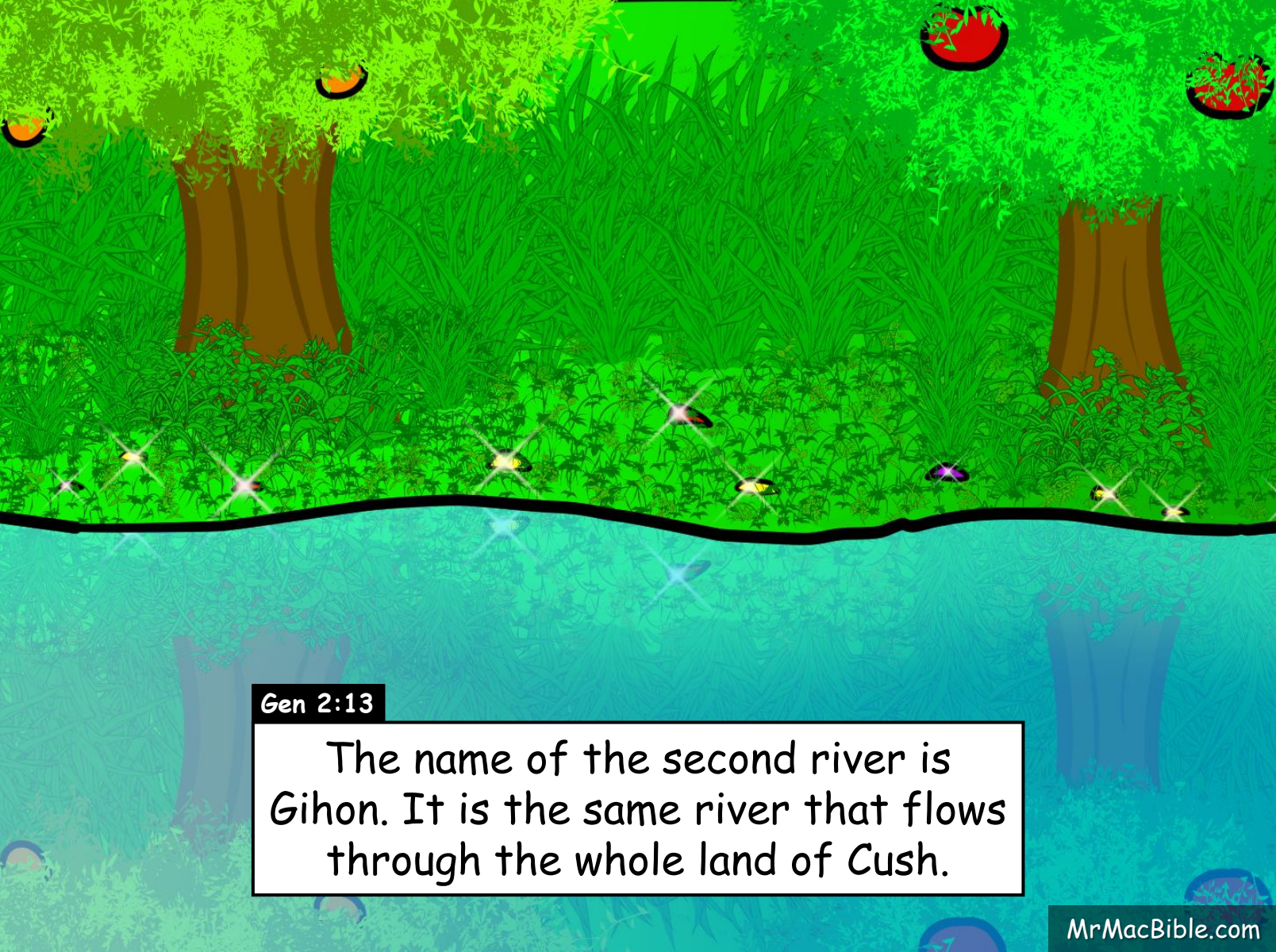
Gen 2:10

