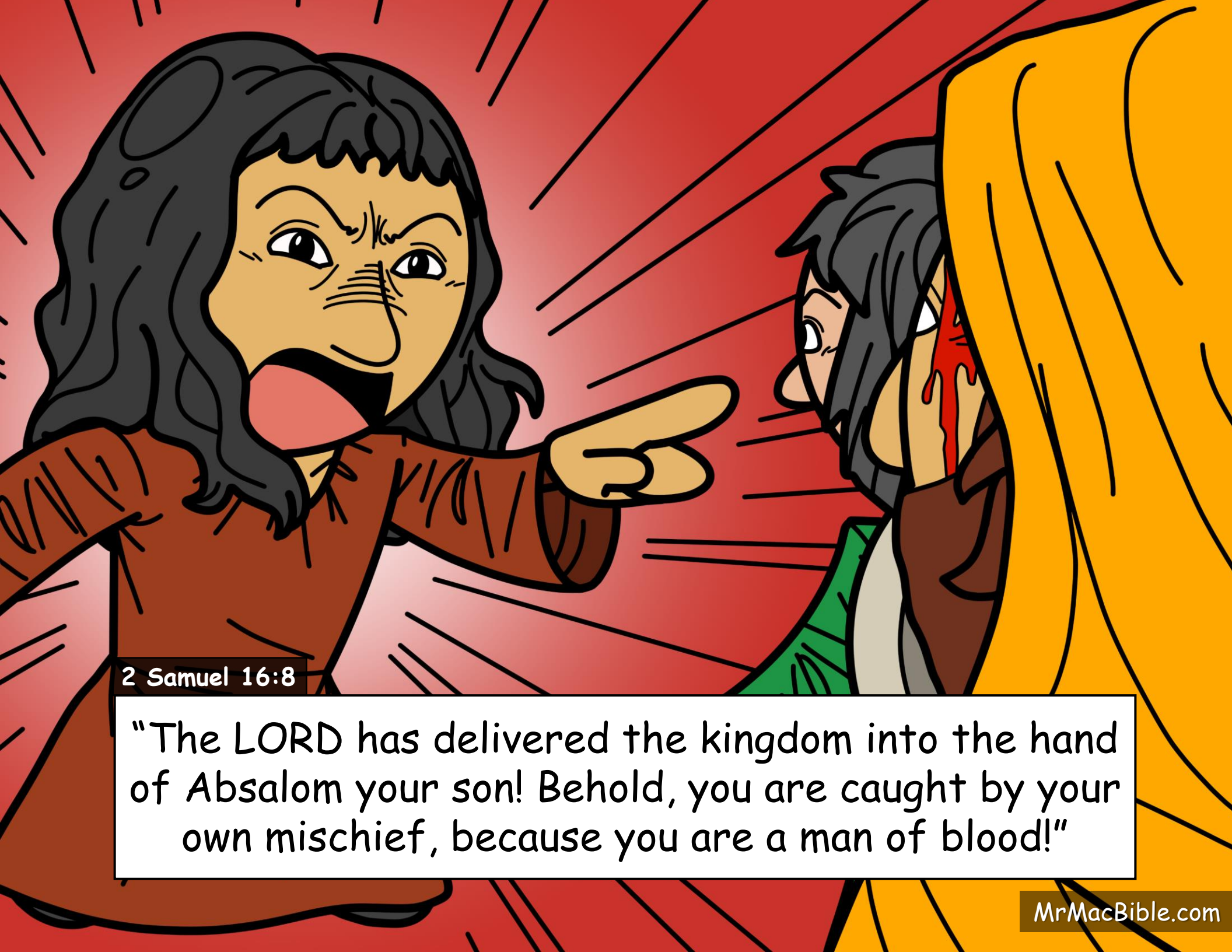
He came out and cursed as he came. He cast stones at David and at all the servants of king David.





2 Samuel 16:7

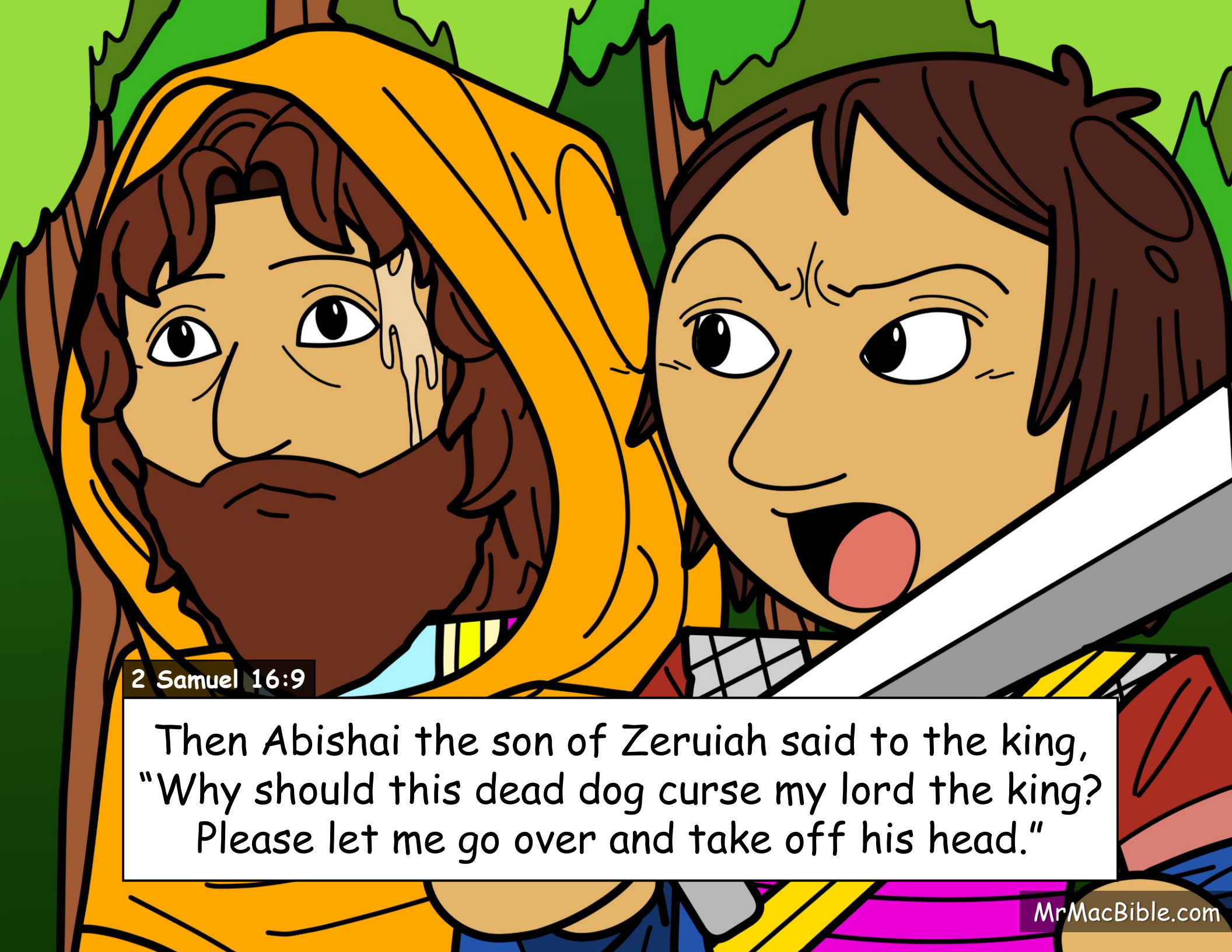

Hushai said to Absalom, "The counsel that Ahithophel has given this time is not good."

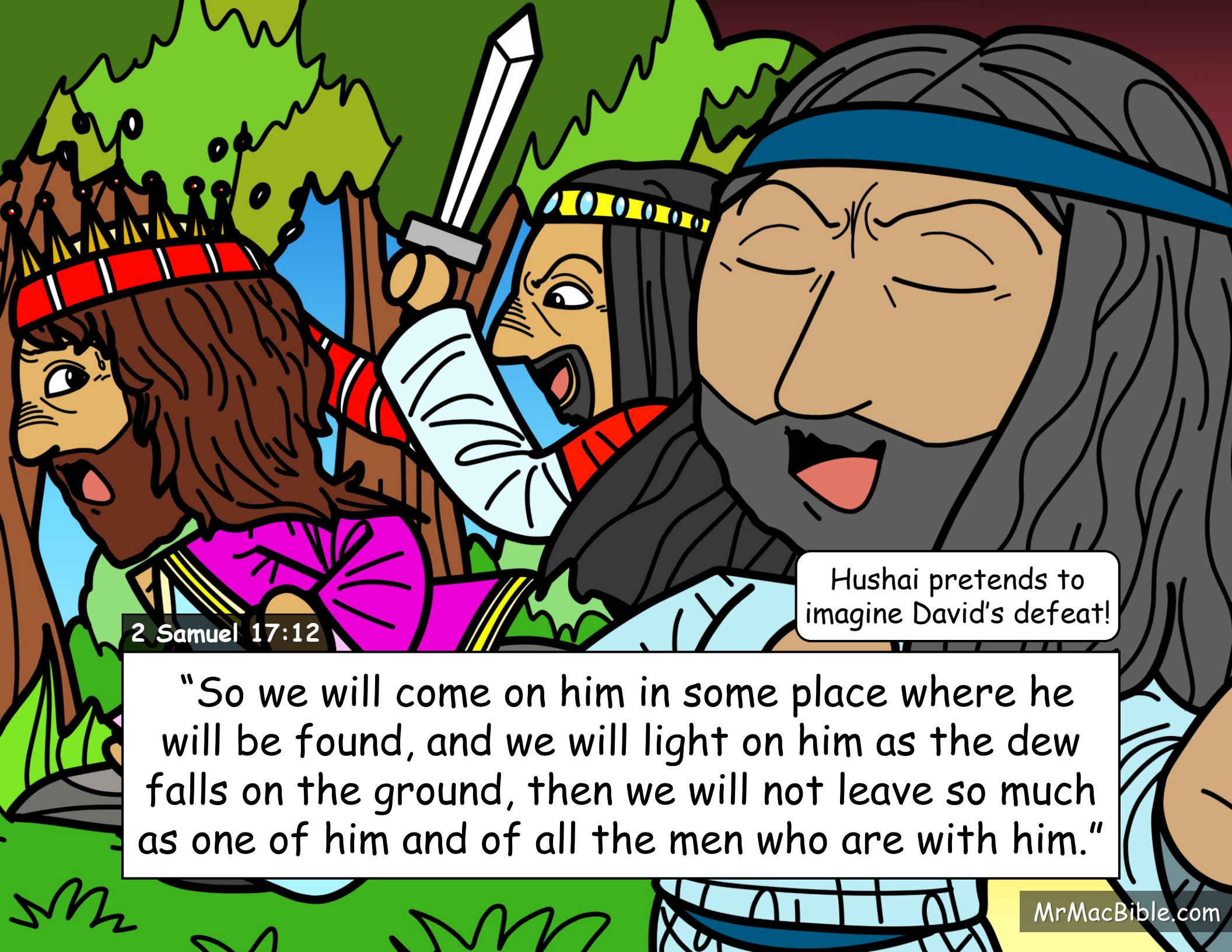




Hushai is really

"But I counsel that all Israel be gathered together to you, from Dan even to Beersheba, as the sand that is by the sea for multitude; and that you go to battle in your own person."




