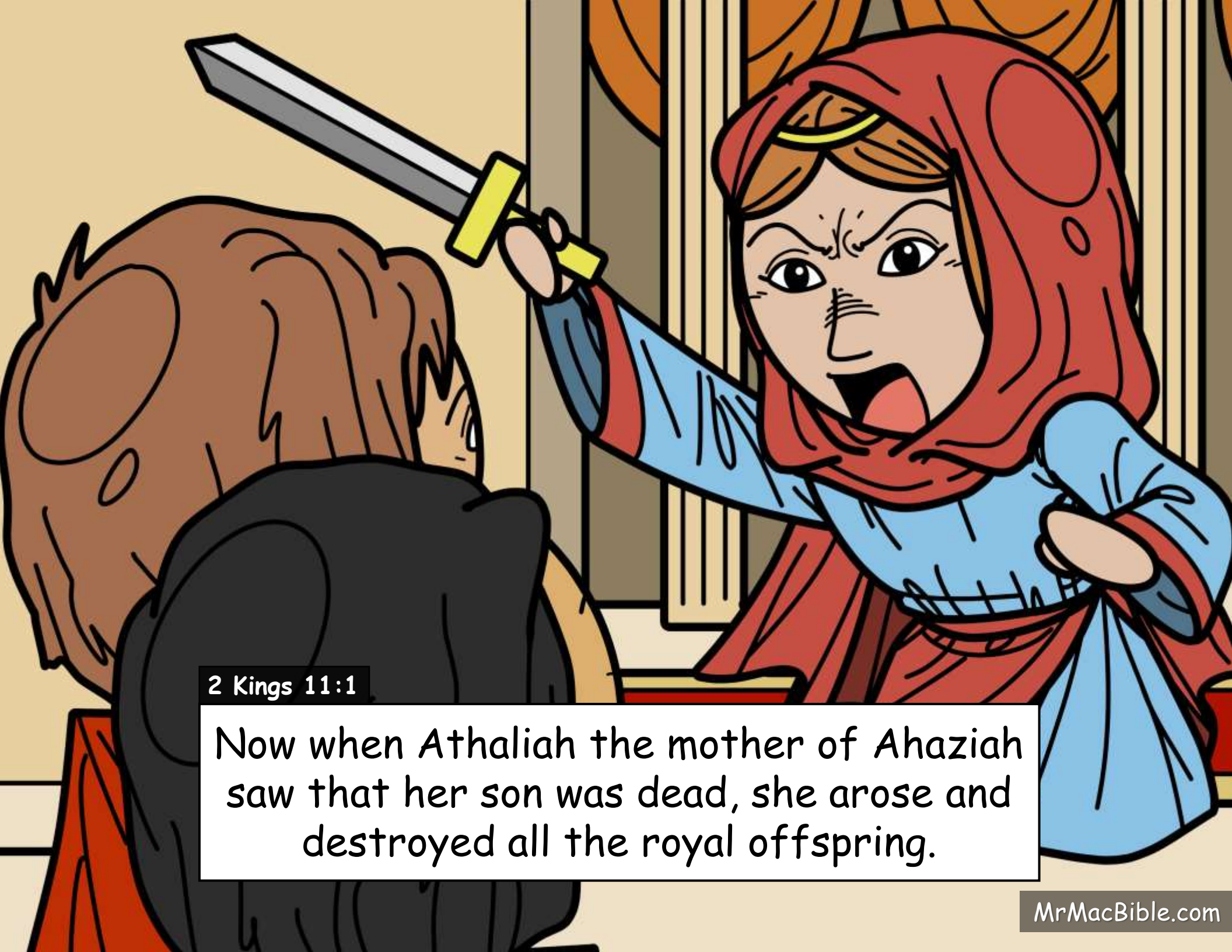

2 Kings 11:1...

2 Kings 11:2

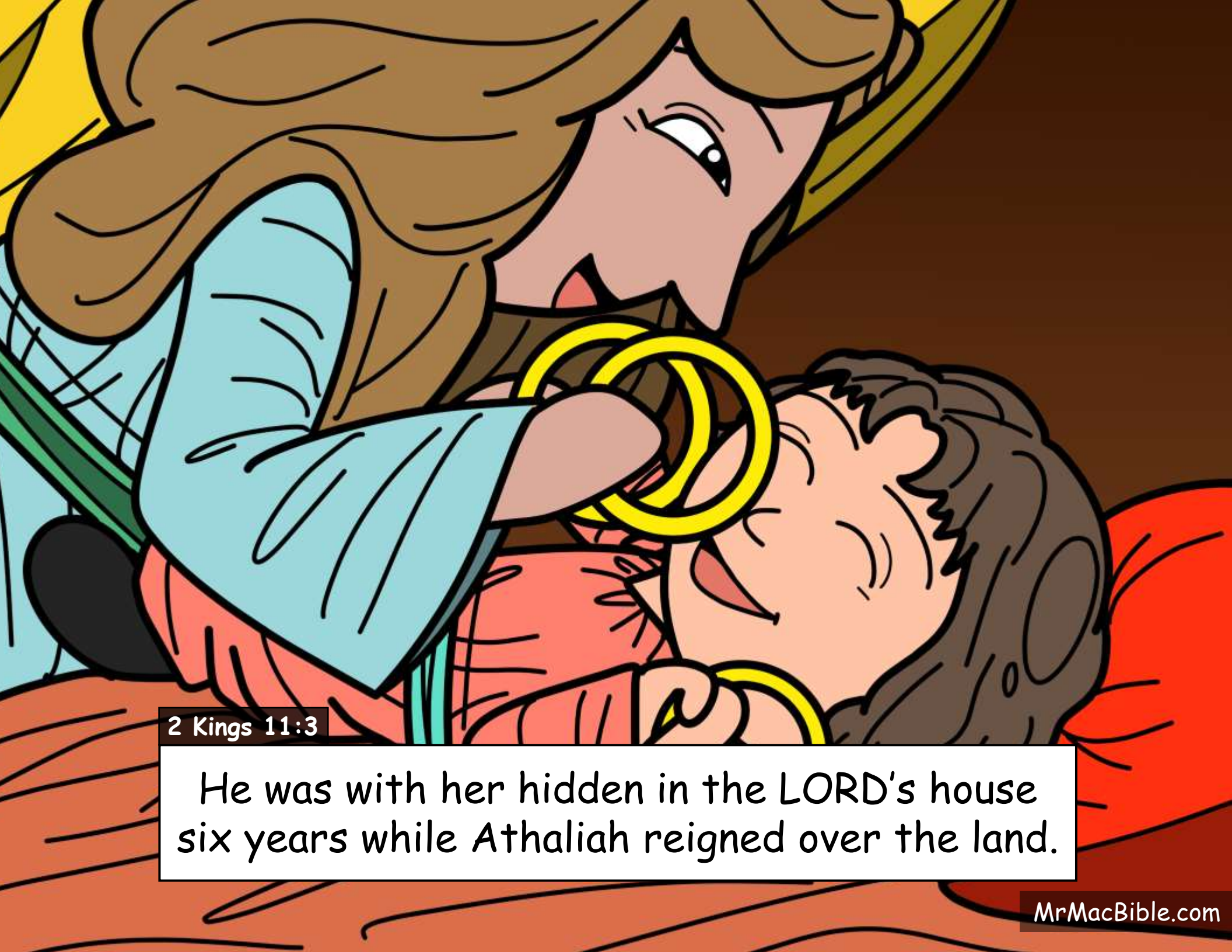

...[and took baby Joash] and his nurse, and put them in the bedroom; and they hid him from Athaliah, so that he was not slain.



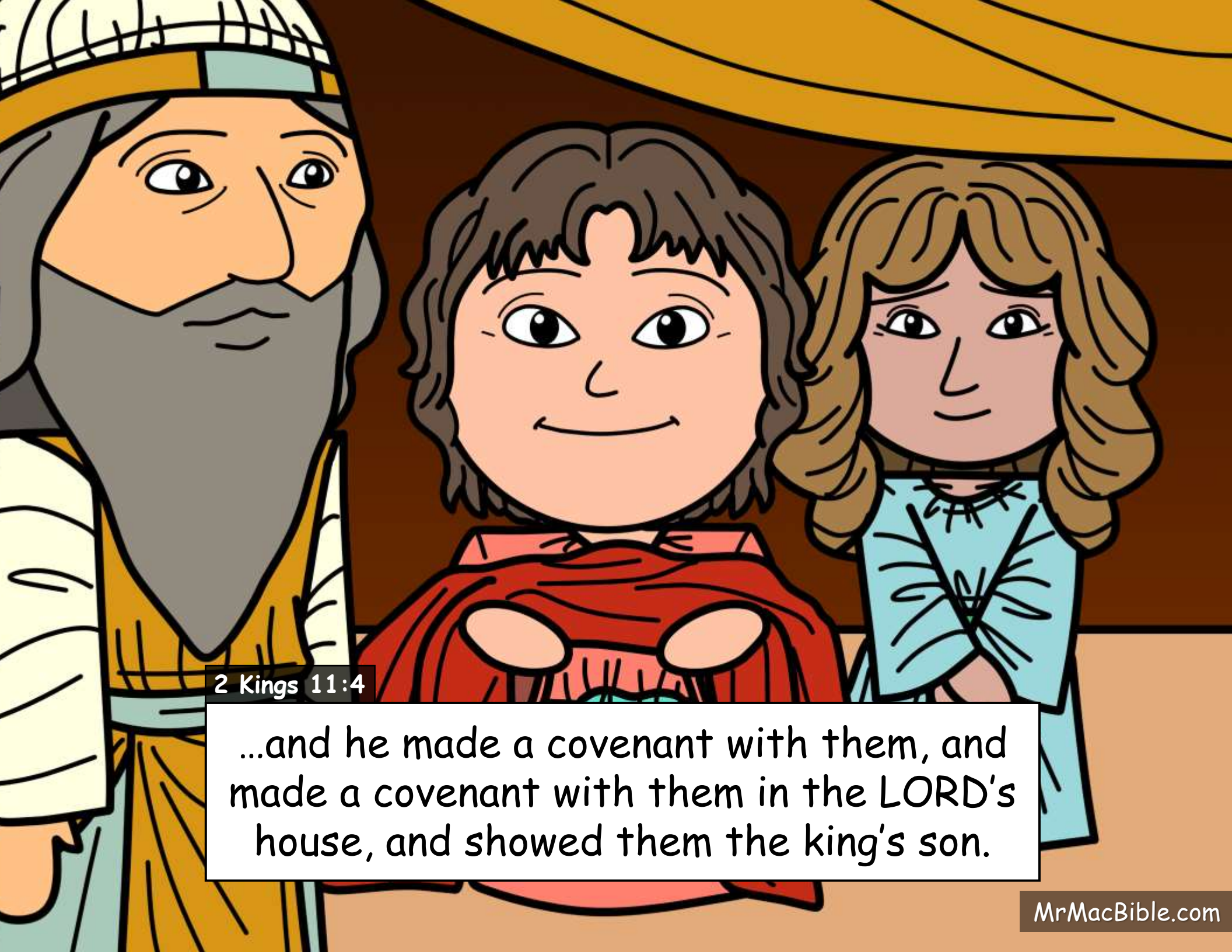
2 Kings 11:3

He was with her hidden in the LORD's house six years while Athaliah reigned over the land.

