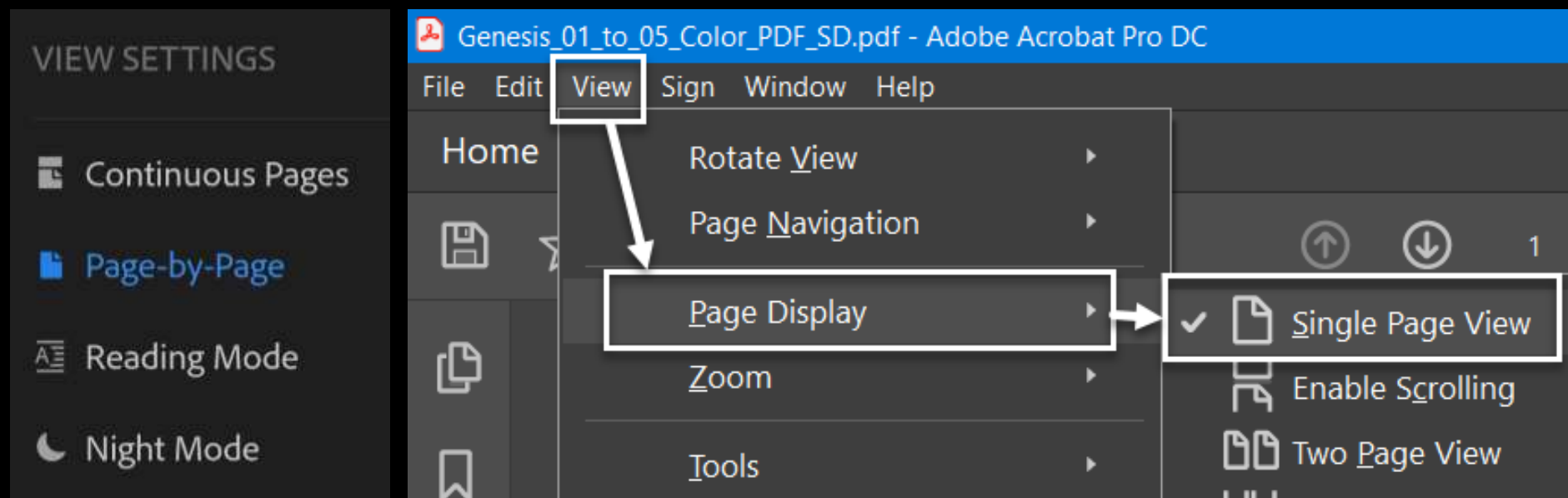

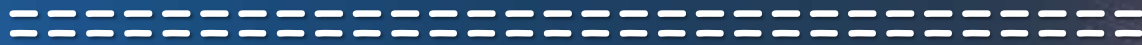

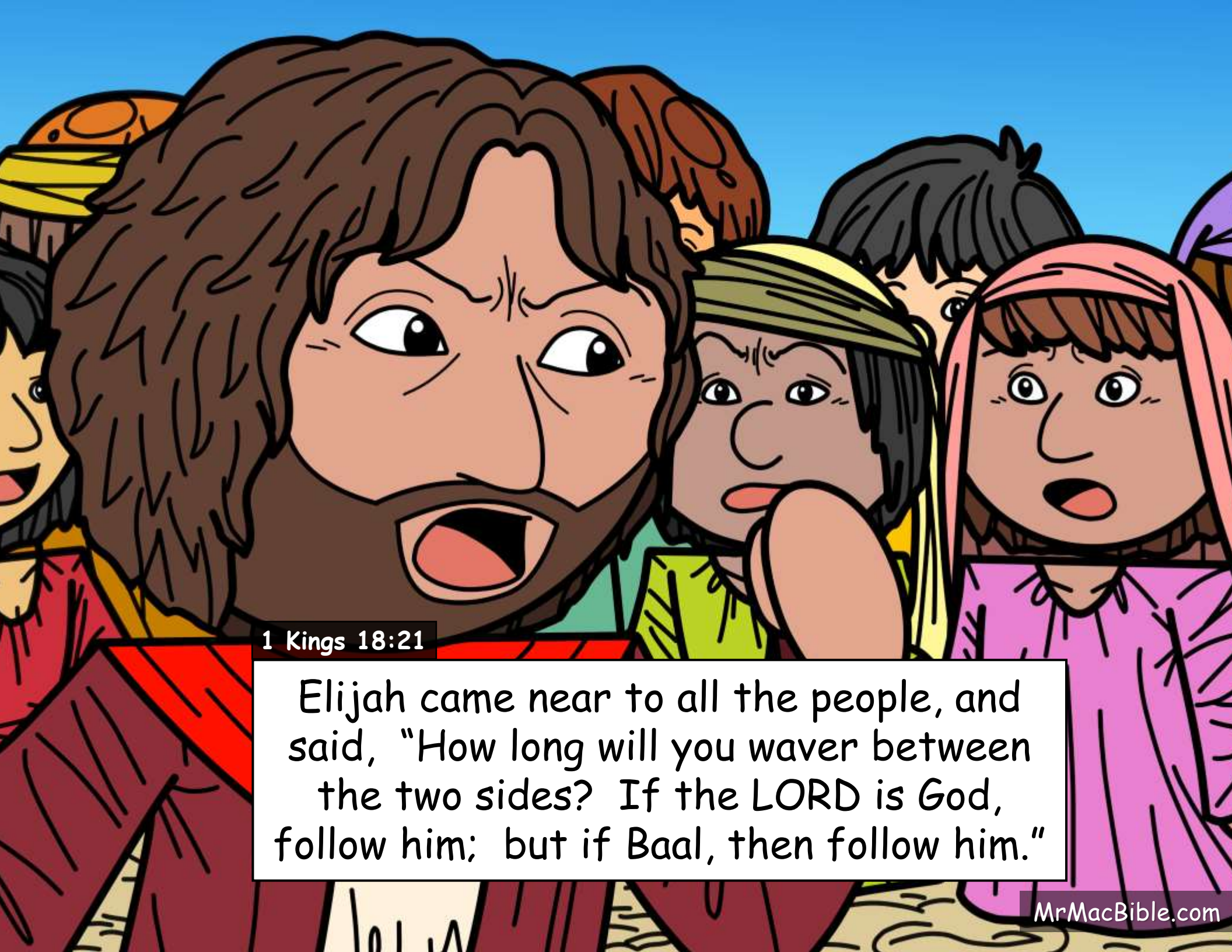
Elijah on Mt. Carmel

Now we're on Mount Carmel... and Elijah is ready to challenge the 850 prophets of Baal and Asherah to do battle with the true God!




1 Kings 18:21

"You call on the name of your god, and I will call on the LORD's name. The God who answers by fire, let him be God."