2 Samuel 17:12

2 Samuel 17:14



Then Hushai said to Zadok and to Abiathar the priests, "Ahithophel counselled Absalom and the elders of Israel that way; and I have counselled this way."






Hushai tells

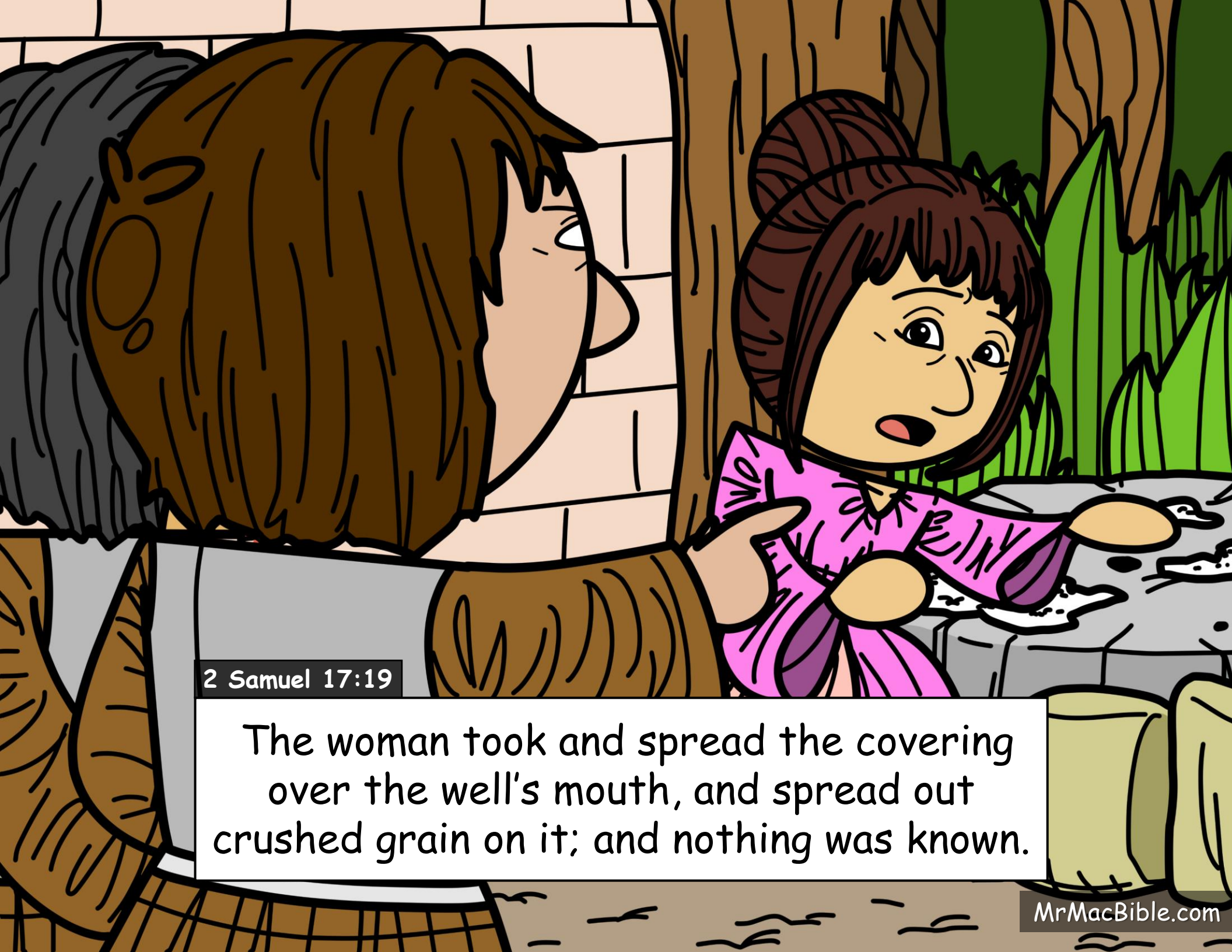




2 Samuel 17:18

But a boy saw them, and told Absalom. Then they both went away quickly and came to the house of a man in Bahurim, who had a well in his court; and they went down there.






2 Samuel 17:19

The king commanded Joab and Abishai and Ittai, saying, "Deal gently for my sake with the young man Absalom." All the people heard when the king commanded all the captains concerning Absalom.

The people of Israel were struck there before David's servants, and there was a great slaughter there that day of twenty thousand men.

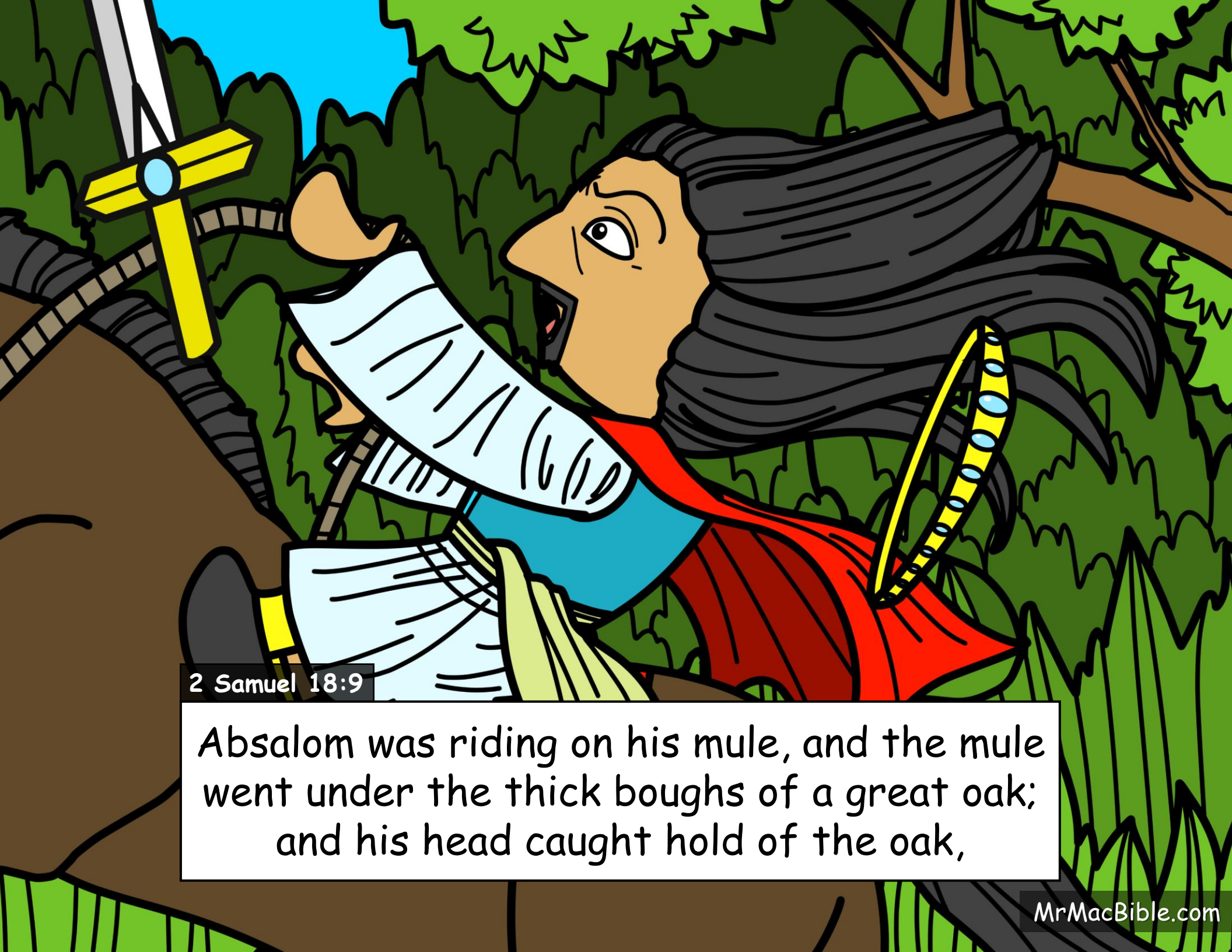




2 Samuel 18:8

Absalom was riding on his mule, and the mule went under the thick boughs of a great oak; and his head caught hold of the oak,