In the seventh year Jehoiada sent and fetched the captains over hundreds of the Carites and of the guard, and brought them to him into the LORD's house;

...and he made a covenant with them, and made a covenant with them in the LORD's house, and showed them the king's son.



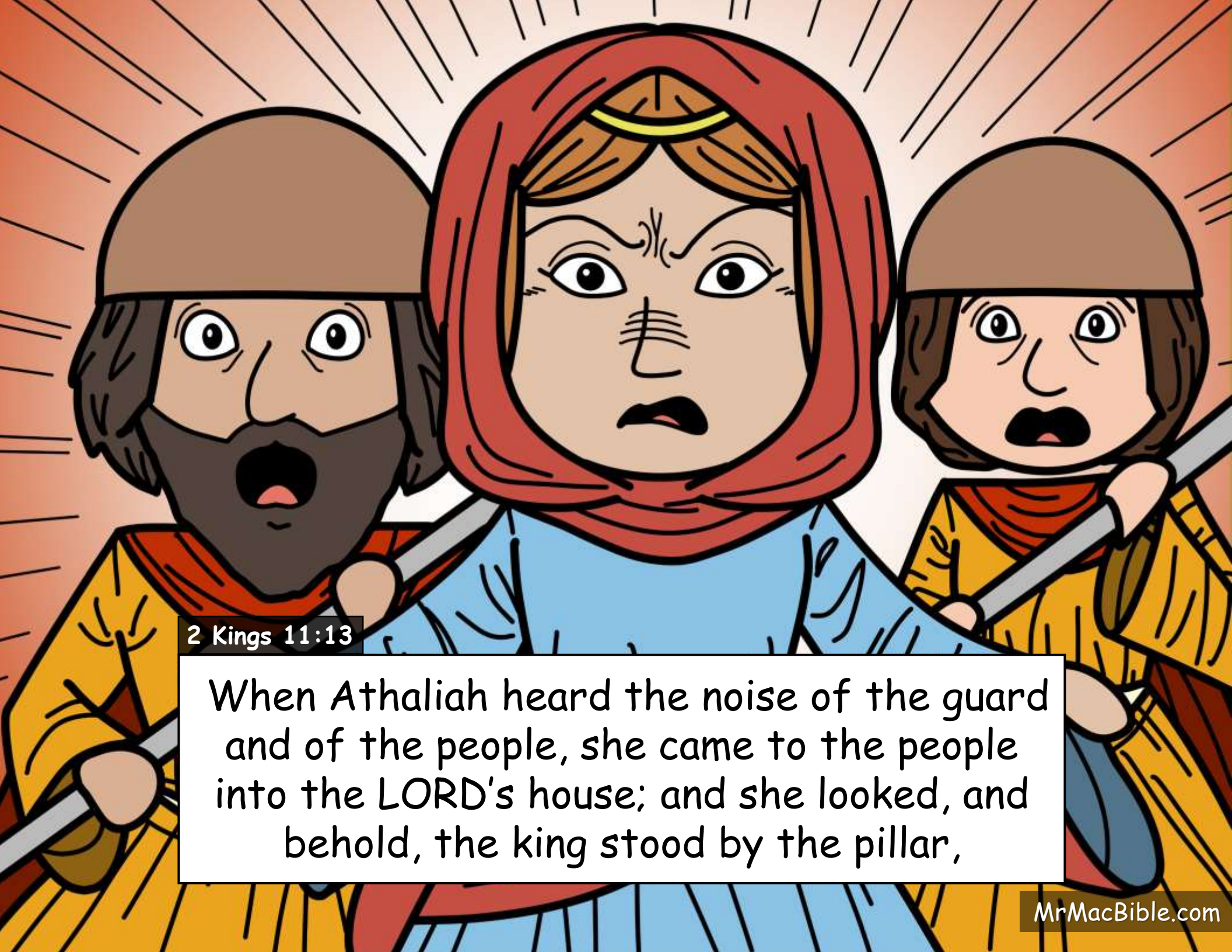
2 Kings 11:10

When Athaliah heard the noise of the guard and of the people, she came to the people into the LORD's house; and she looked, and behold, the king stood by the pillar,



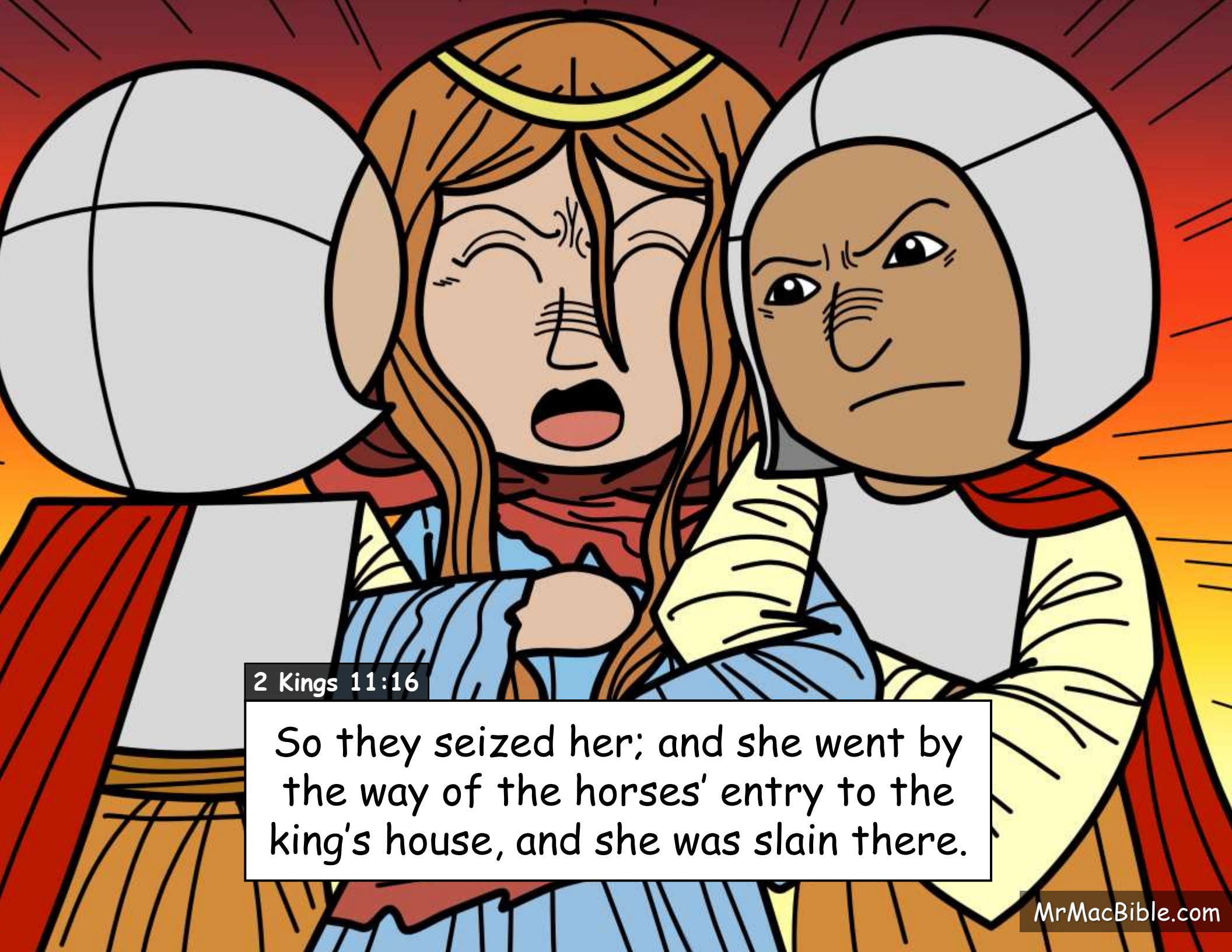
2 Kings 11:14

Jehoiada made a covenant between the LORD and the king and the people, that they should be the LORD's people; also between the king and the people.



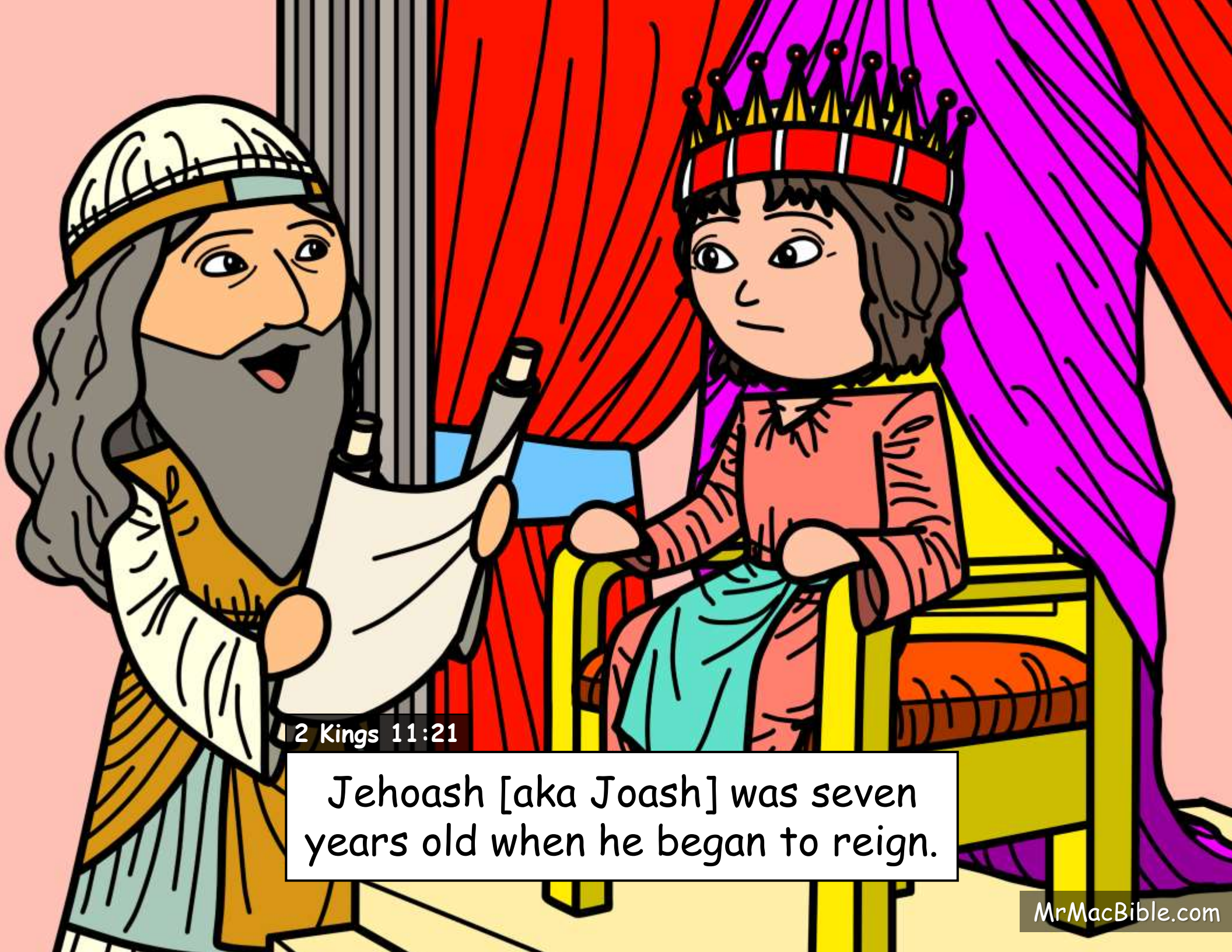

All the people of the land went to the house of Baal, and broke it down.