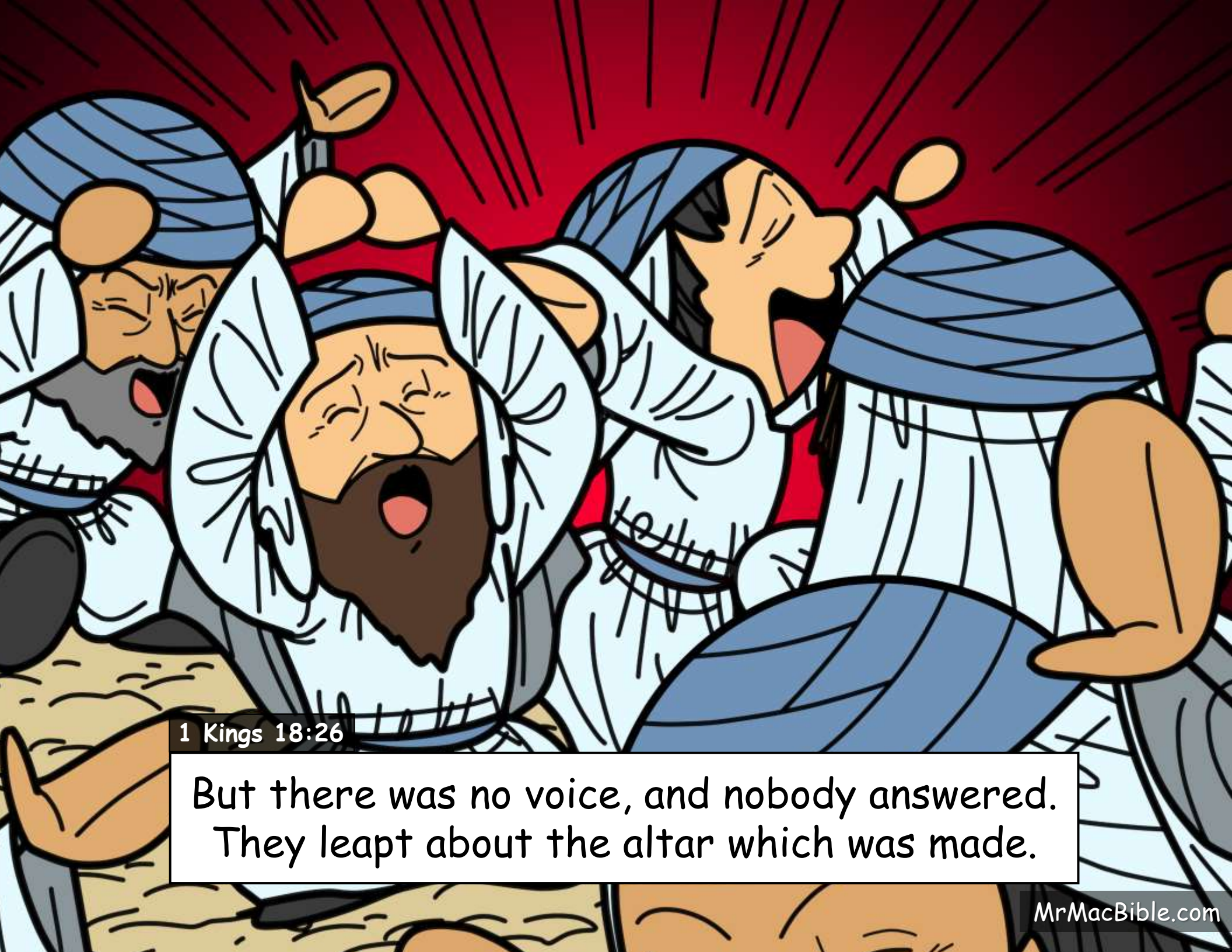
1 Kings 18:25

They took the bull which was given them, and they dressed it, and called on the name of Baal from morning even until