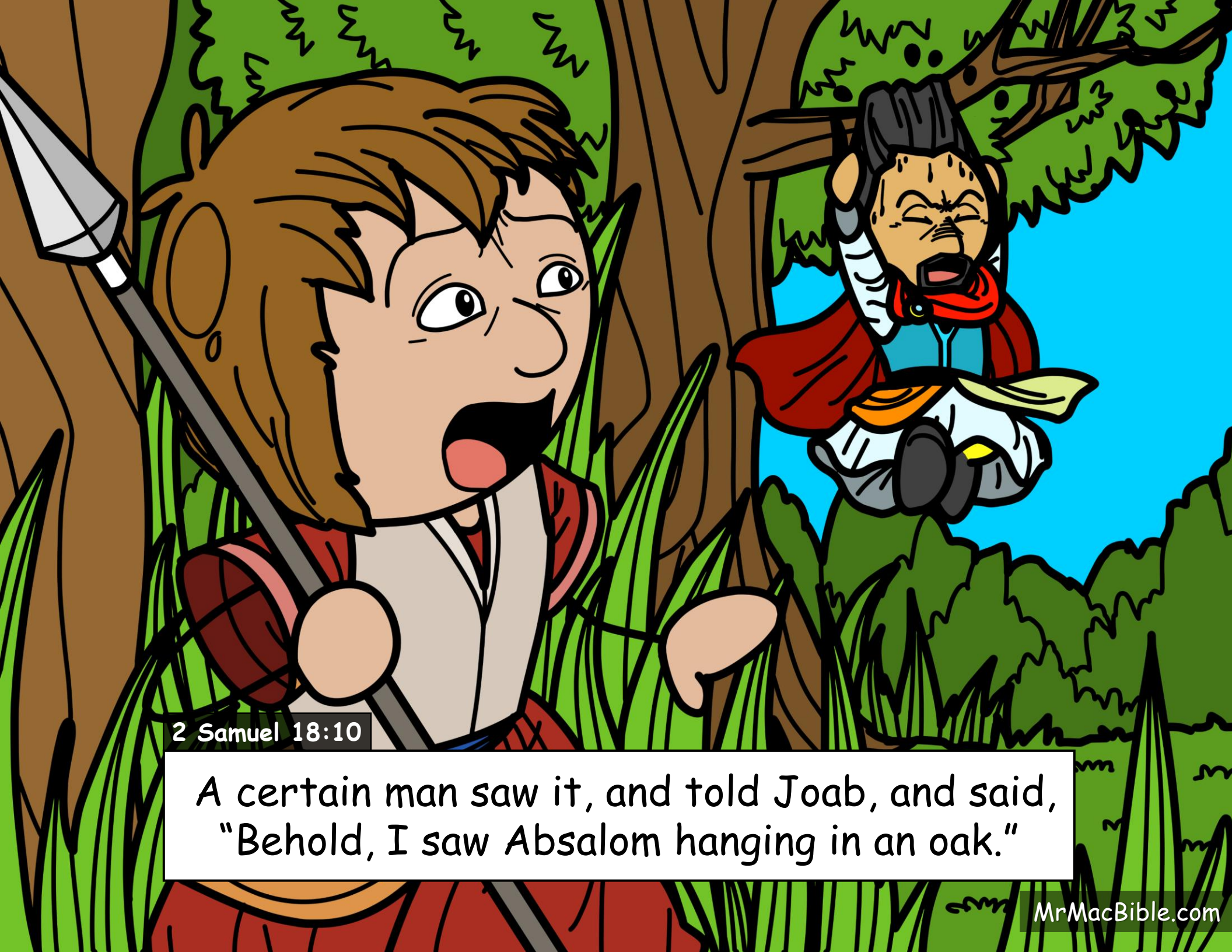




2 Samuel 18:9

The man said to Joab, "Though I should receive a thousand pieces of silver in my hand, I still wouldn't stretch out my hand against the king's son;"

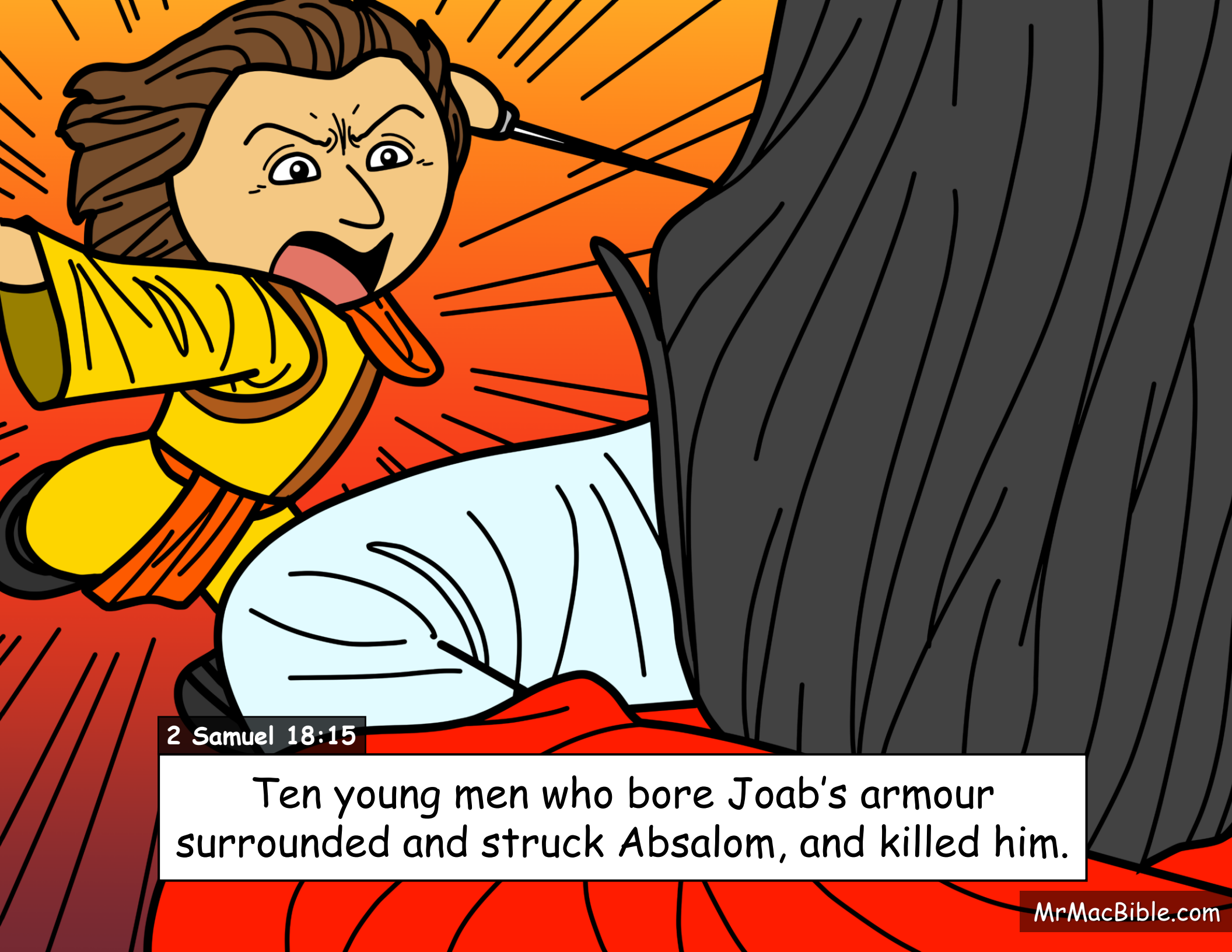




2 Samuel 18:14

Joab blew the trumpet, and the people returned from pursuing after Israel; for Joab held the people back.



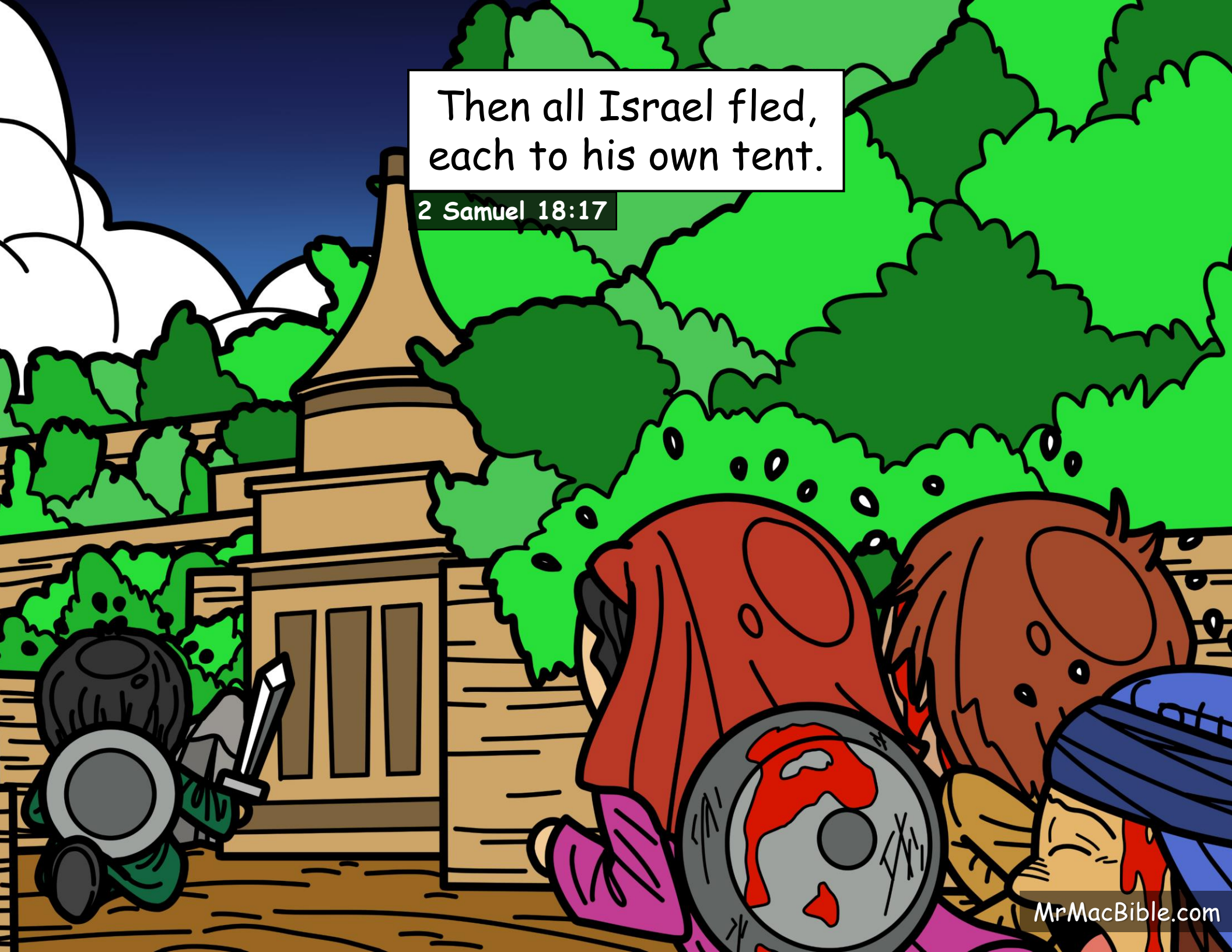


2 Samuel 18:17

Joab was told, "Behold, the king weeps and mourns for Absalom."