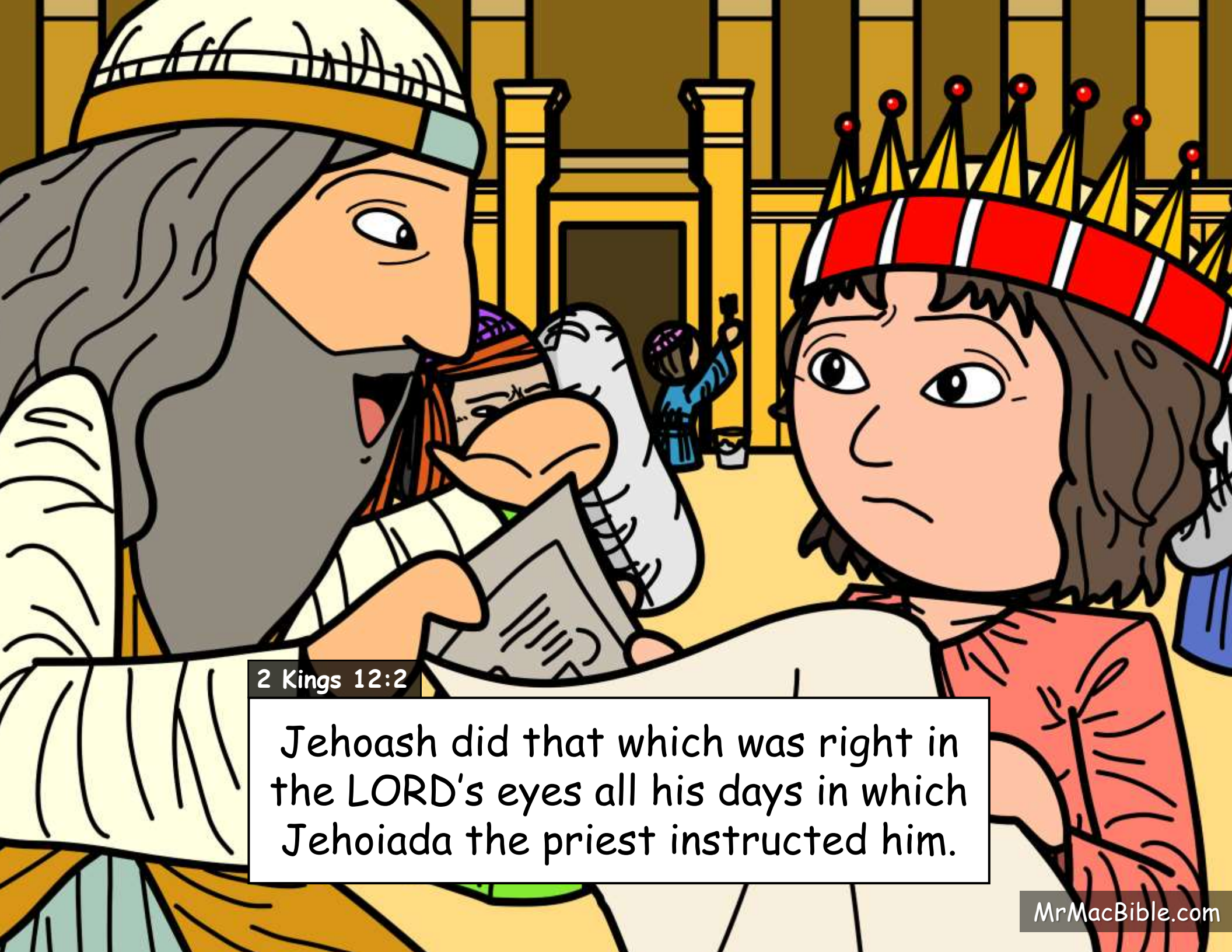

2 Kings 12:2

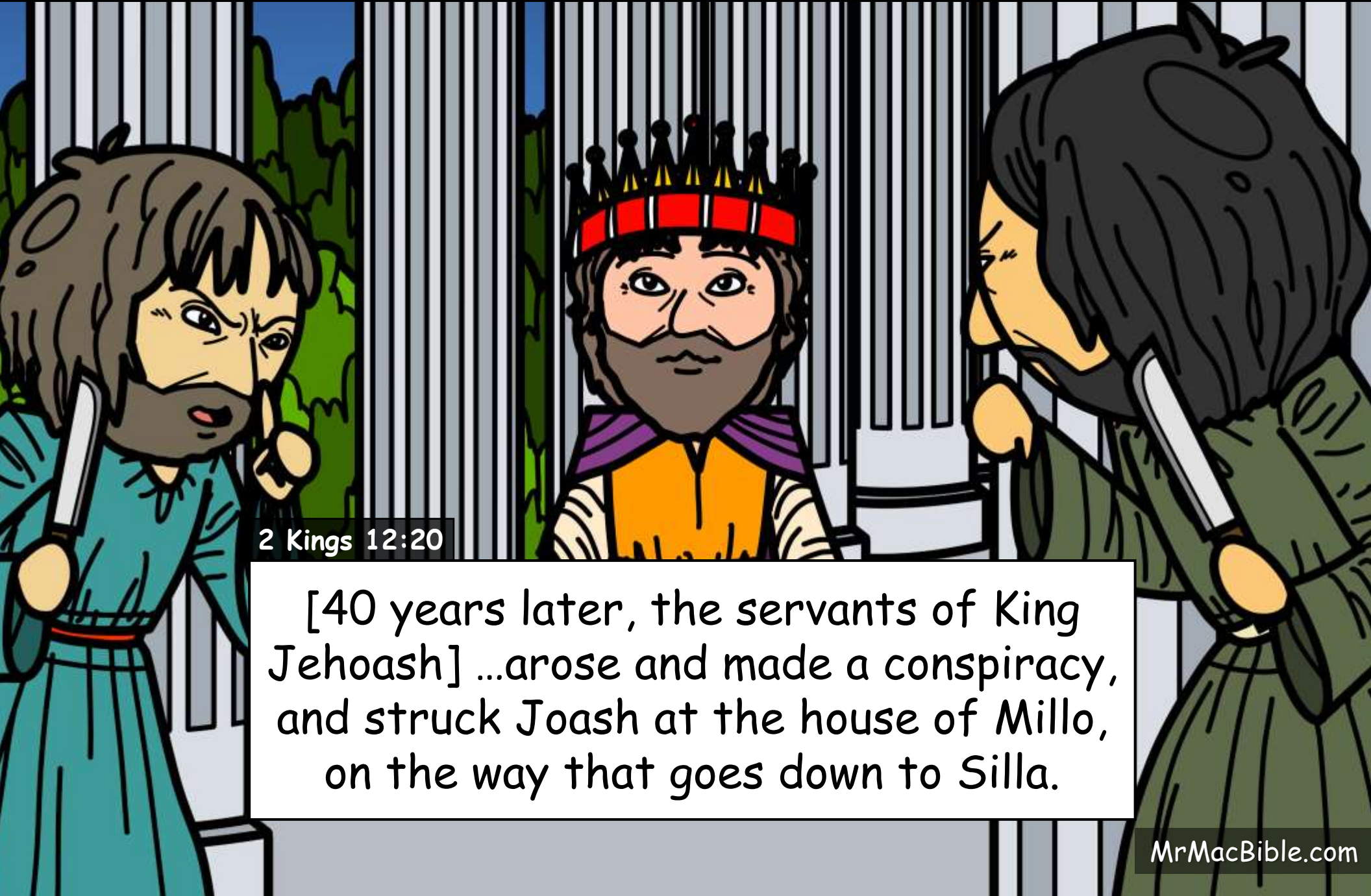
Jehoash did that which was right in the LORD's eyes all his days in which Jehoiada the priest instructed him.

Jehoash (aka Joash): The hidden baby king - good and faithful king (40 years) - killed by assassins!

↳ **Amaziah:** Good and faithful king for (29 years) killed by assassins!

↳ **Uzziah:** Good and faithful king (52 years) later gets leprosy!

↳ **Jotham:** Good and faithful king (16 years)

More Kings of Judah...

→ **Ahaz:** NOT a good and faithful king (16 years)
worshipped other gods ☹️

→ **Hezekiah:** Good and righteous king
(29 years) - he is the king of the southern
kingdom of Judah when the Assyrians
come and destroy the northern kingdom
of Israel (in Samaria)

→ **Manasseh:** Super-wicked king
(55 years) - who brings the evil Baal,
Asherah, and Moloch worship back to
Judah (but late in life Manasseh turns
to the Lord - see 2nd Chronicles 33:11).

2 Kings 18:1

[80 years after King Jehoash was assassinated] Hezekiah the son of Ahaz king of Judah began to reign [in the southern kingdom].