noon, saying, "Baal, hear us!"



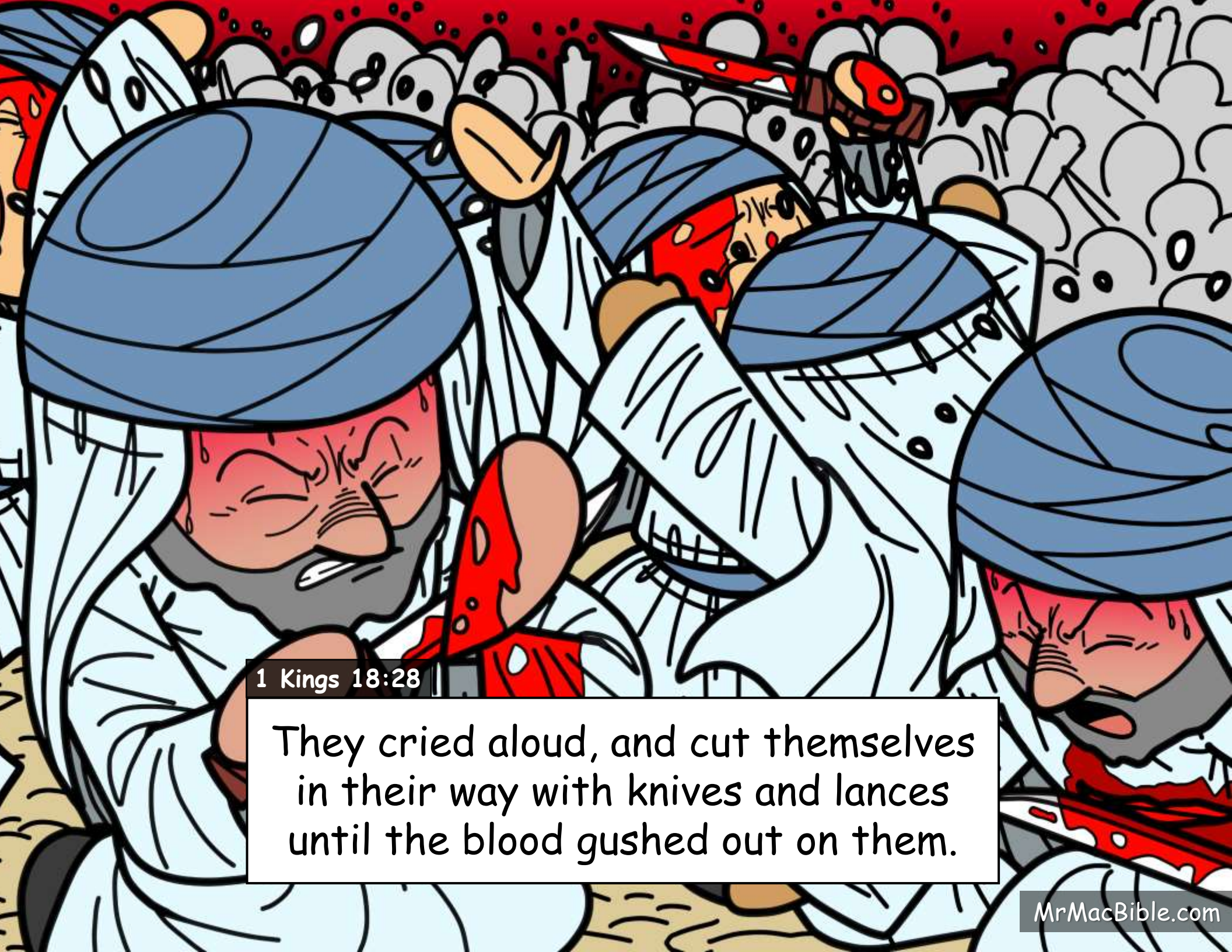
1 Kings 18:26

Elijah said to them, "Seize the prophets of Baal! Don't let one of them escape!"