22 Zillah also gave birth to Tubal Cain, the forger of every cutting instrument of bronze and iron.

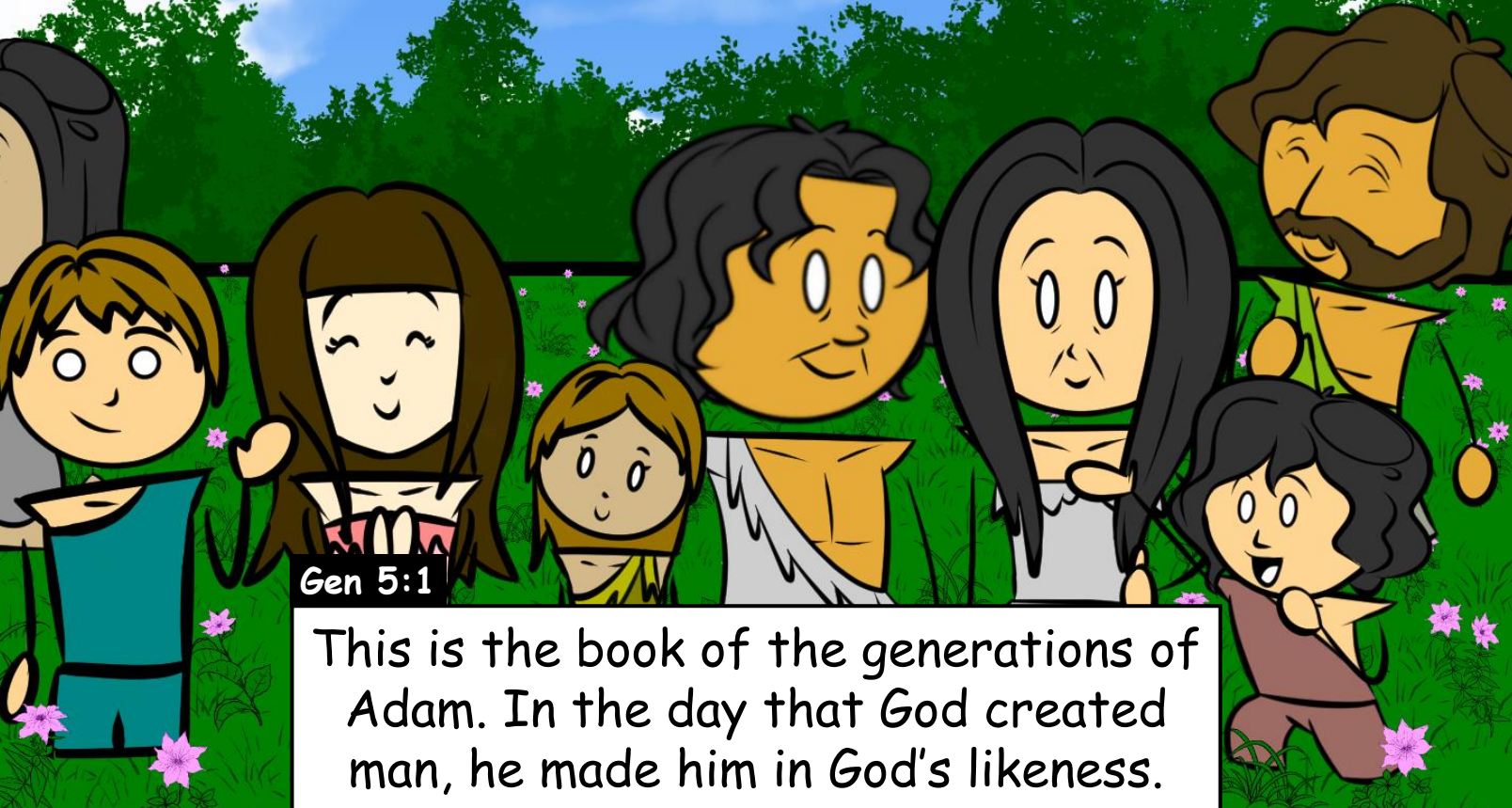