2 Kings 18:3

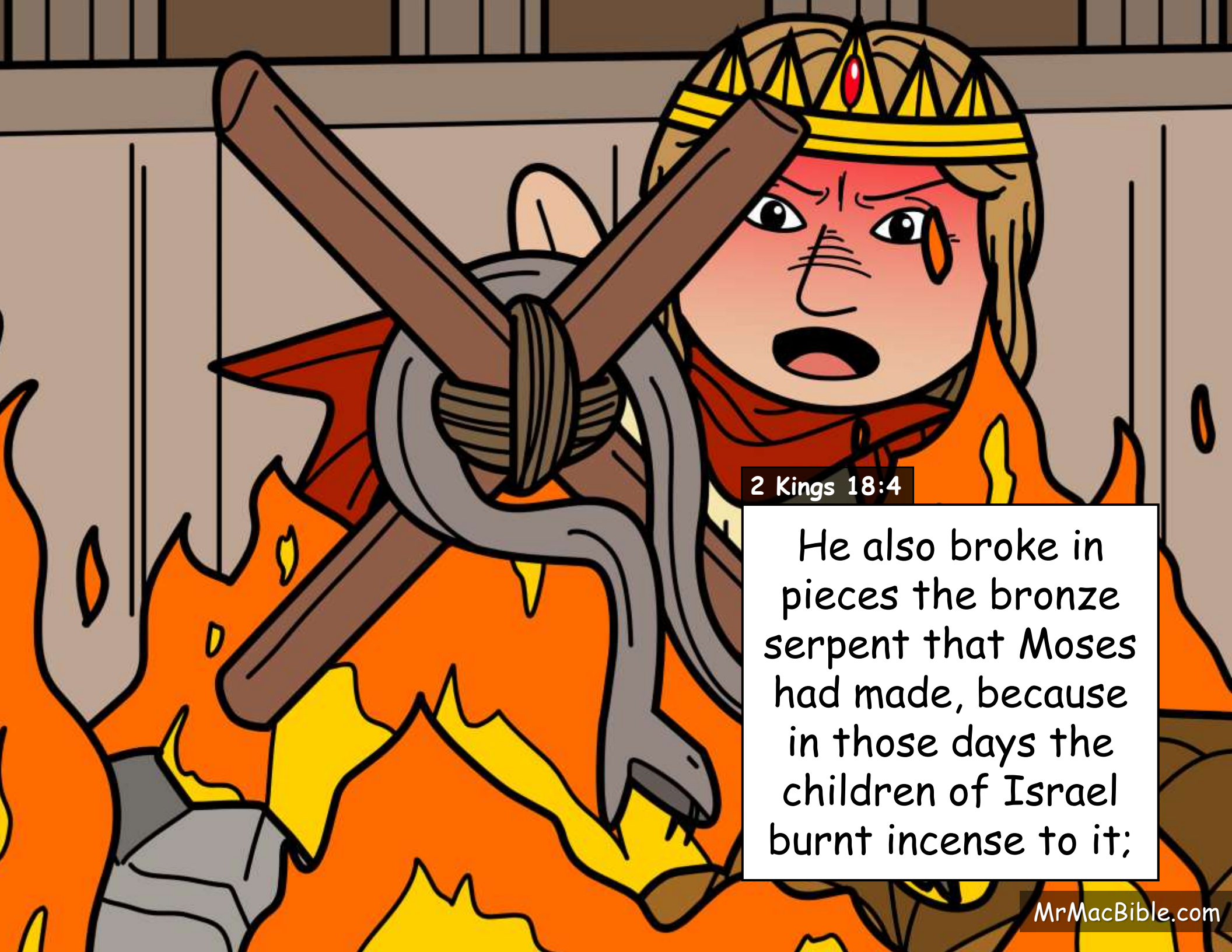
[King Hezekiah] did that which was right in the LORD's eyes, according to all that David his father had done.

King Hezekiah destroys the idols

He removed the high places, broke the pillars, and cut down the Asherah.



2 Kings 18:4

He also broke in pieces the bronze serpent that Moses had made, because in those days the children of Israel burnt incense to it;

He trusted in the LORD,
the God of Israel, so that
after him was no one like
him amongst all the kings of
Judah, nor amongst them
that were before him.

back the Philistines!



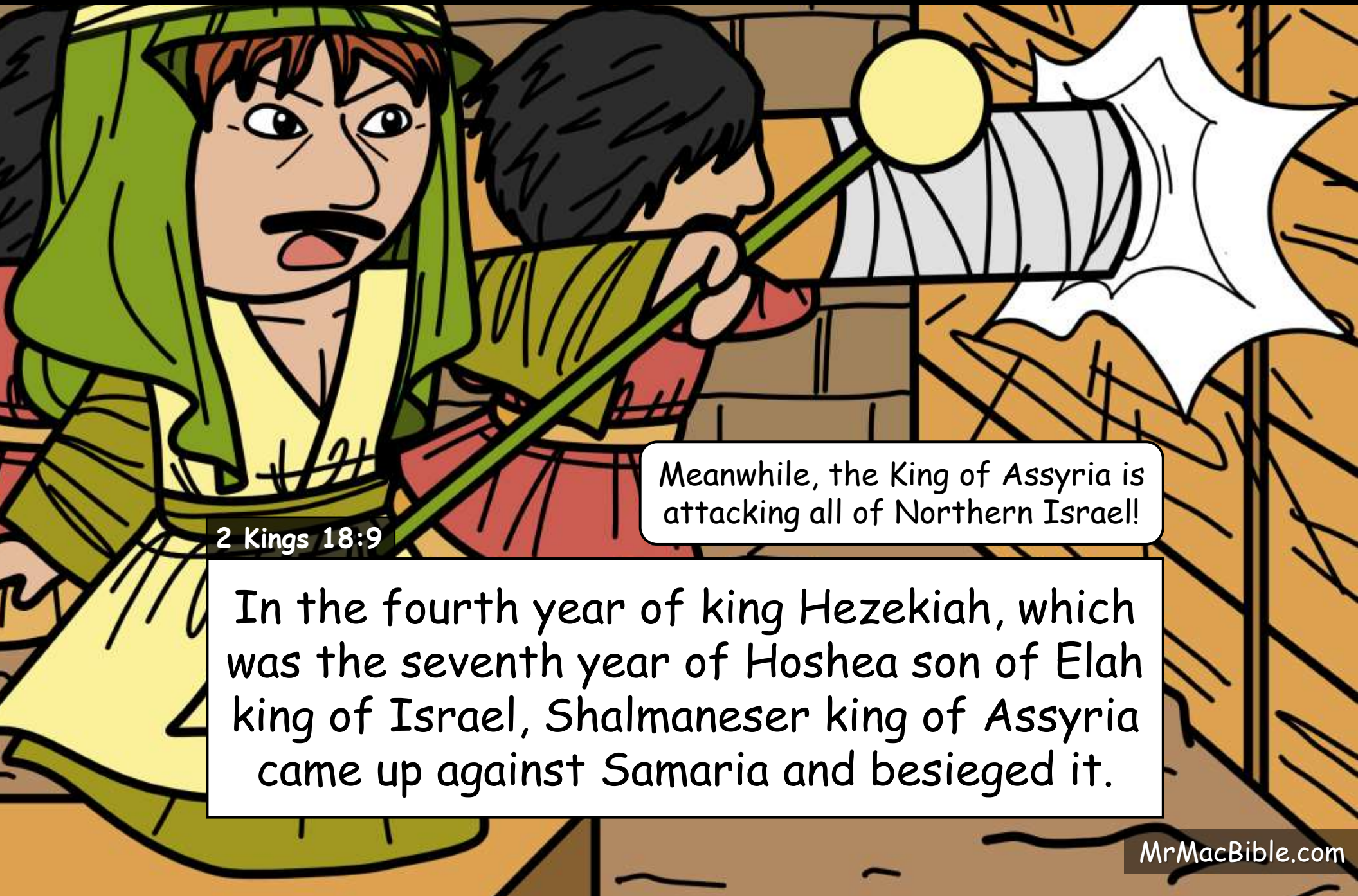

In the fourth year of king Hezekiah, which was the seventh year of Hoshea son of Elah king of Israel, Shalmaneser king of Assyria came up against Samaria and besieged it.

The Northern Kingdom is taken away!

2 Kings 18:11-12

The king of Assyria carried Israel away to Assyria, ... because they didn't obey the LORD their God's voice, but transgressed his covenant, even all that Moses the servant of the LORD commanded, and would not hear it or do it.

10 years later... Assyria attacks Judah!

Now in the fourteenth year of king Hezekiah, Sennacherib king of Assyria came up against all the fortified cities of Judah and took them.



The armies of the King of Assyria
attack Southern Israel (Judah)!

The king of Assyria sent Tartan, Rabsaris,
and Rabshakeh from Lachish to king
Hezekiah with a great army to Jerusalem.