Naboth said to Ahab, "May the LORD forbid me, that I should give the inheritance of my fathers to you!"



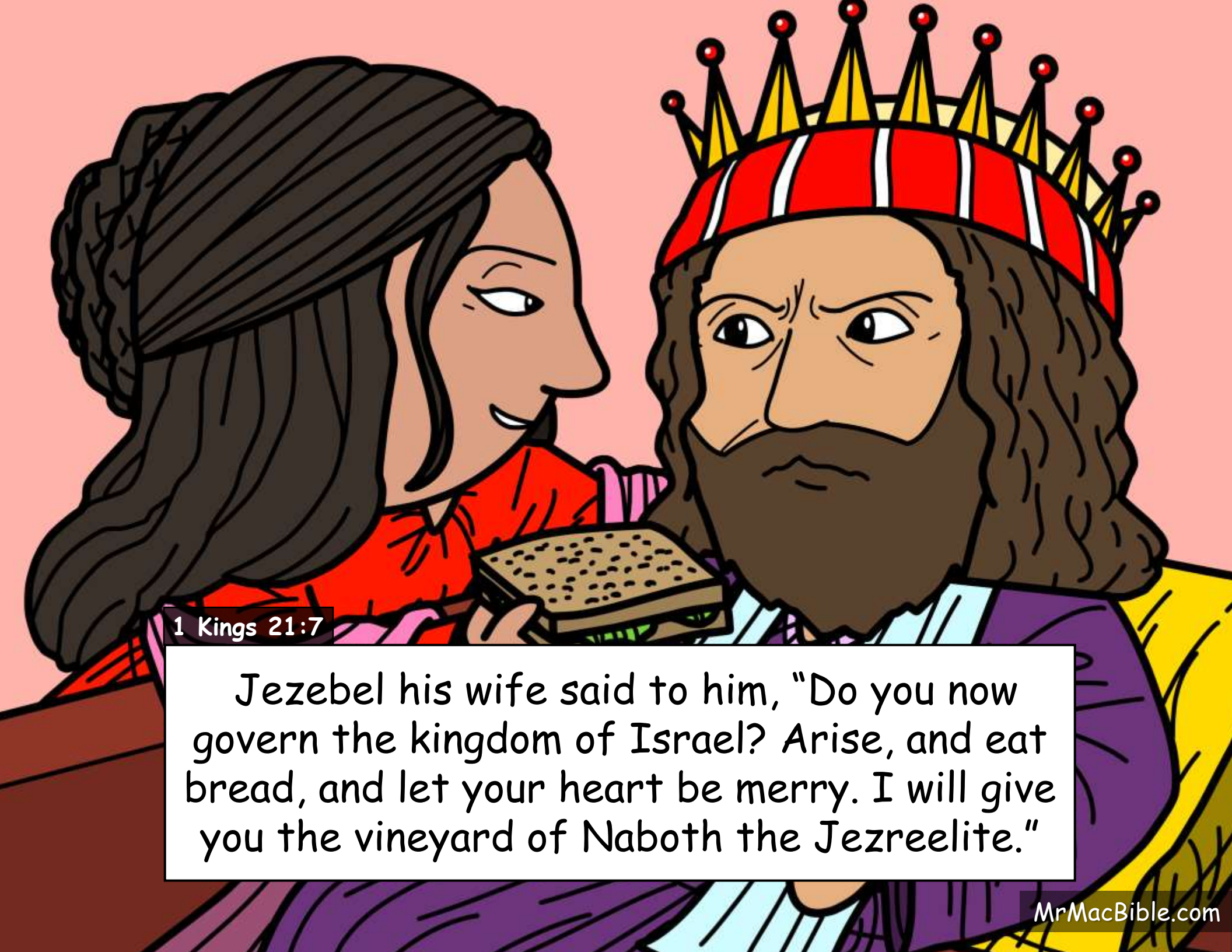
1 Kings 21:4

They proclaimed a fast, and set Naboth on high amongst the people.