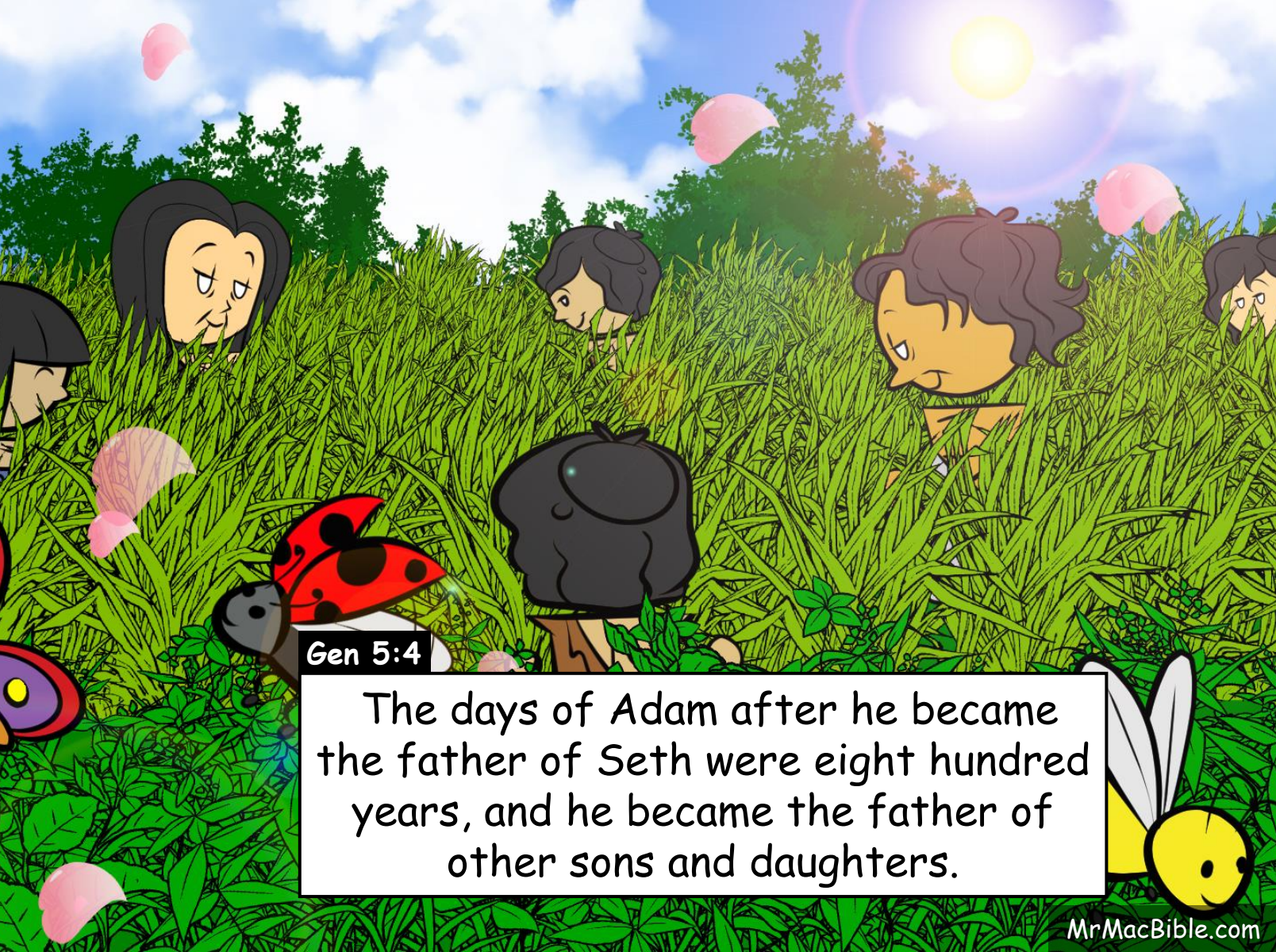



Gen 5:25-27

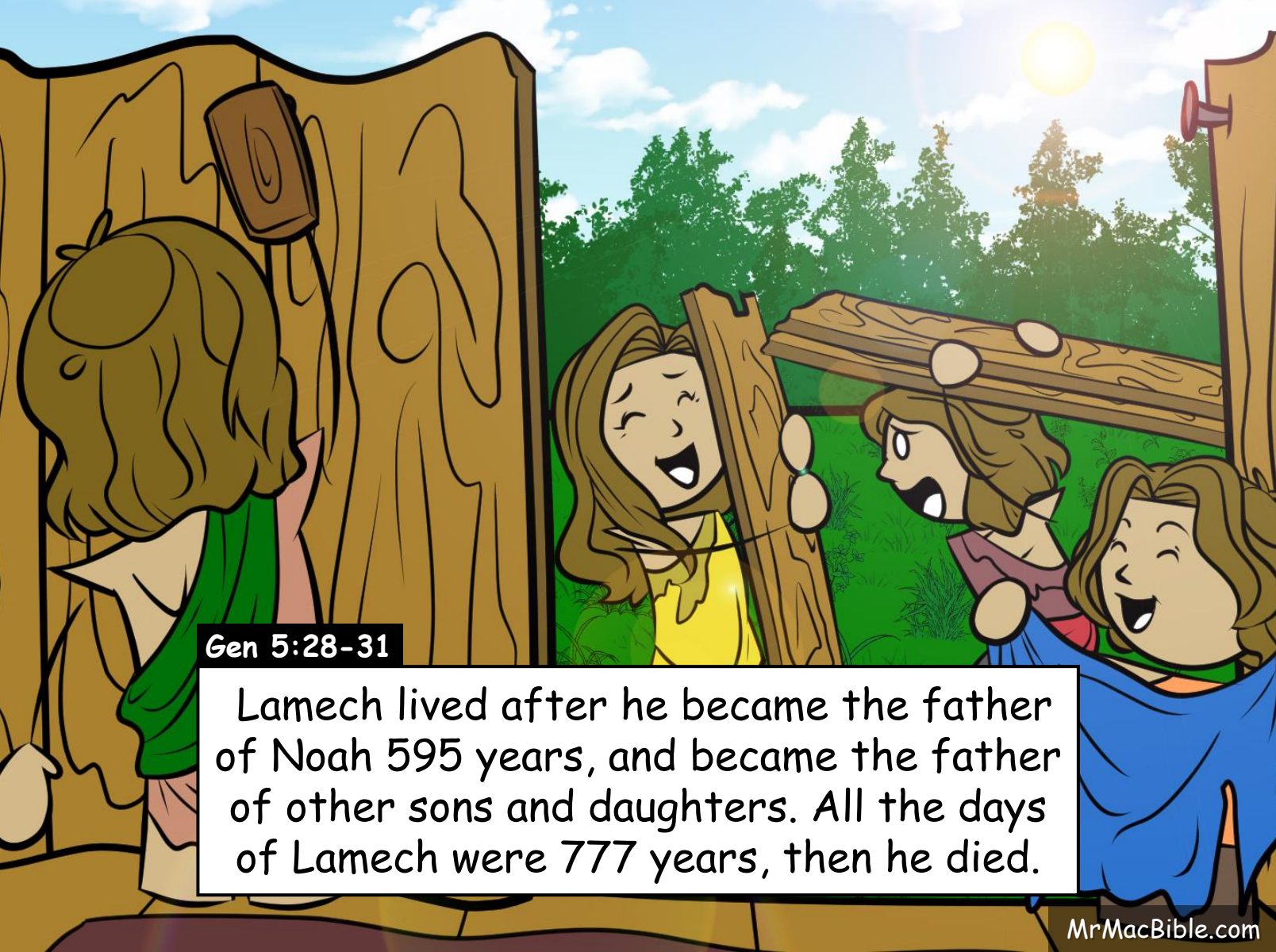
Methuselah lived after he became the father of Lamech 782 years, and became the father of other sons and daughters. All the days of Methuselah were 969 years, then he died.