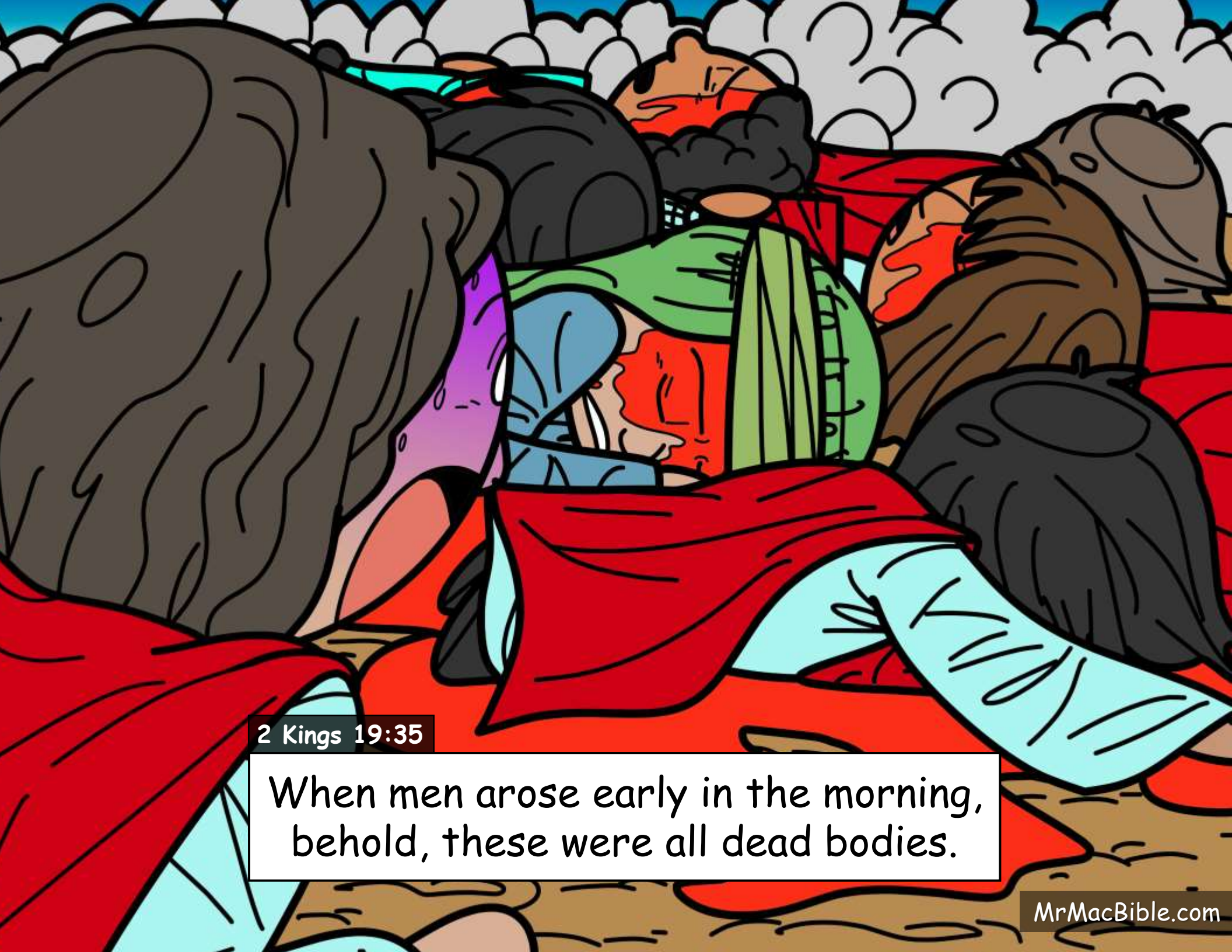

2 Kings 20:1

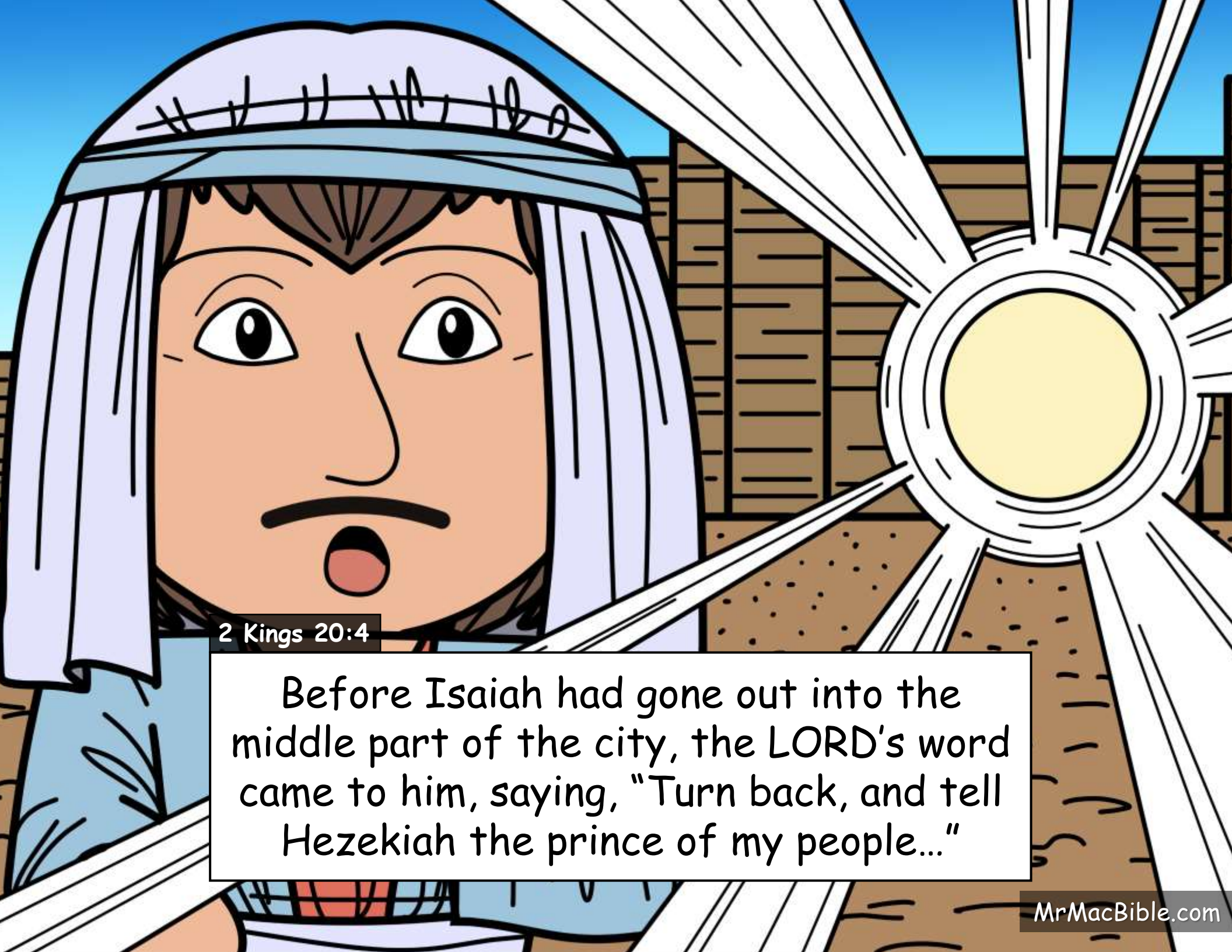

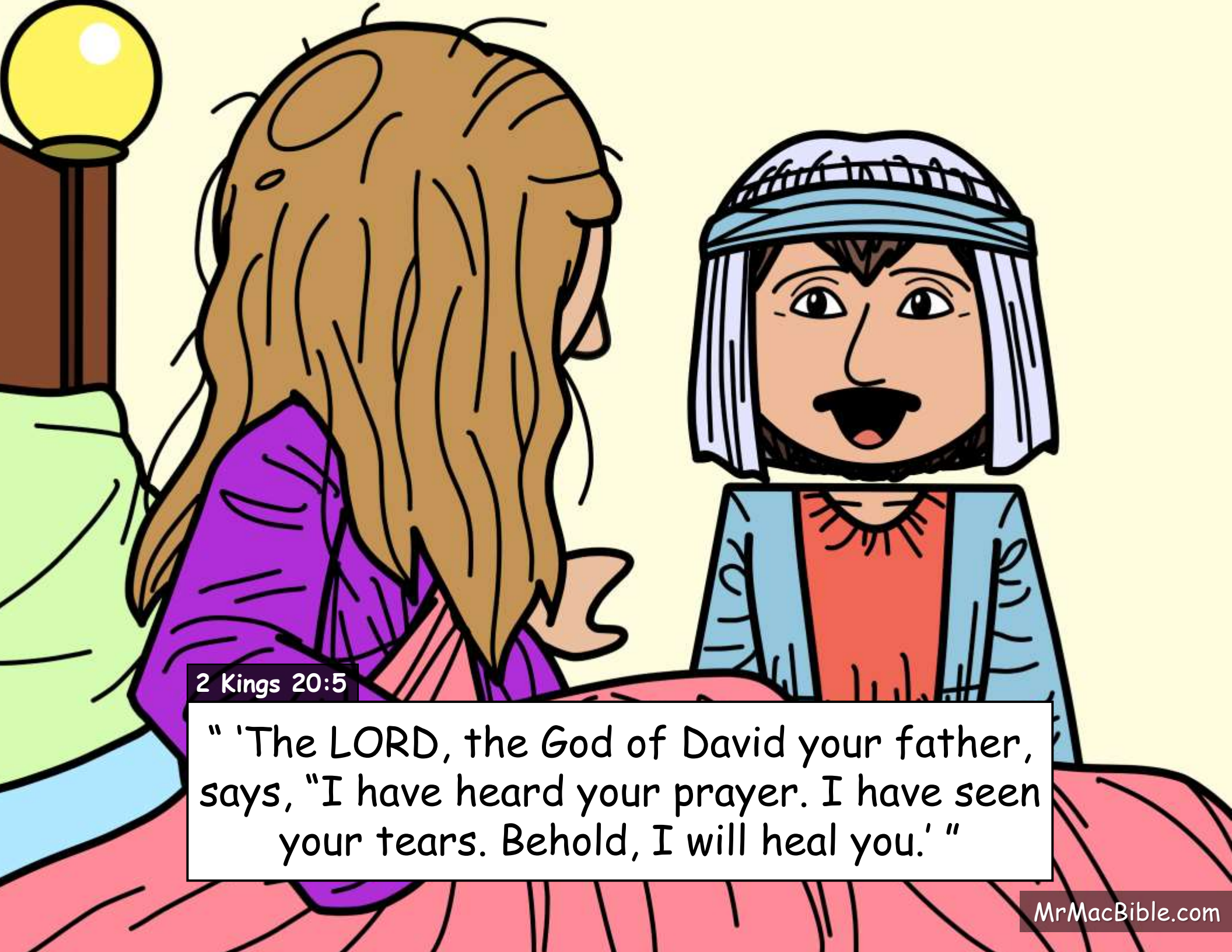
2 Kings 20:2

"...and have done that which is good in your sight." And Hezekiah wept bitterly.



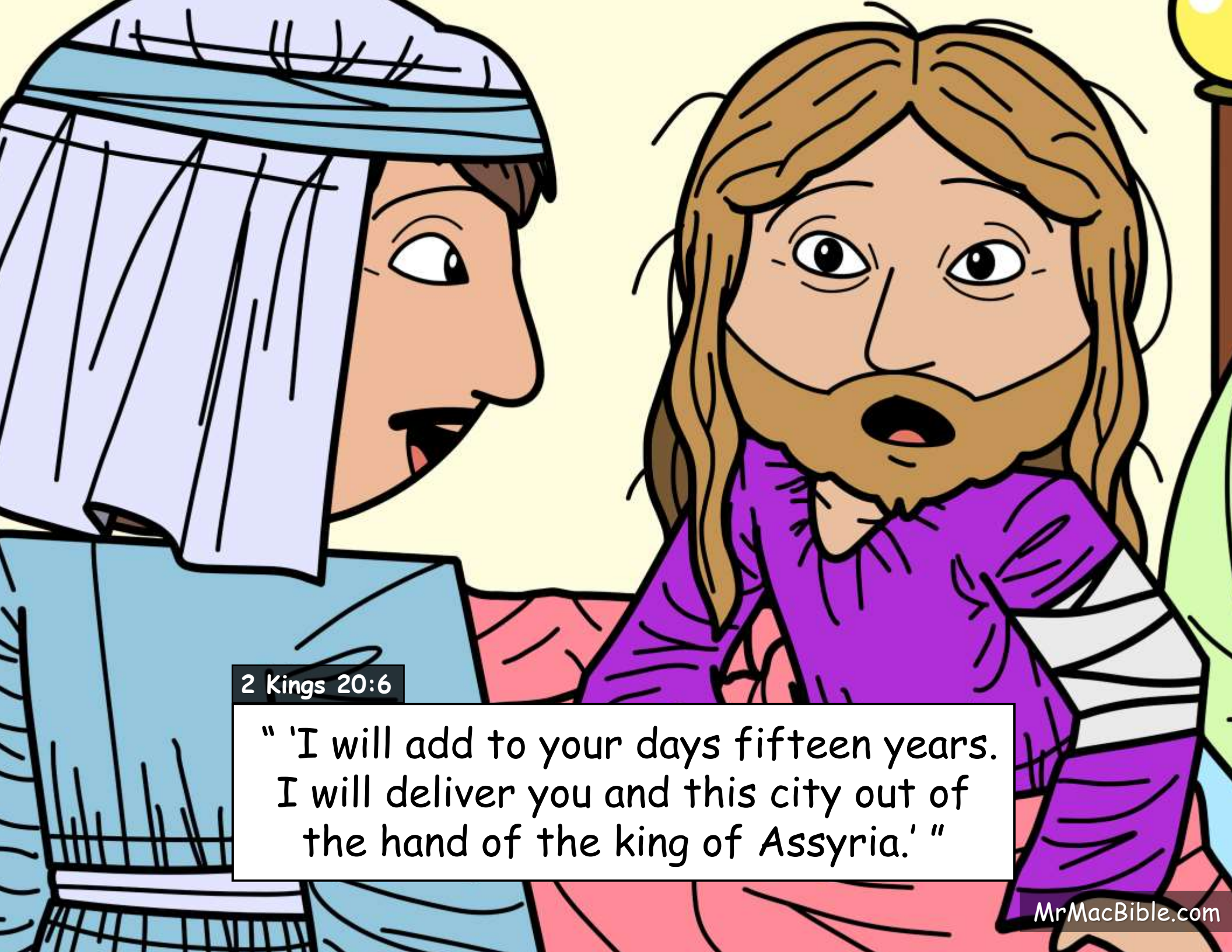
2 Kings 20:4

" 'The LORD, the God of David your father, says, "I have heard your prayer. I have seen your tears. Behold, I will heal you.' "