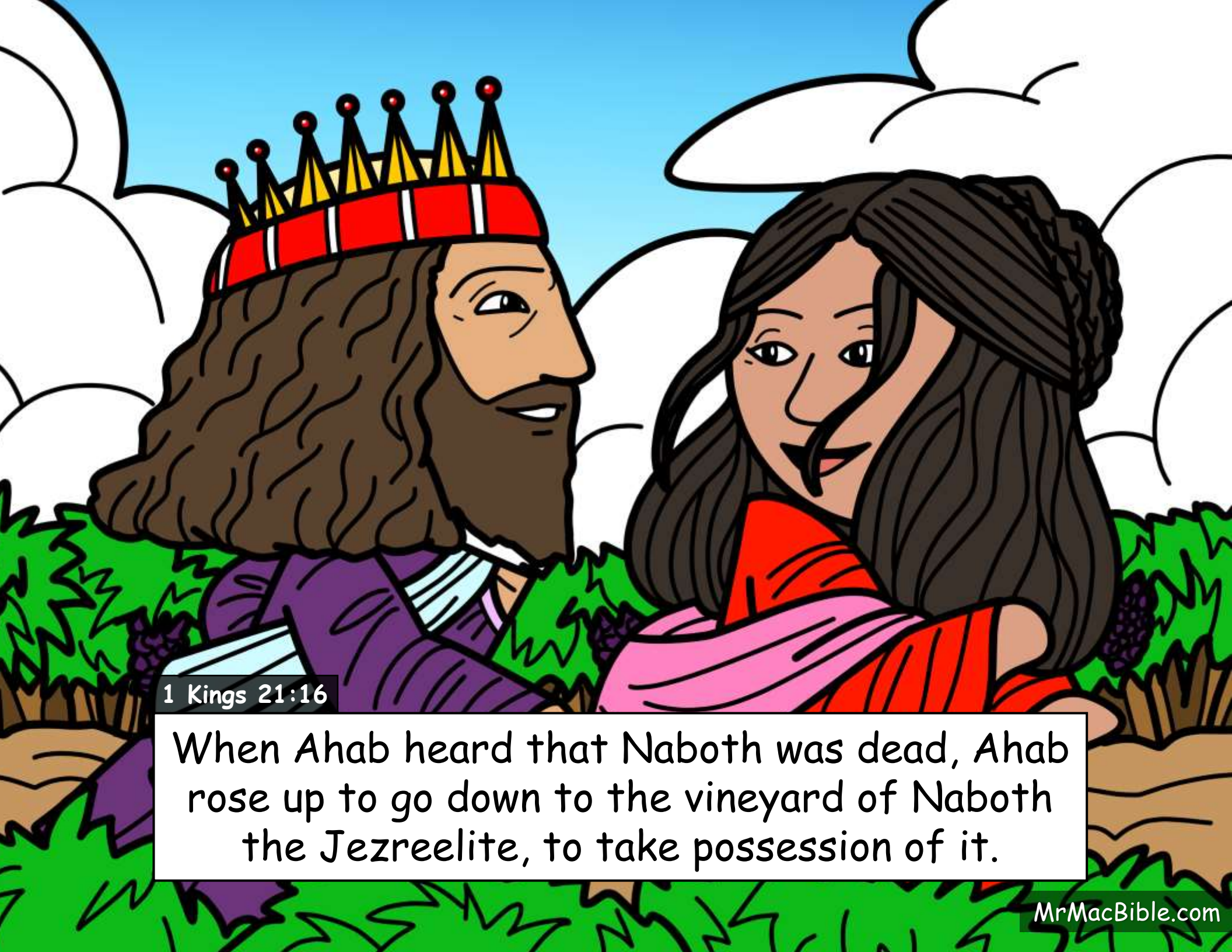
1 Kings 21:13


1 Kings 21:15

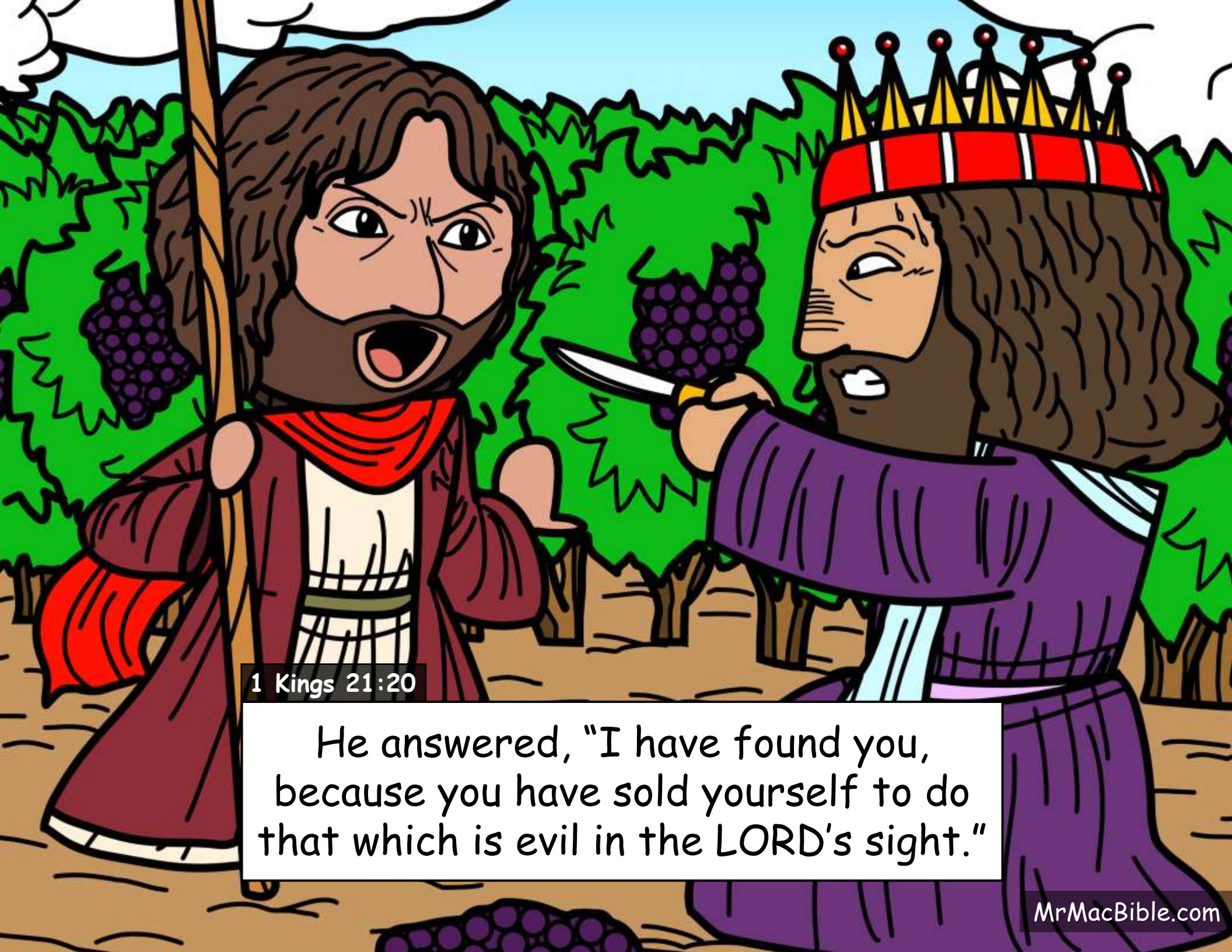

He answered, "I have found you, because you have sold yourself to do that which is evil in the LORD's sight."