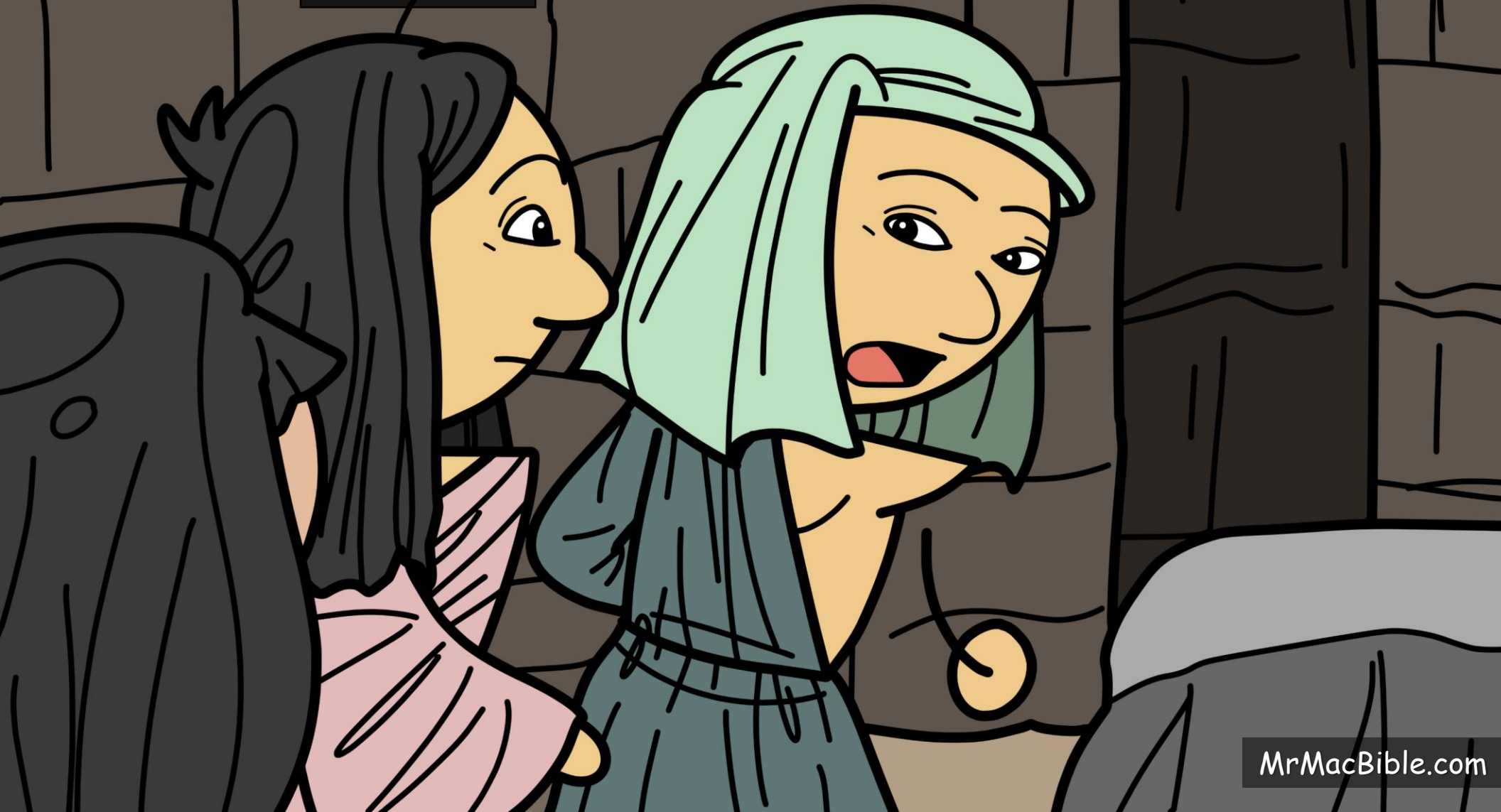


2 Samuel 19:2

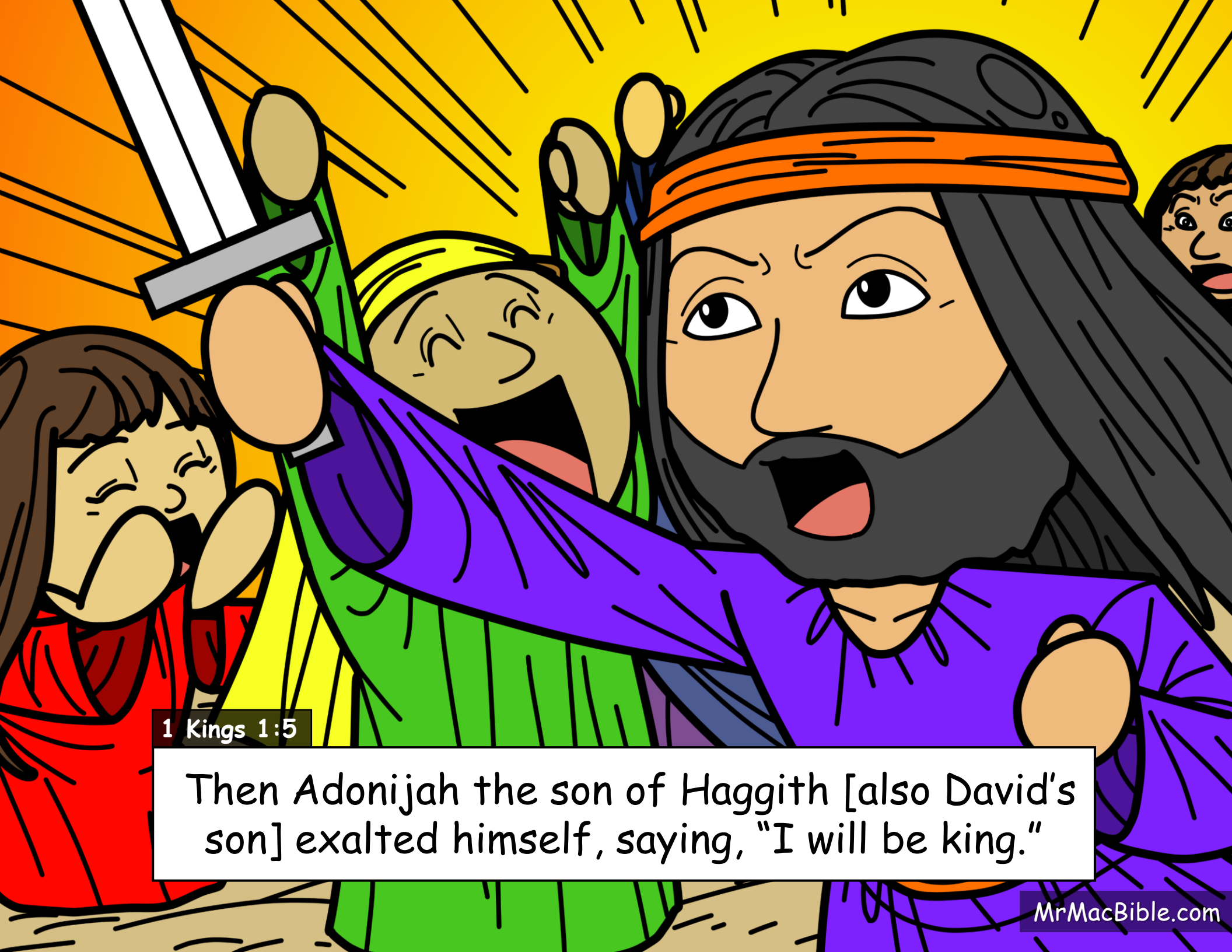
Judah came to Gilgal, to go to meet the king, to bring the king over the Jordan.