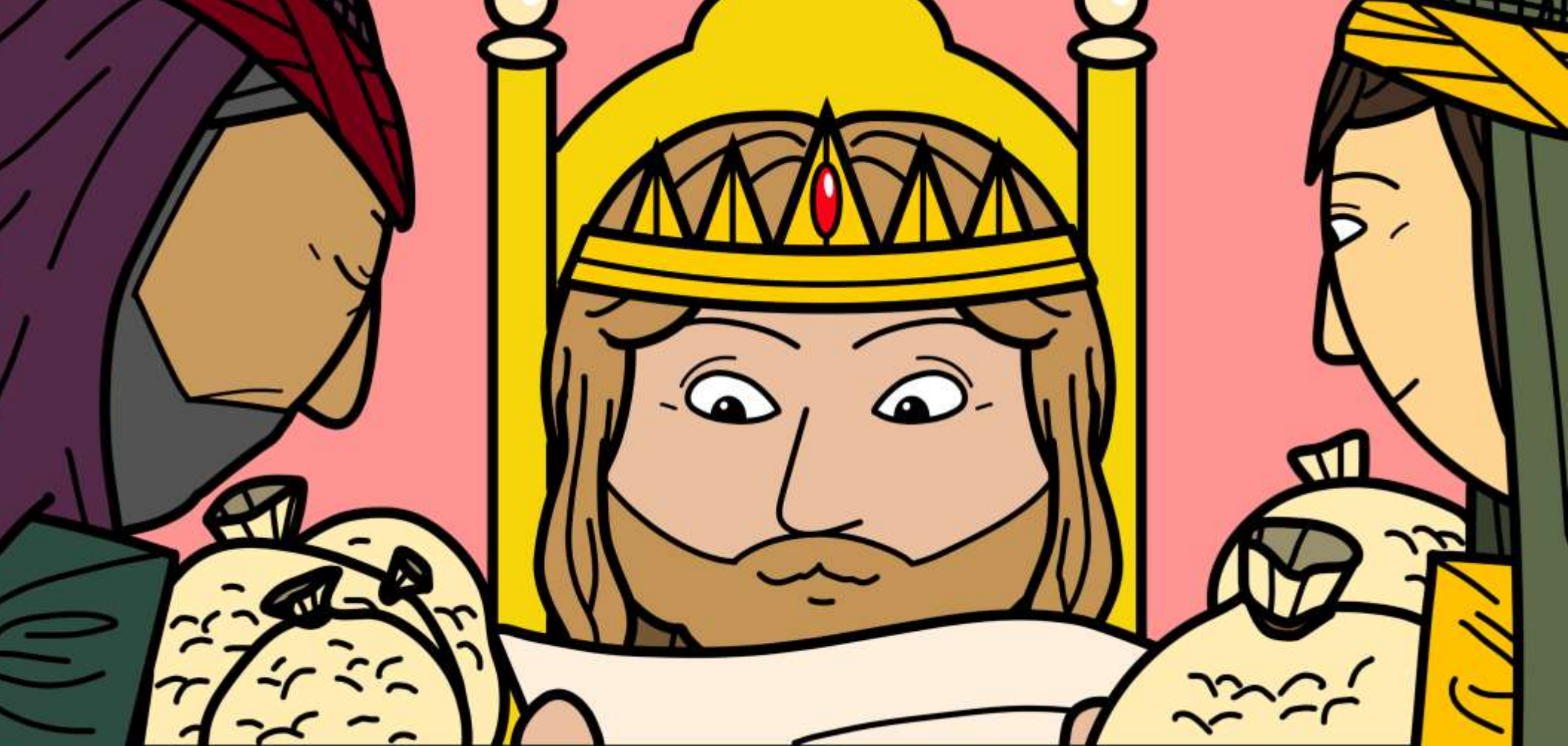
2 Kings 20:6

2 Kings 20:12

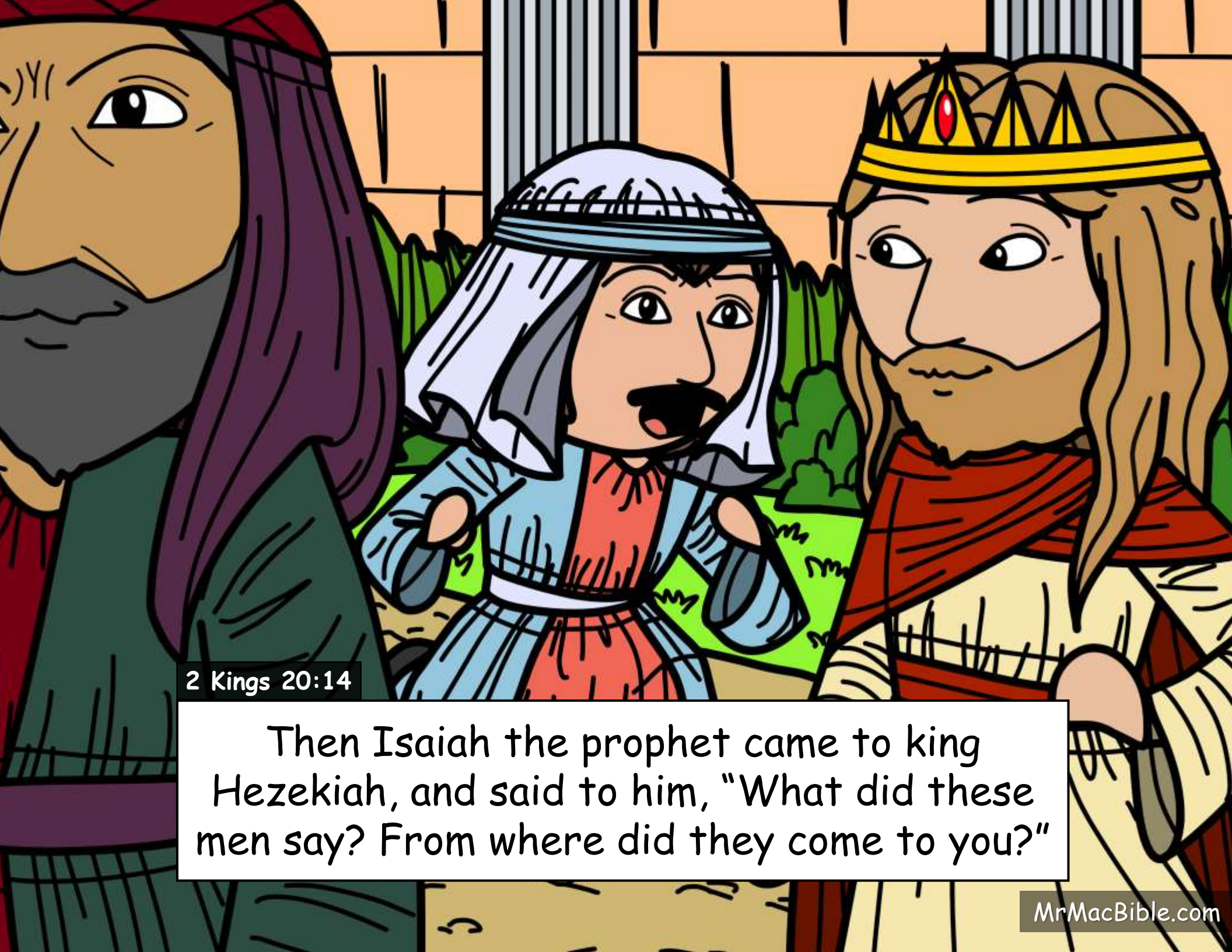
At that time Berodach Baladan the son of Baladan, king of Babylon, sent letters and a present to Hezekiah, for he had heard that Hezekiah had been sick.

Babylon will attack Jerusalem!