Gen 5:28-29

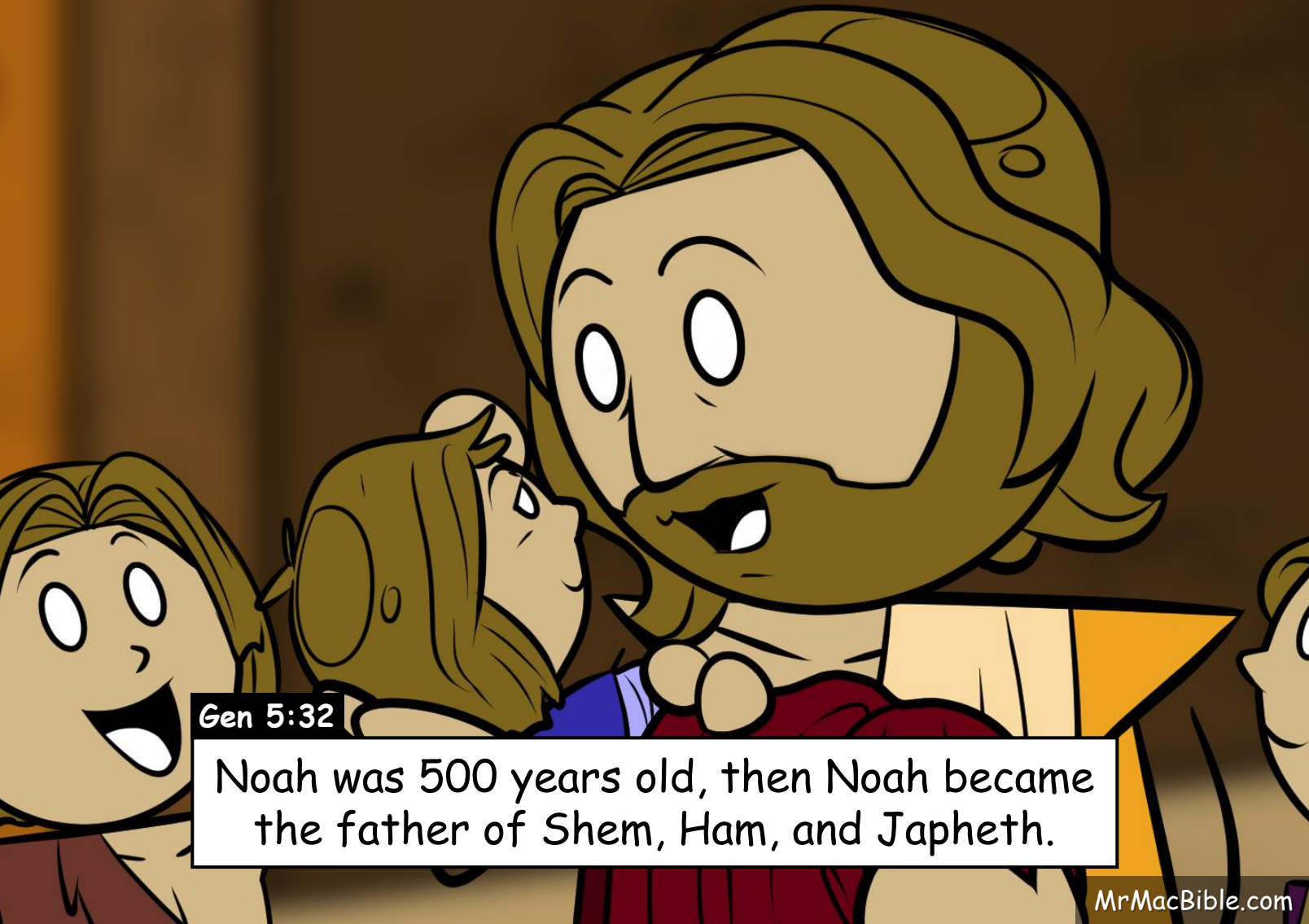


"This one will comfort us in our work and in the toil of our hands, caused by the ground which the LORD has cursed."