1 Kings 1:15

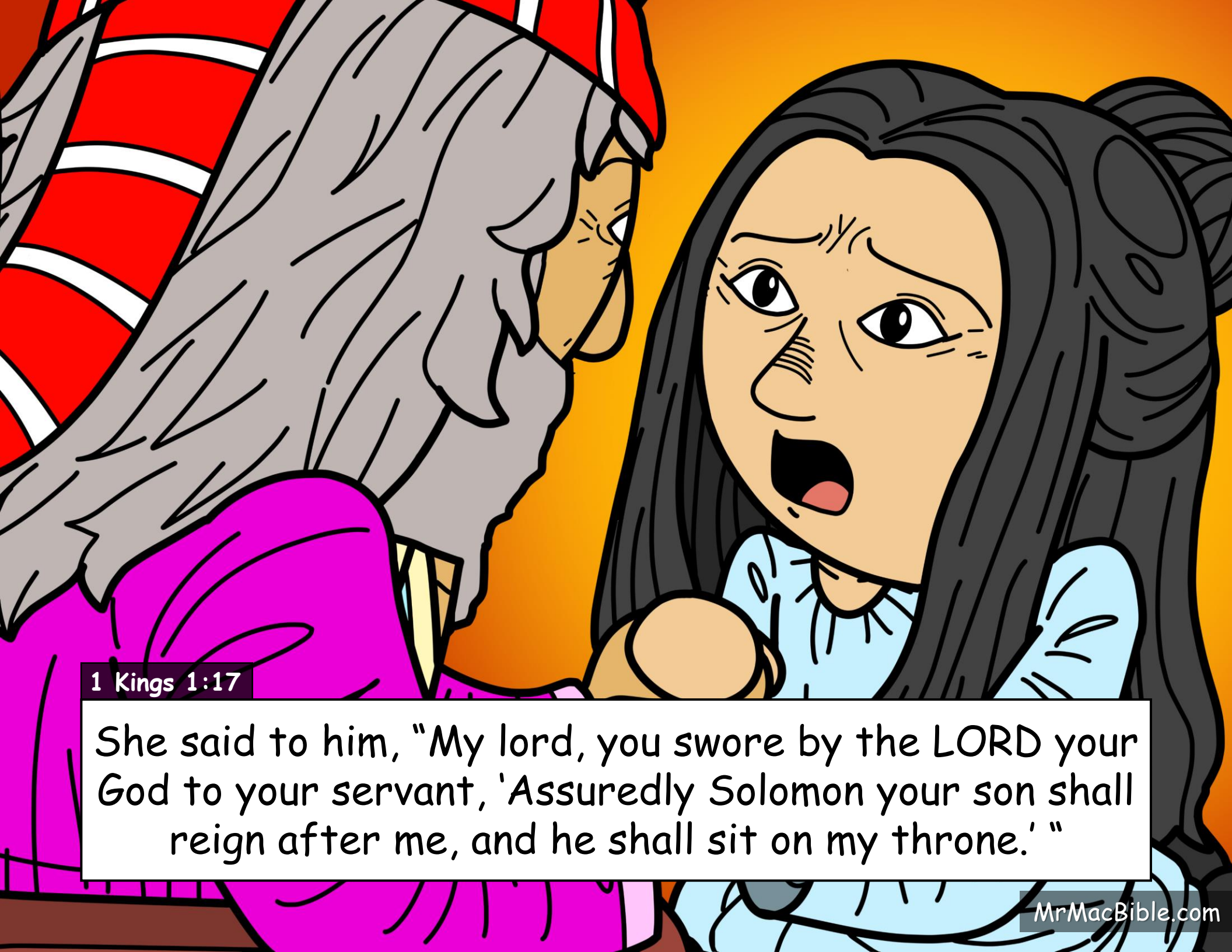
Bathsheba went in to the king in his room. The king was very old; and Abishag the Shunammite was serving the king.

1 Kings 1:29-30

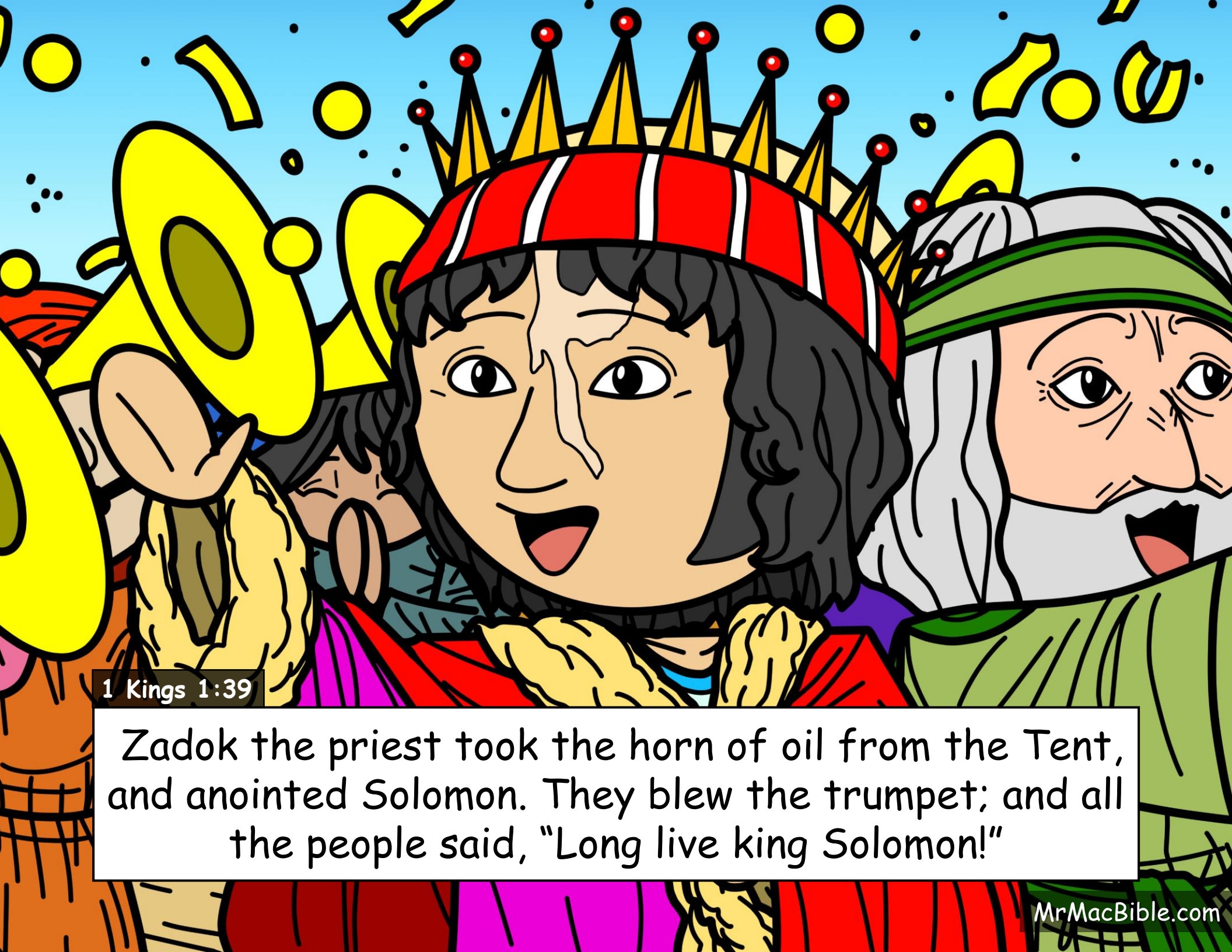


In Gibeon, the LORD appeared to Solomon in a dream by night; and God said, "Ask for what I should give you."






The king commanded, and they cut out large stones, costly stones, to lay the foundation of the house with worked stone.