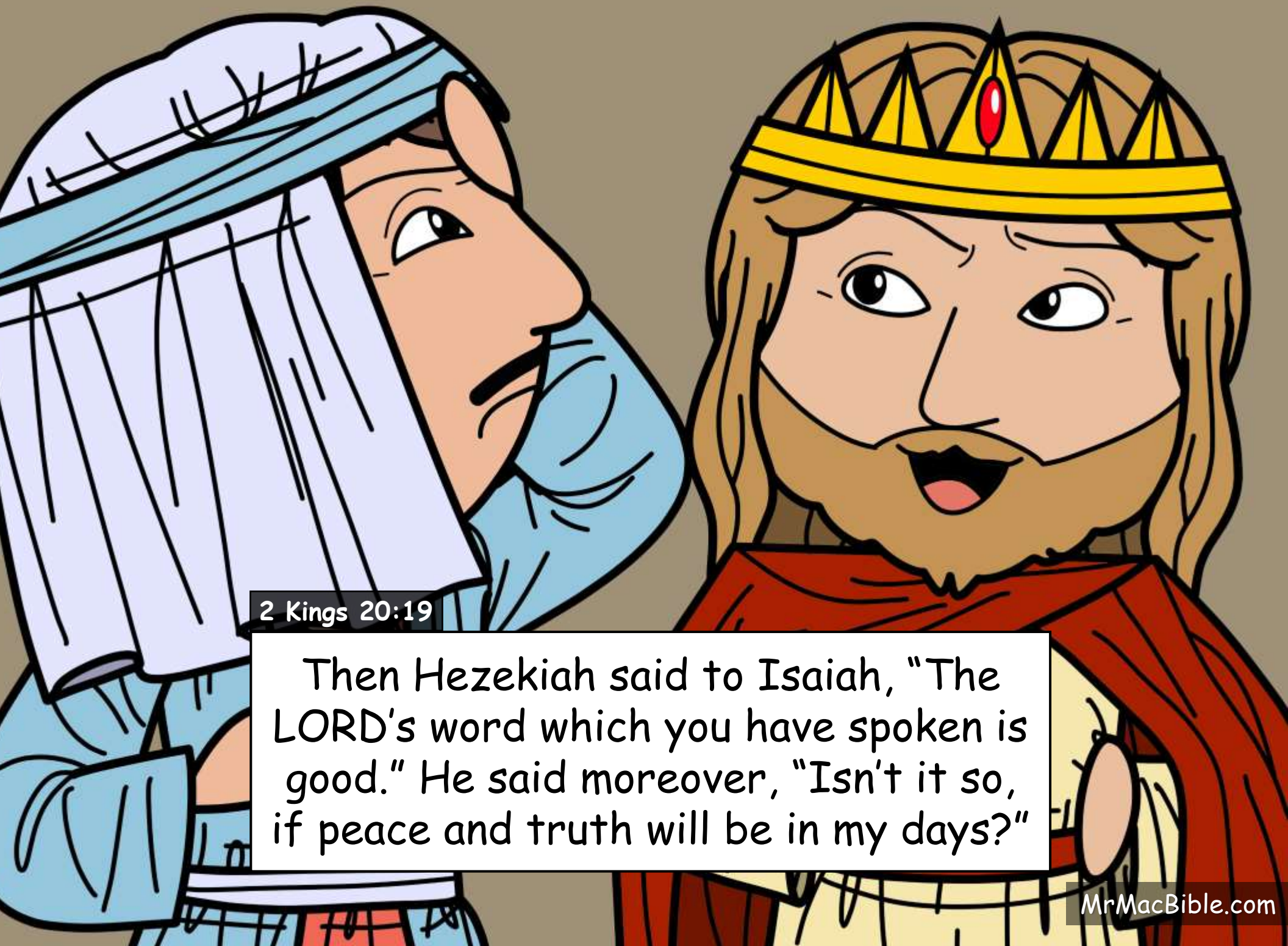
2 Kings 20:16-17

Manasseh was twelve years old when he began to reign, and he reigned fifty-five years in Jerusalem.



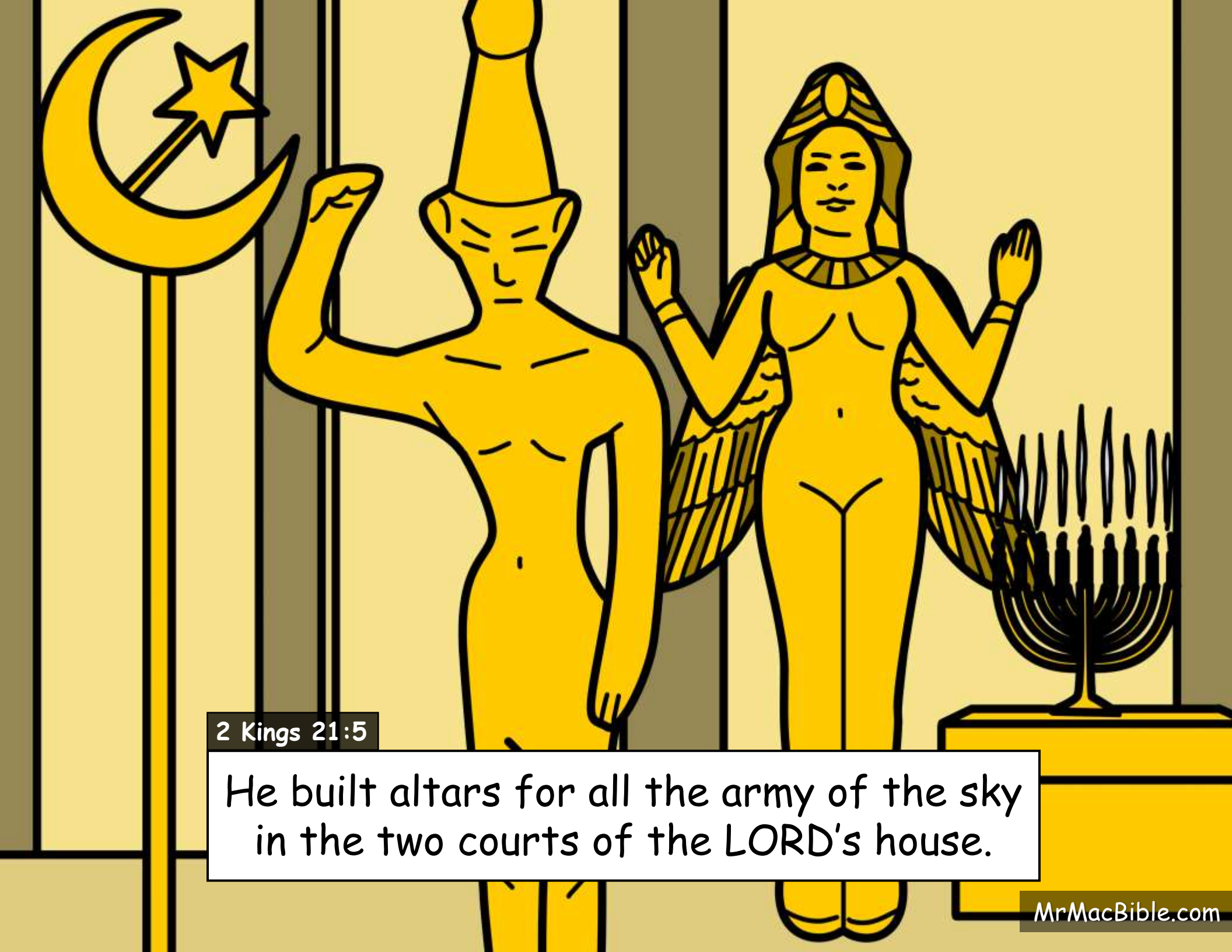
2 Kings 21:2

in the two courts of the LORD's house.