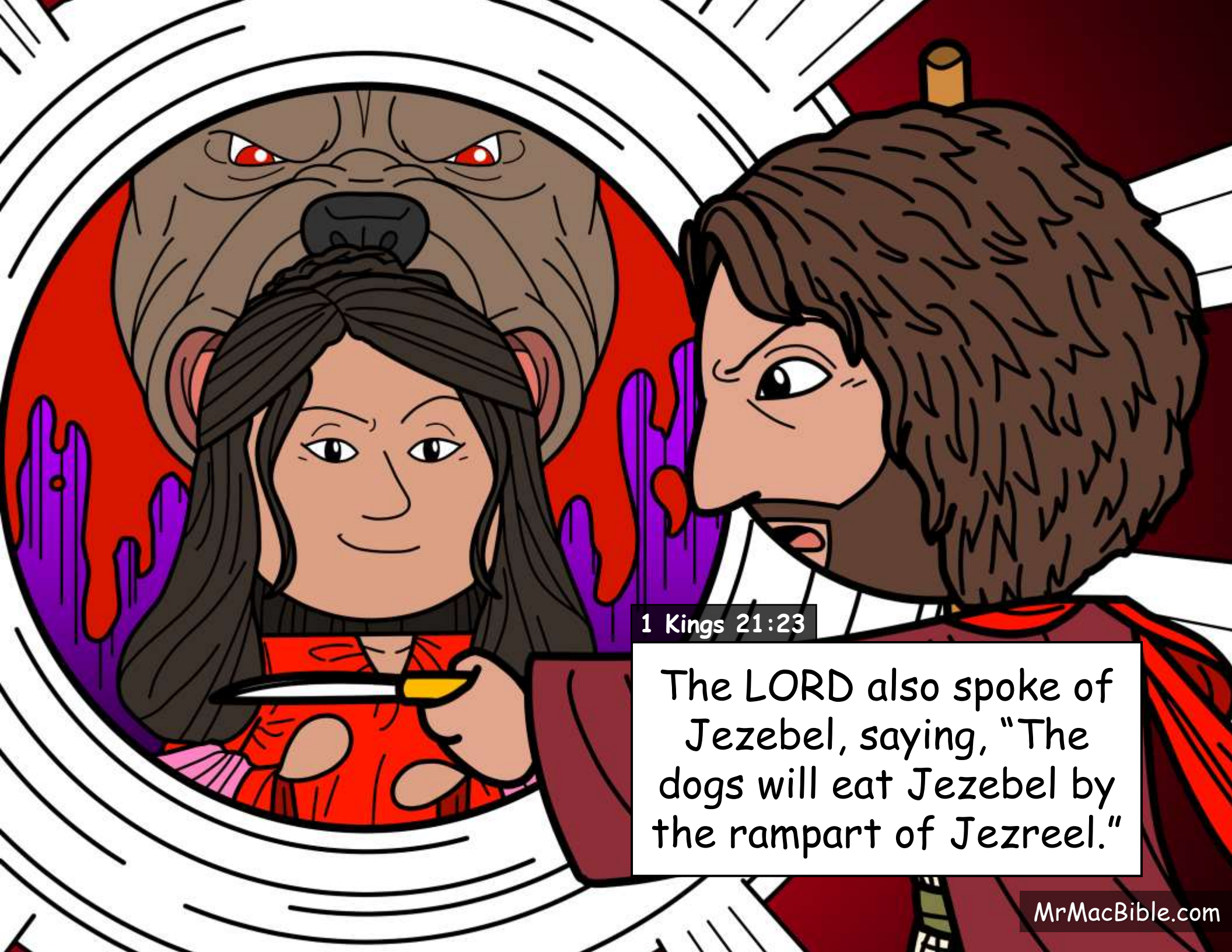

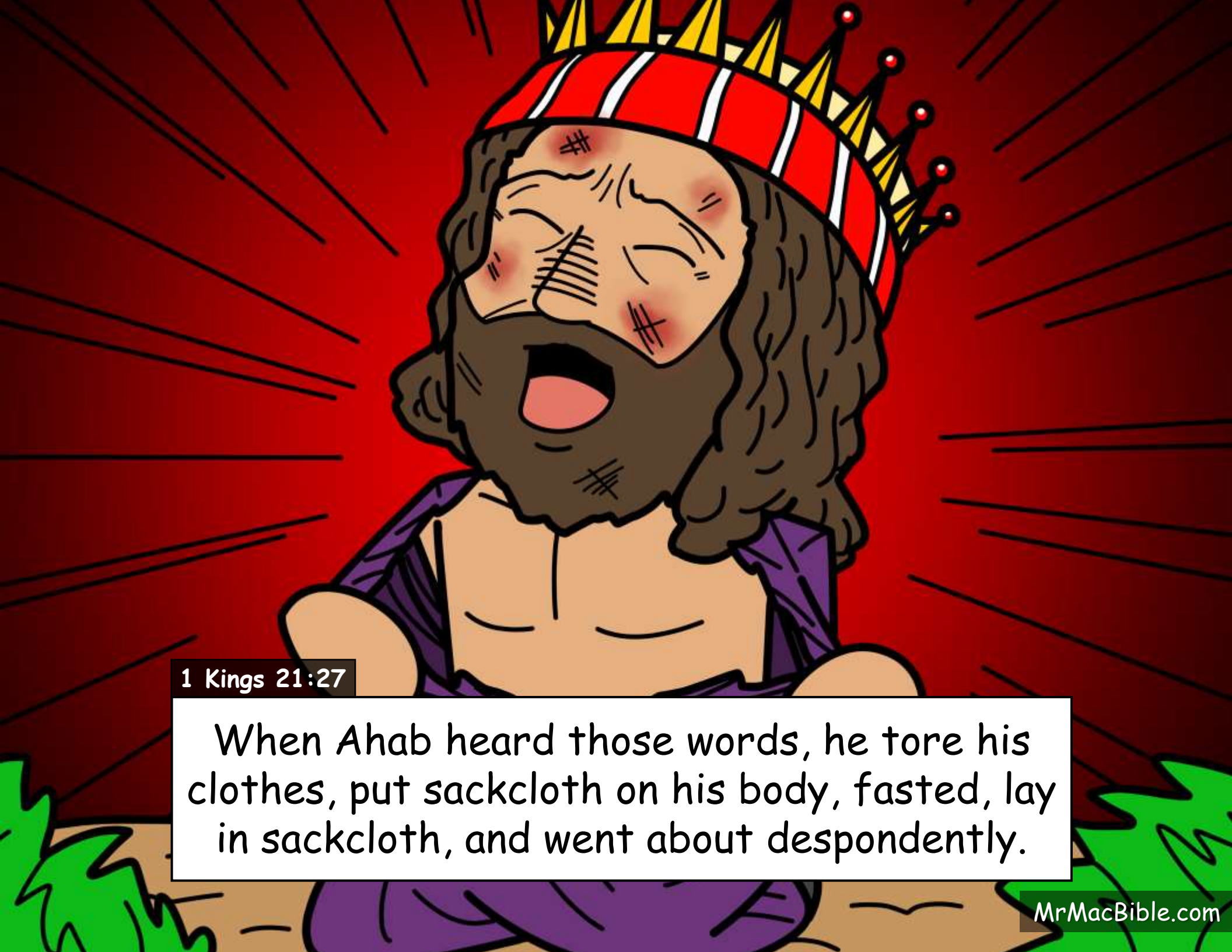

But there was no one like Ahab, who sold