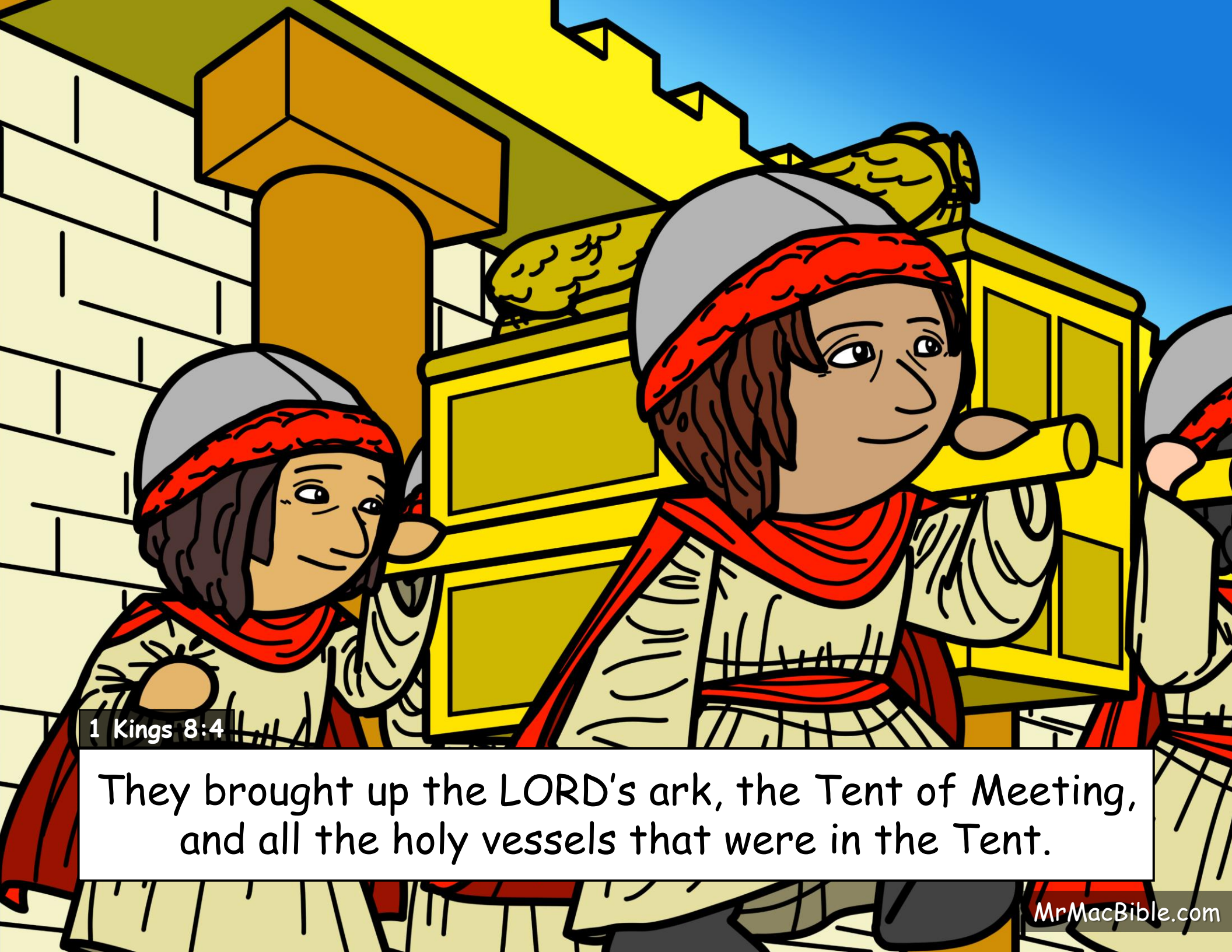

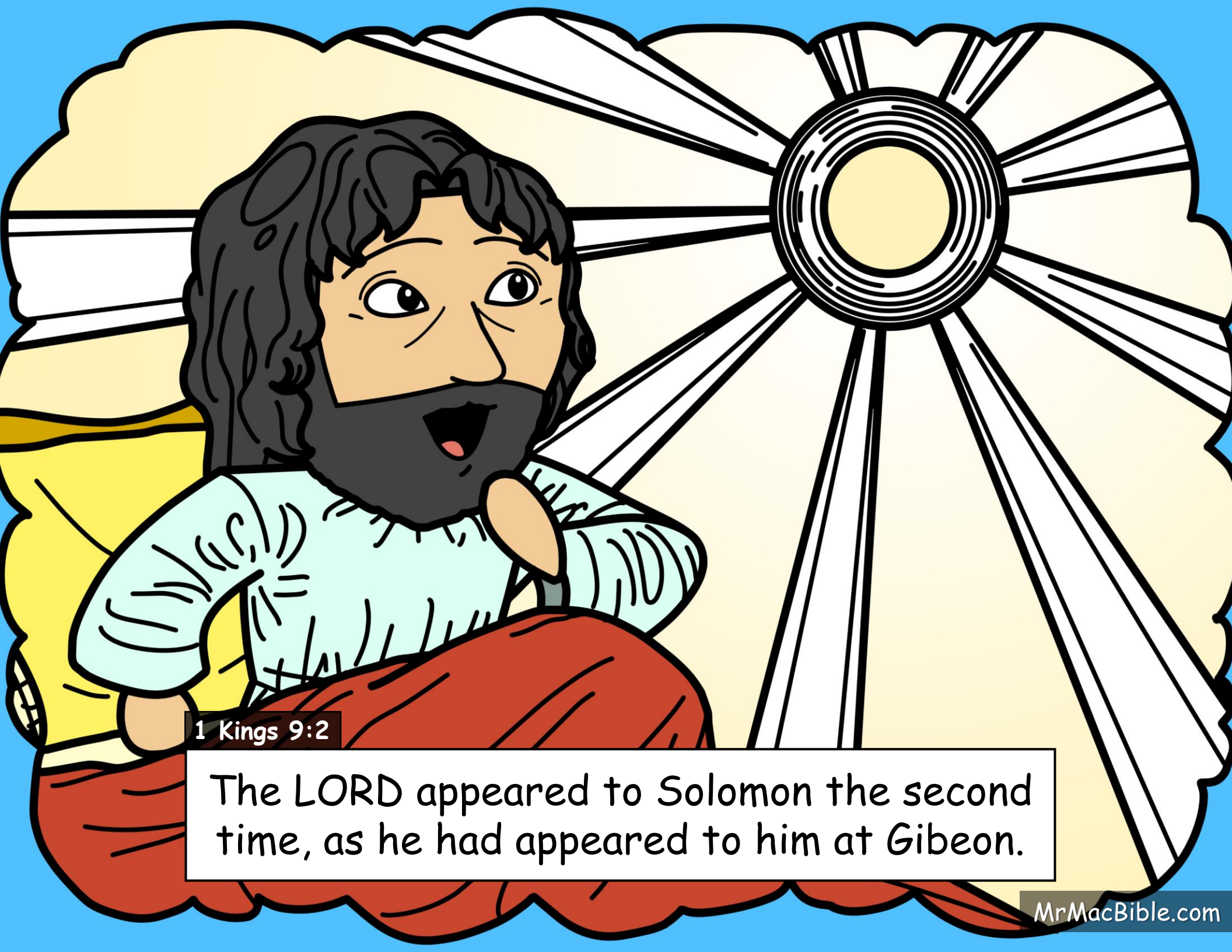

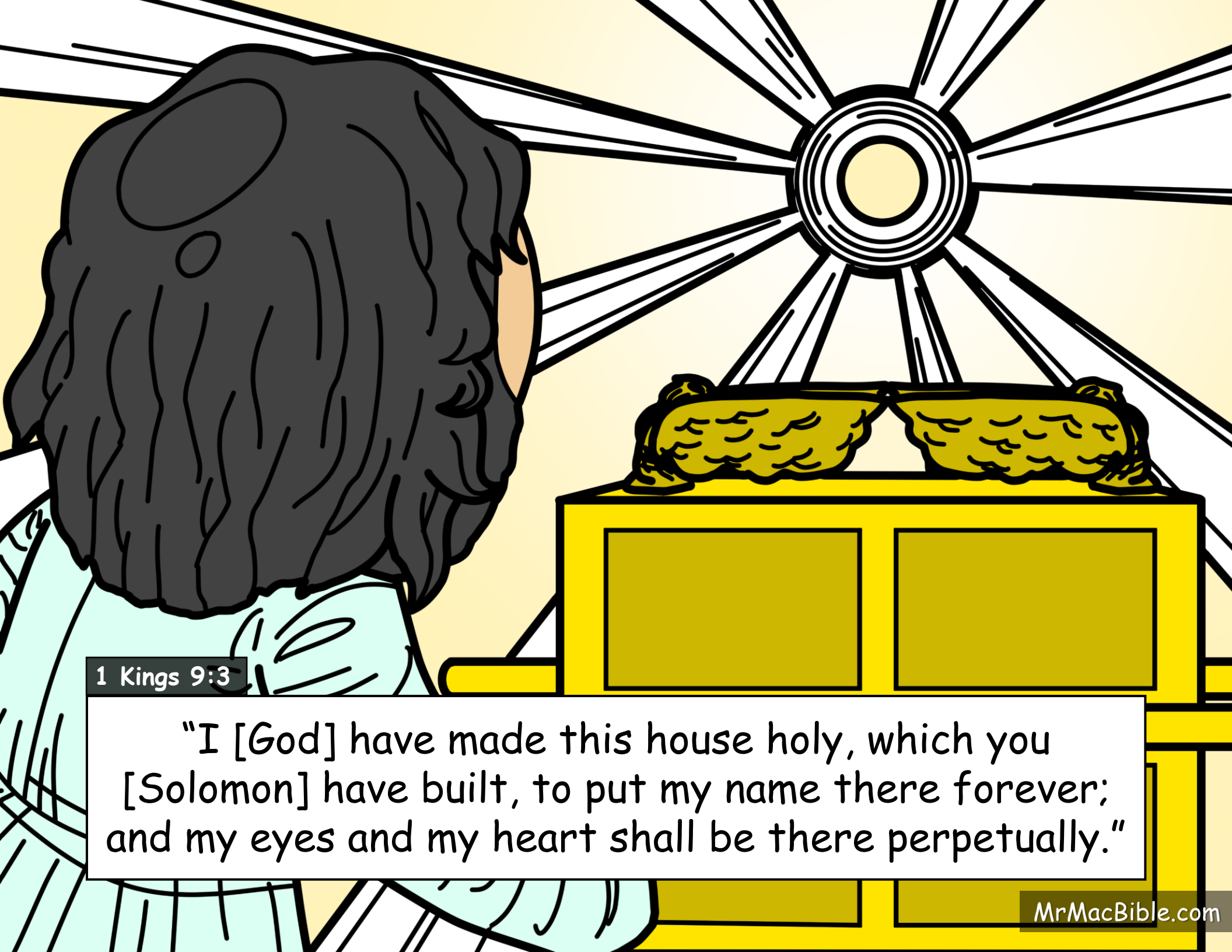

"I [God] have made this house holy, which you [Solomon] have built, to put my name there forever; and my eyes and my heart shall be there perpetually."