himself to do that which was evil in the LORD's sight, whom Jezebel his wife stirred up.

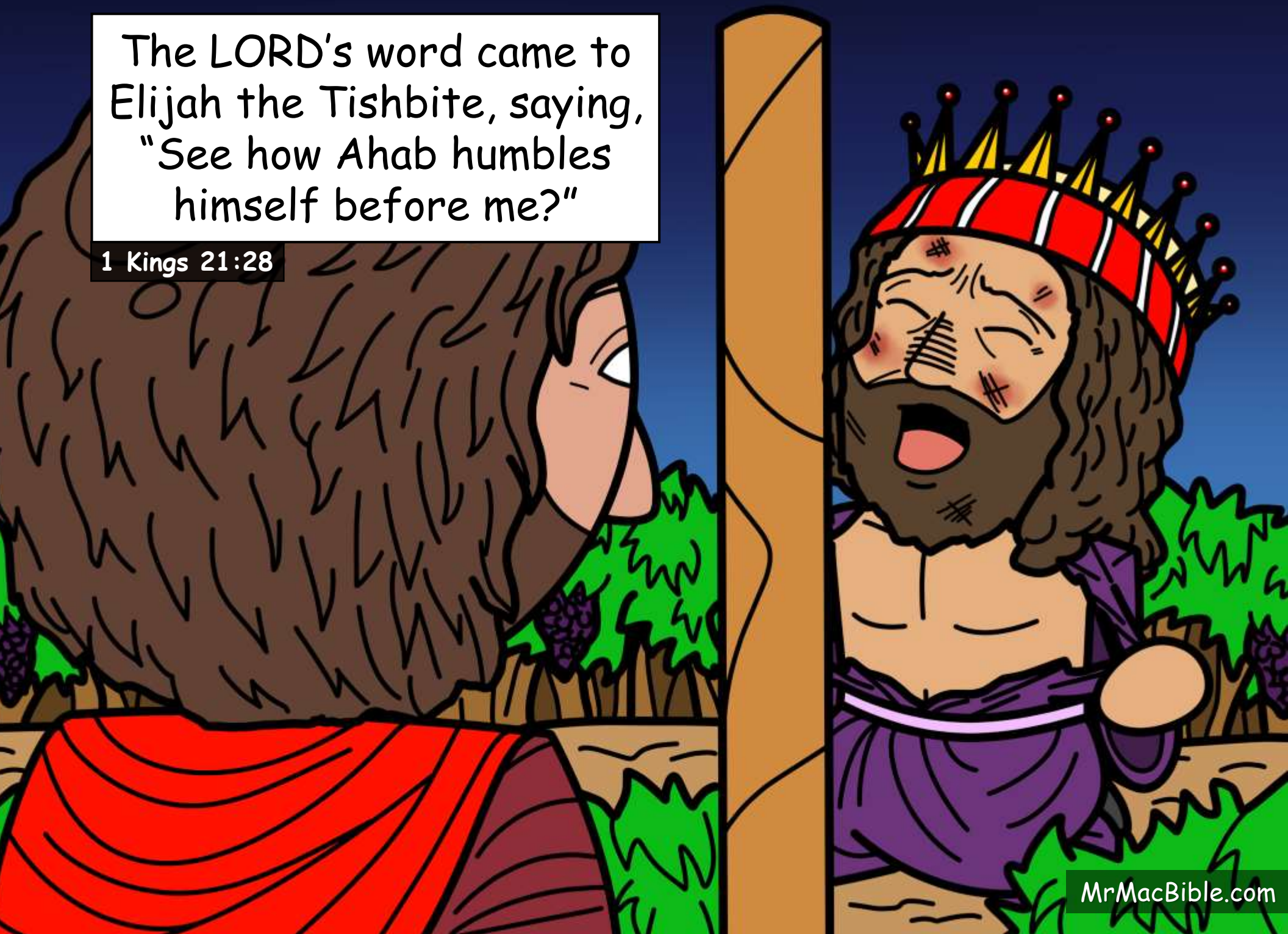