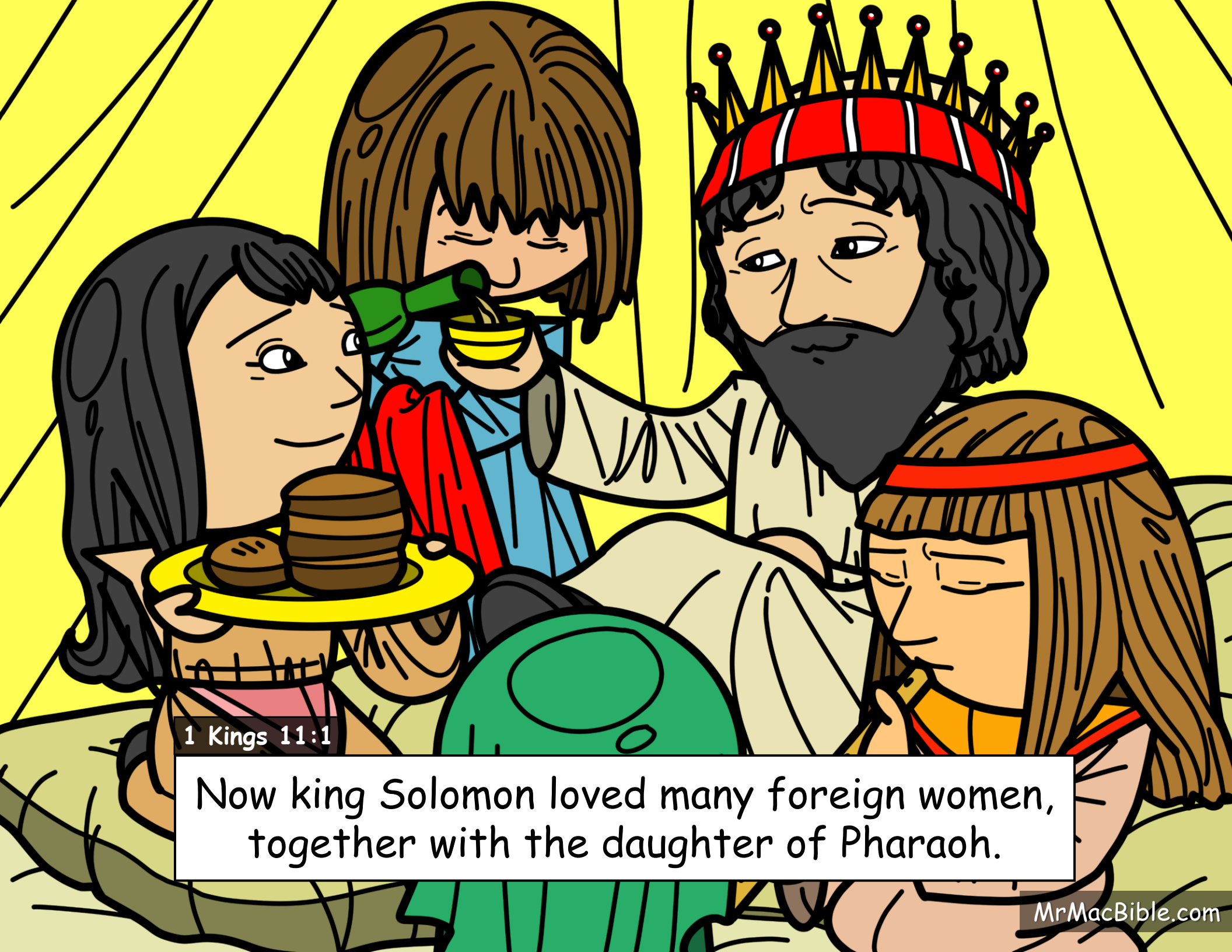

1 Kings 11:11

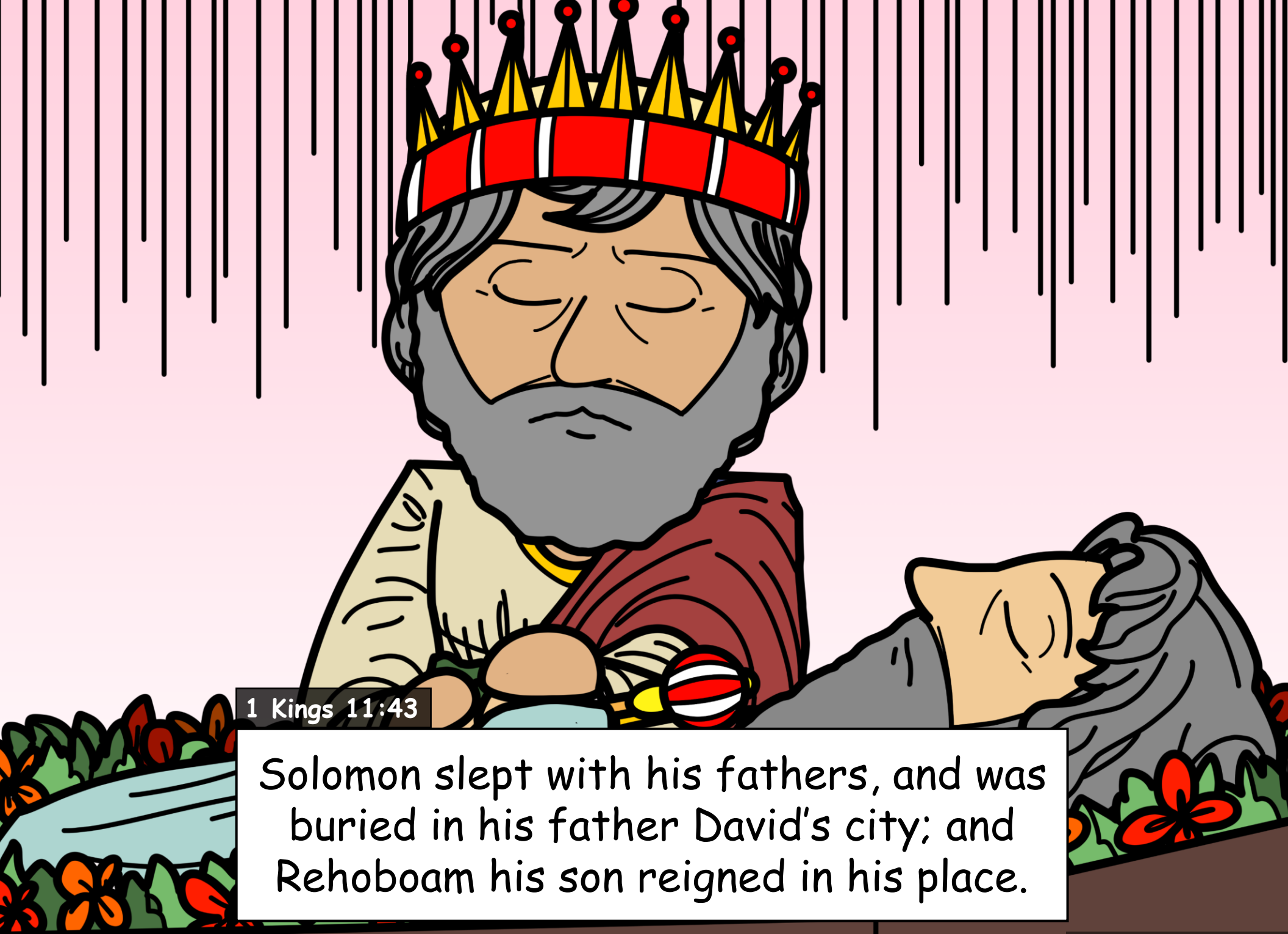



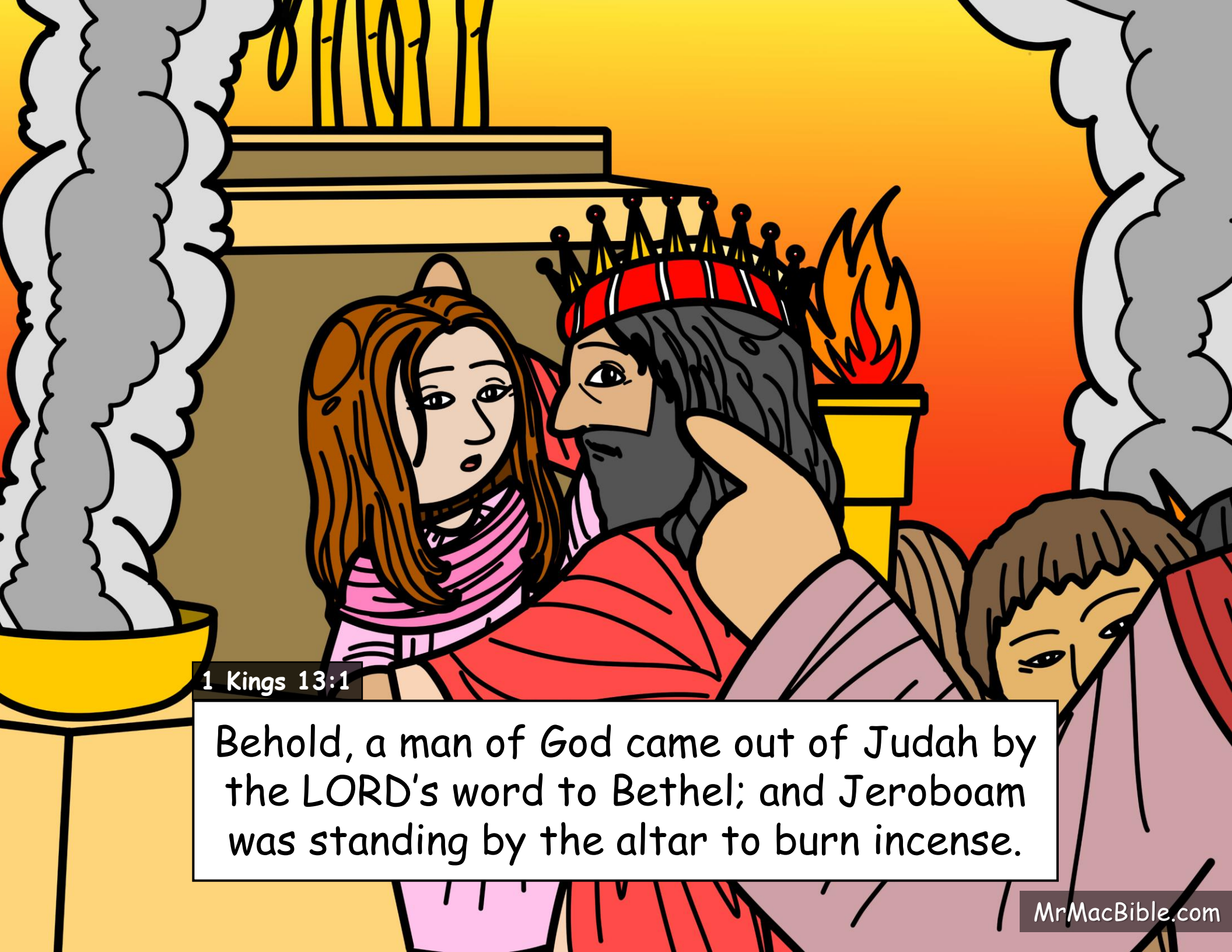


He [king Jeroboam] set the one [golden calf] in Bethel, and the other he put in Dan.



Behold, a man of God came out of Judah by the LORD's word to Bethel; and Jeroboam was standing by the altar to burn incense.

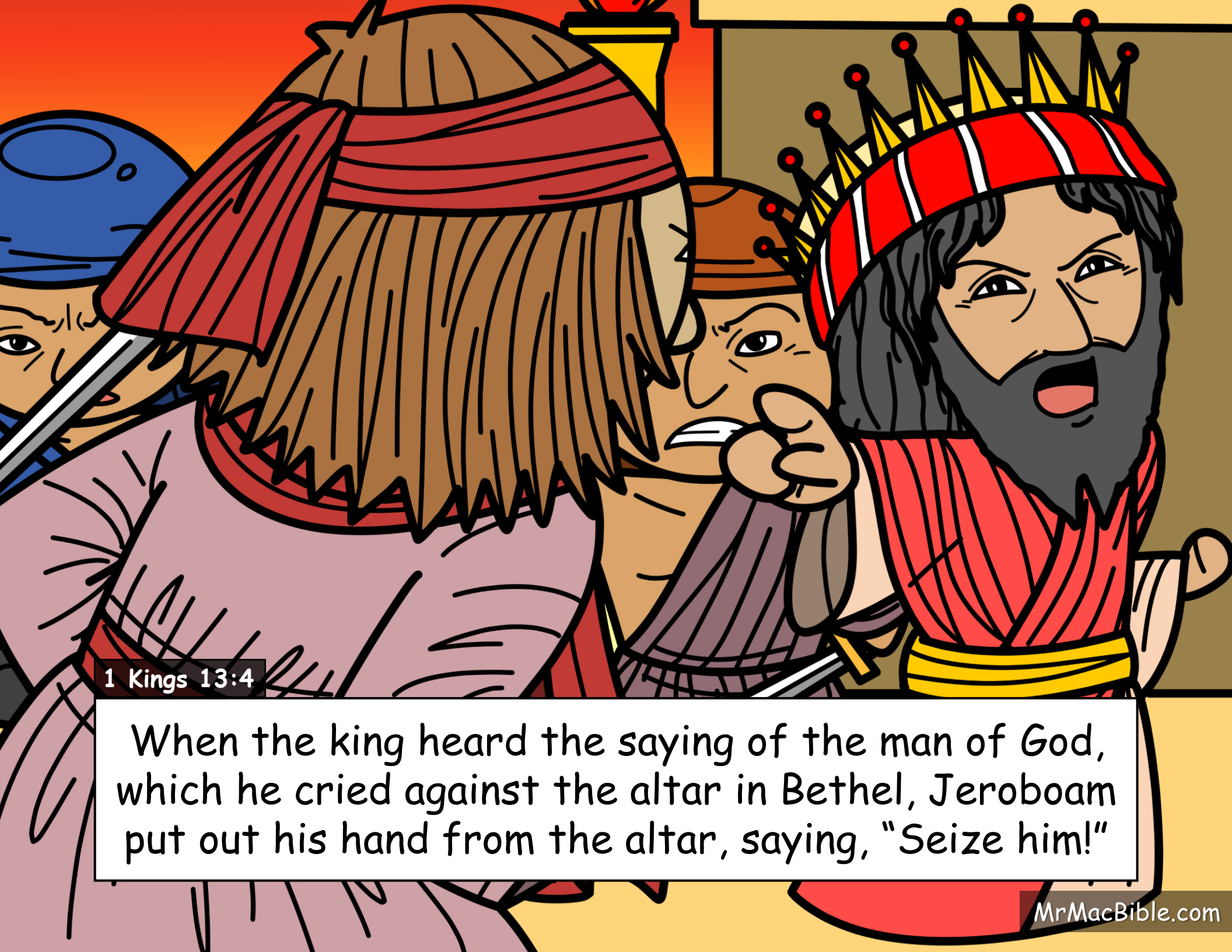




He cried against the altar by the LORD's word, and said, "Altar! Altar! the LORD says:

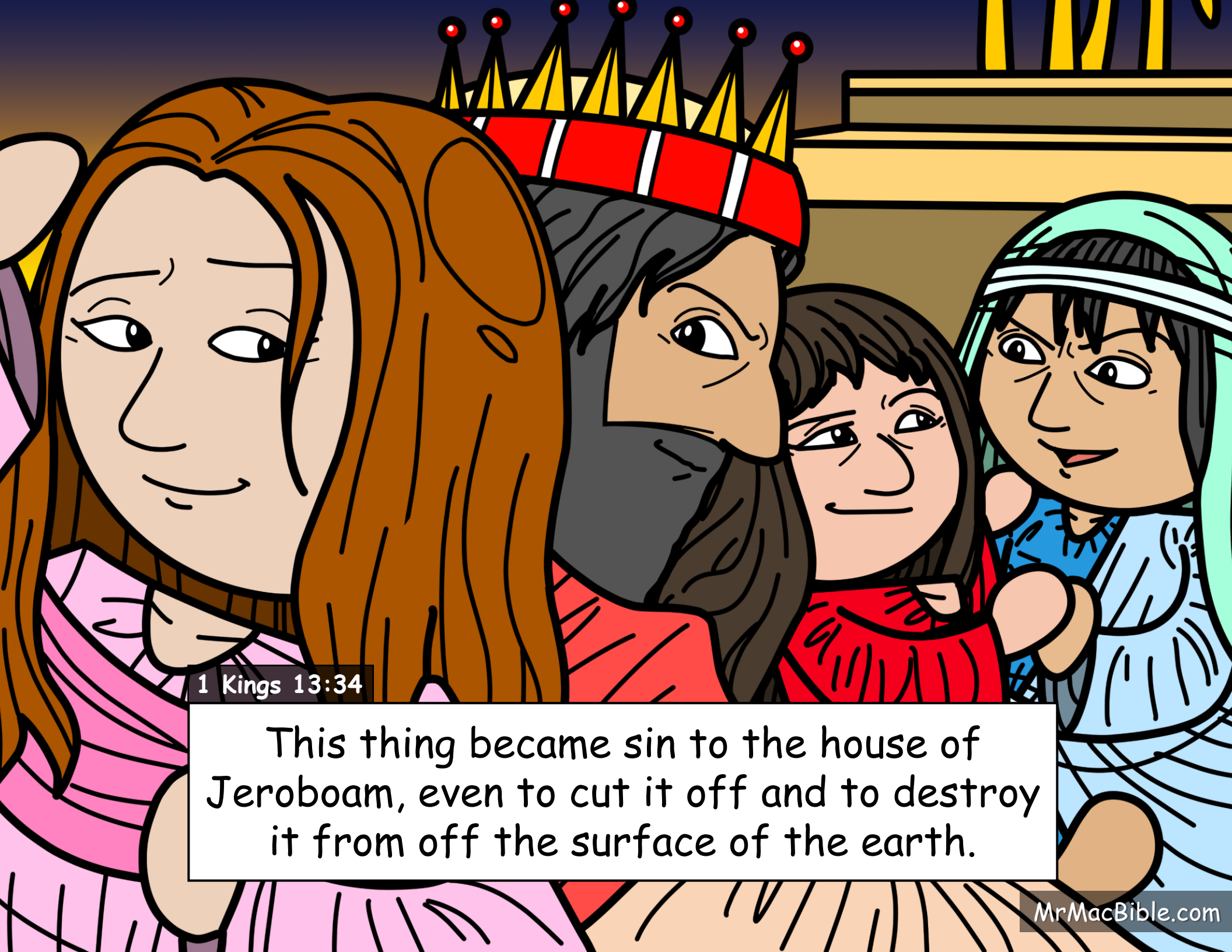



Now there was war between Rehoboam and Jeroboam all the days of his life.






King Asa: "Tear down these idols!"

Nadab the son of Jeroboam began to reign over Israel in the second year of Asa king of Judah; and he reigned over Israel two years.

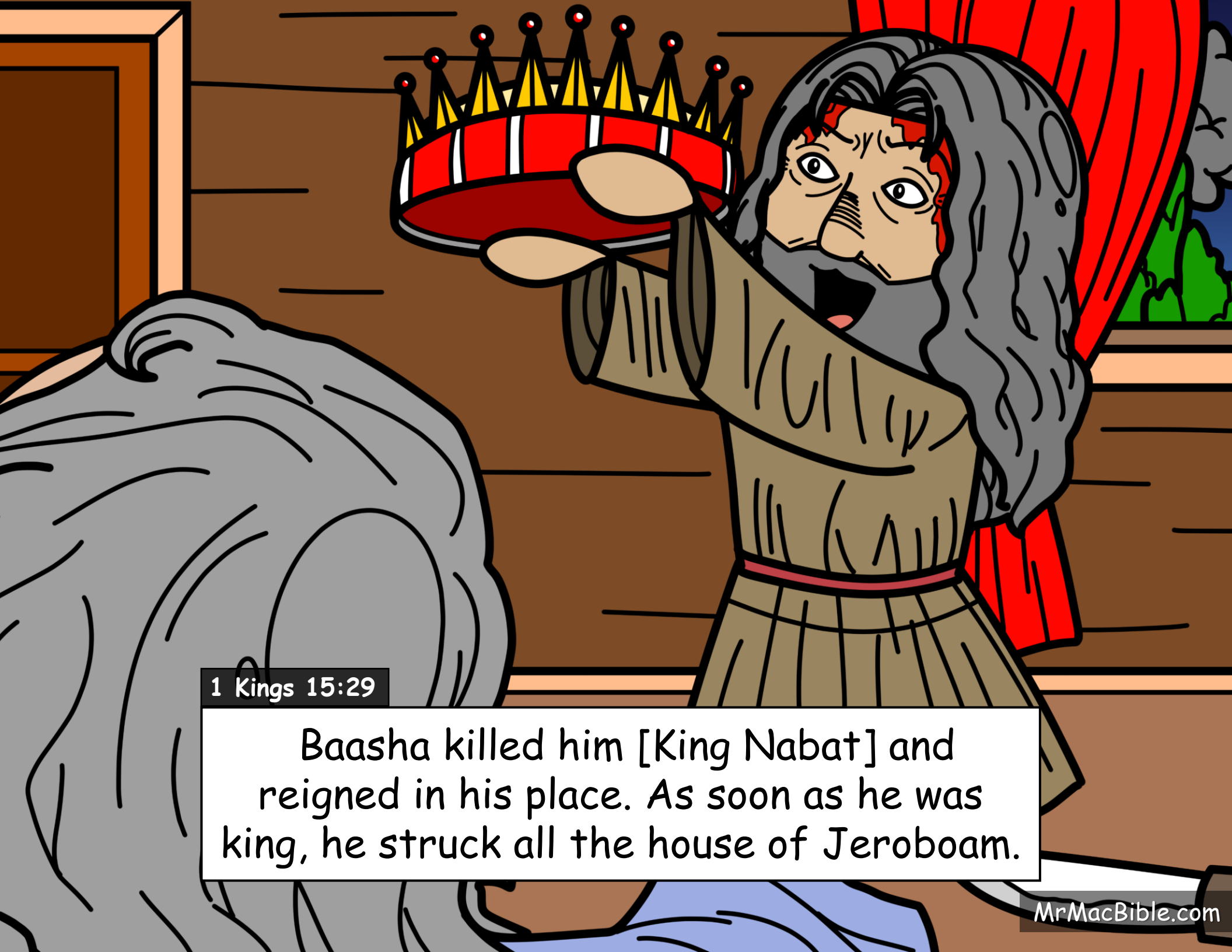