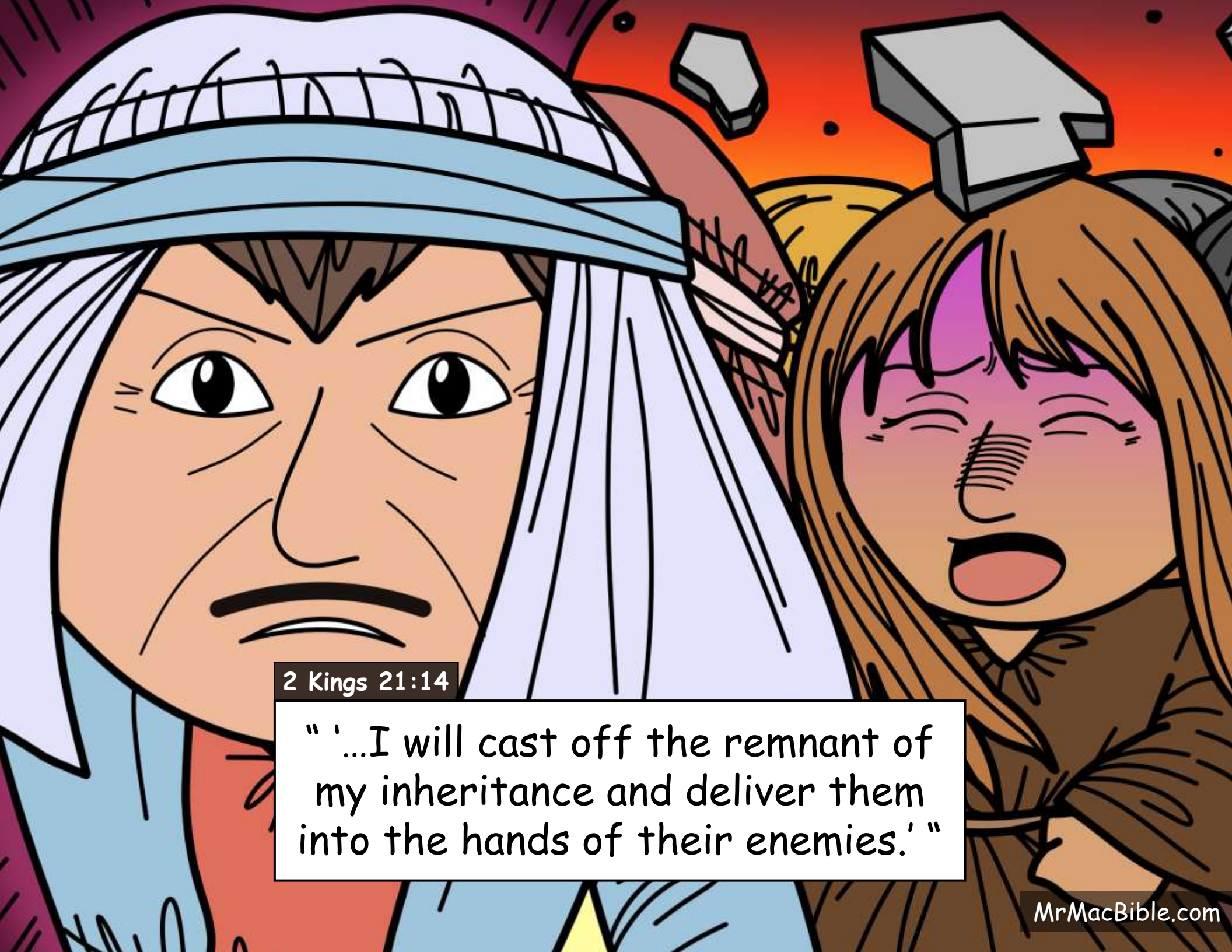
2 Kings 21:6

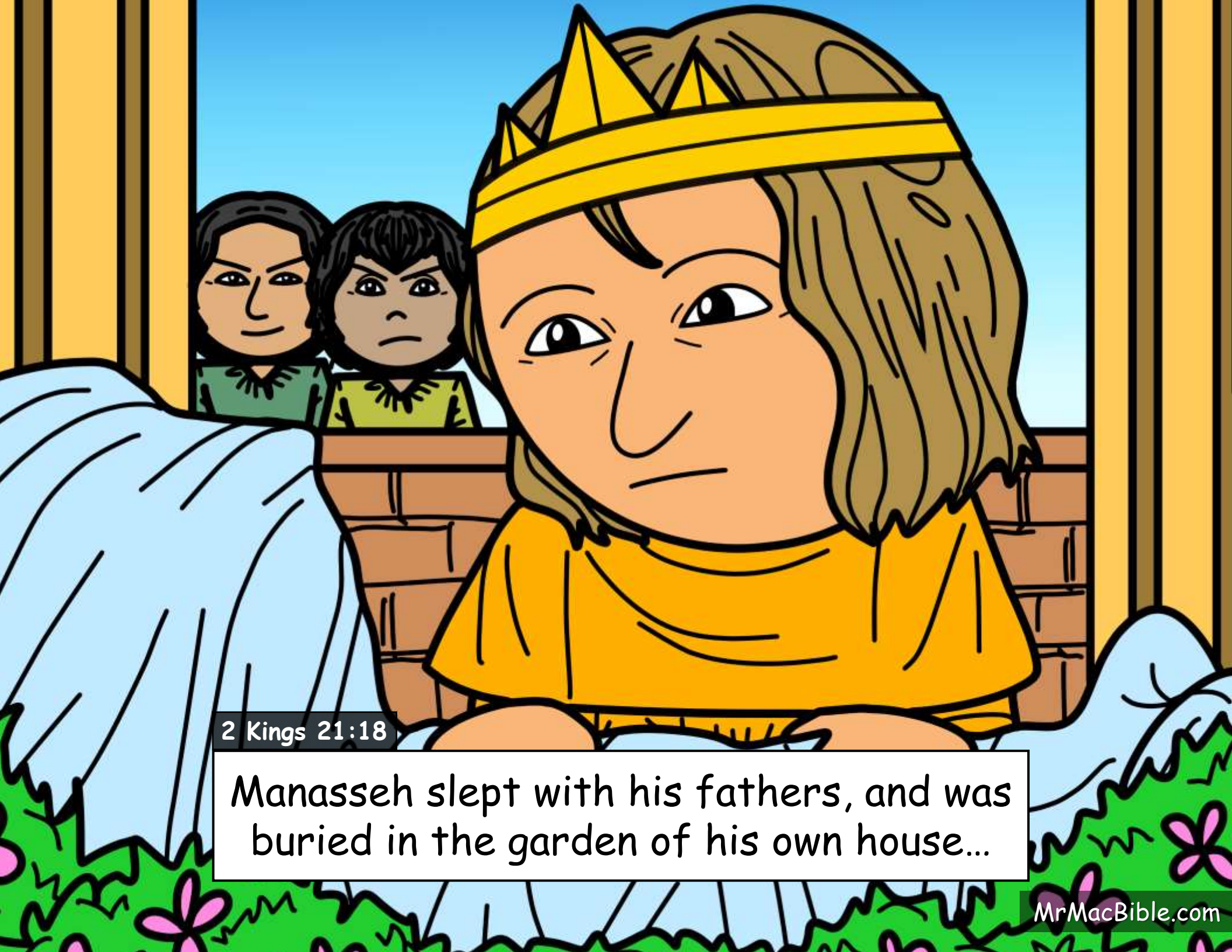
2 Kings 21:14

2 Kings 22:2

He [King Josiah] did that which was right in the LORD's eyes, and walked in all the way of David his father, and didn't turn away to the right hand or to the left.



2 Kings 23:6

He [King Josiah] brought out the Asherah from the LORD's house, outside of Jerusalem, to the brook Kidron, and burnt it at the brook Kidron, and beat it to dust...



2 Kings 23:7

He broke down the houses of the male shrine prostitutes that were in the LORD's house, where the women wove hangings for the Asherah.



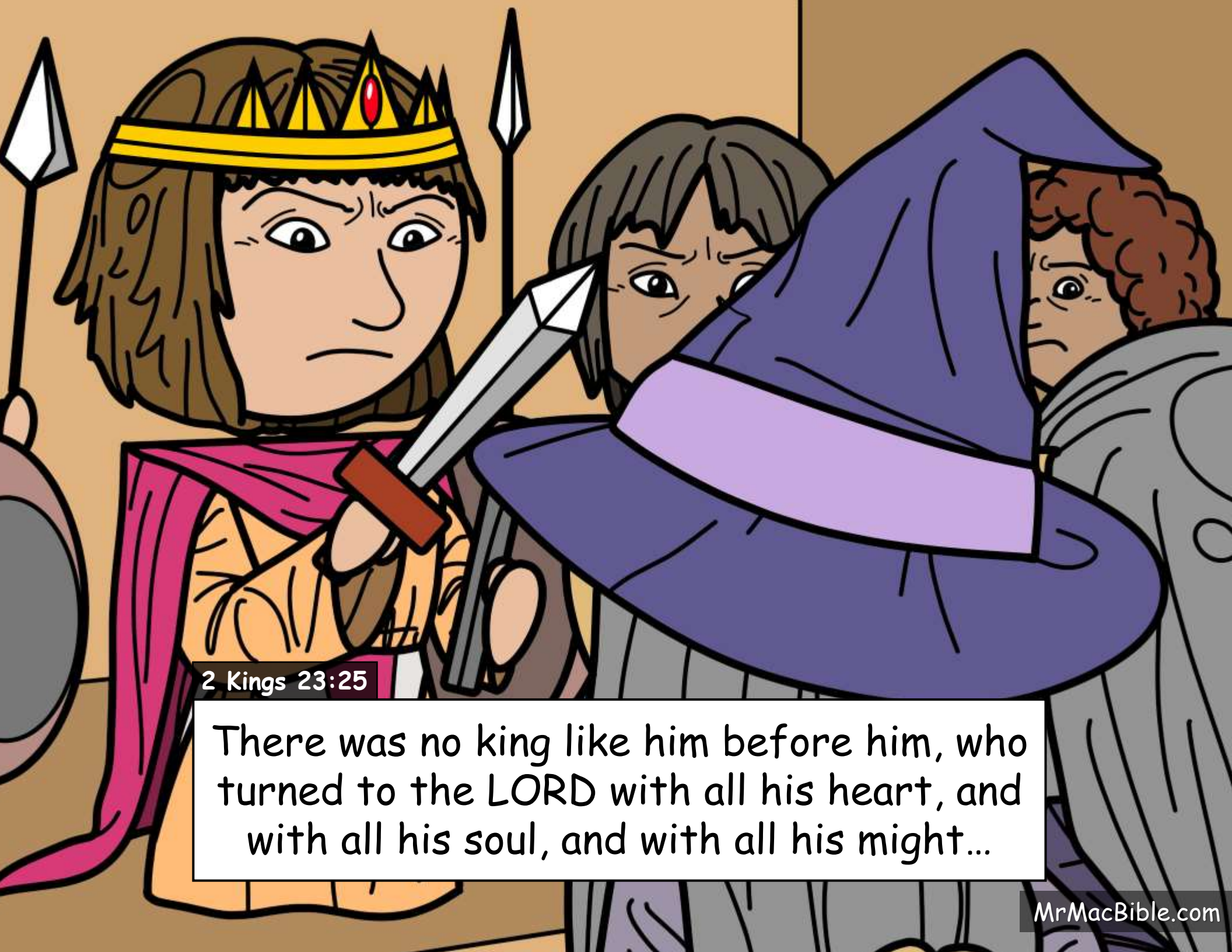
2 Kings 23:10

In his days Pharaoh Necho king of Egypt went up against the king of Assyria to the river Euphrates; and king Josiah went against him...




2 Kings 23:29

His servants carried him dead in a chariot from Megiddo, brought him to Jerusalem, and buried him in his own tomb.



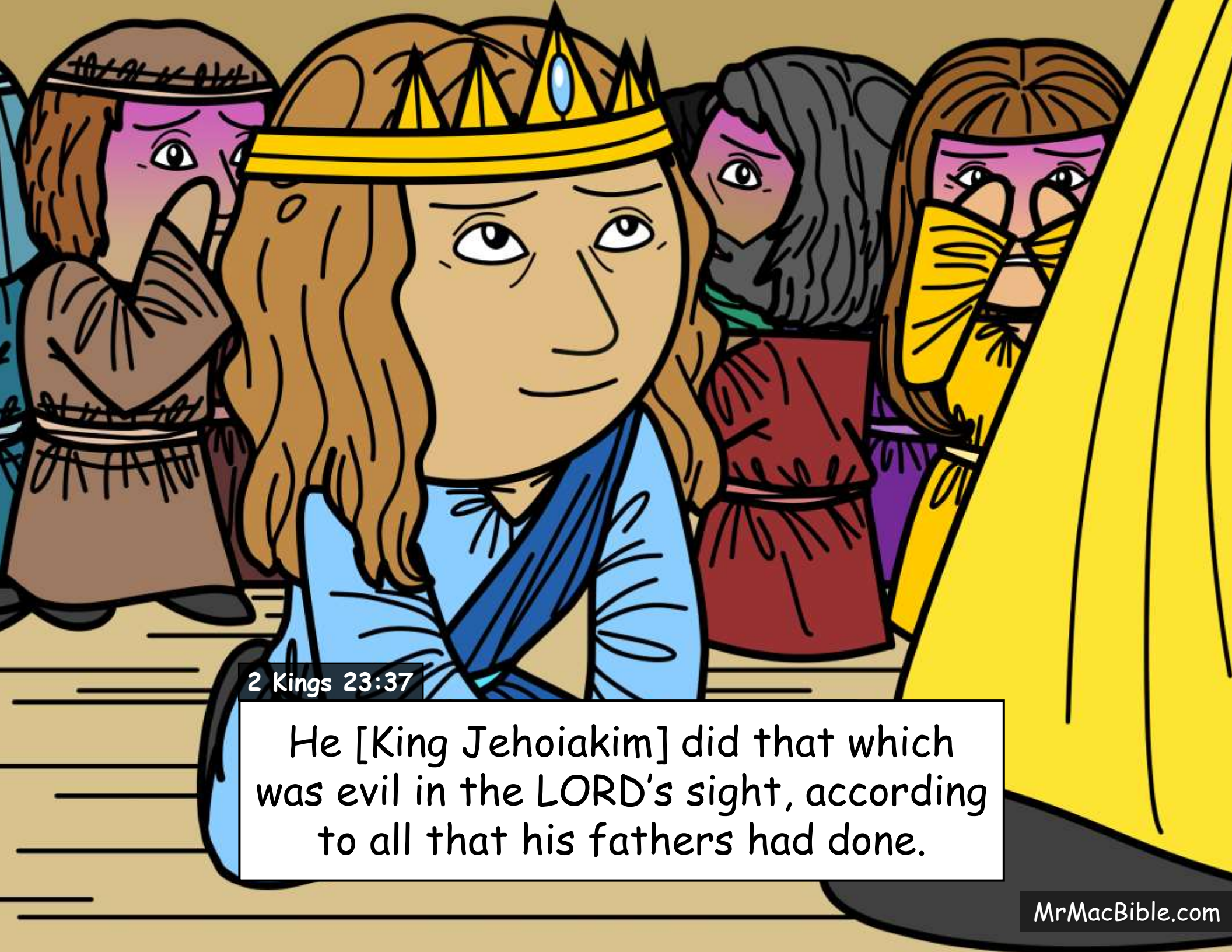
2 Kings 23:34

Then he [King Jehoiakim] turned and rebelled against him [Nebuchadnezzar].



Babylon attacks Jerusalem!!

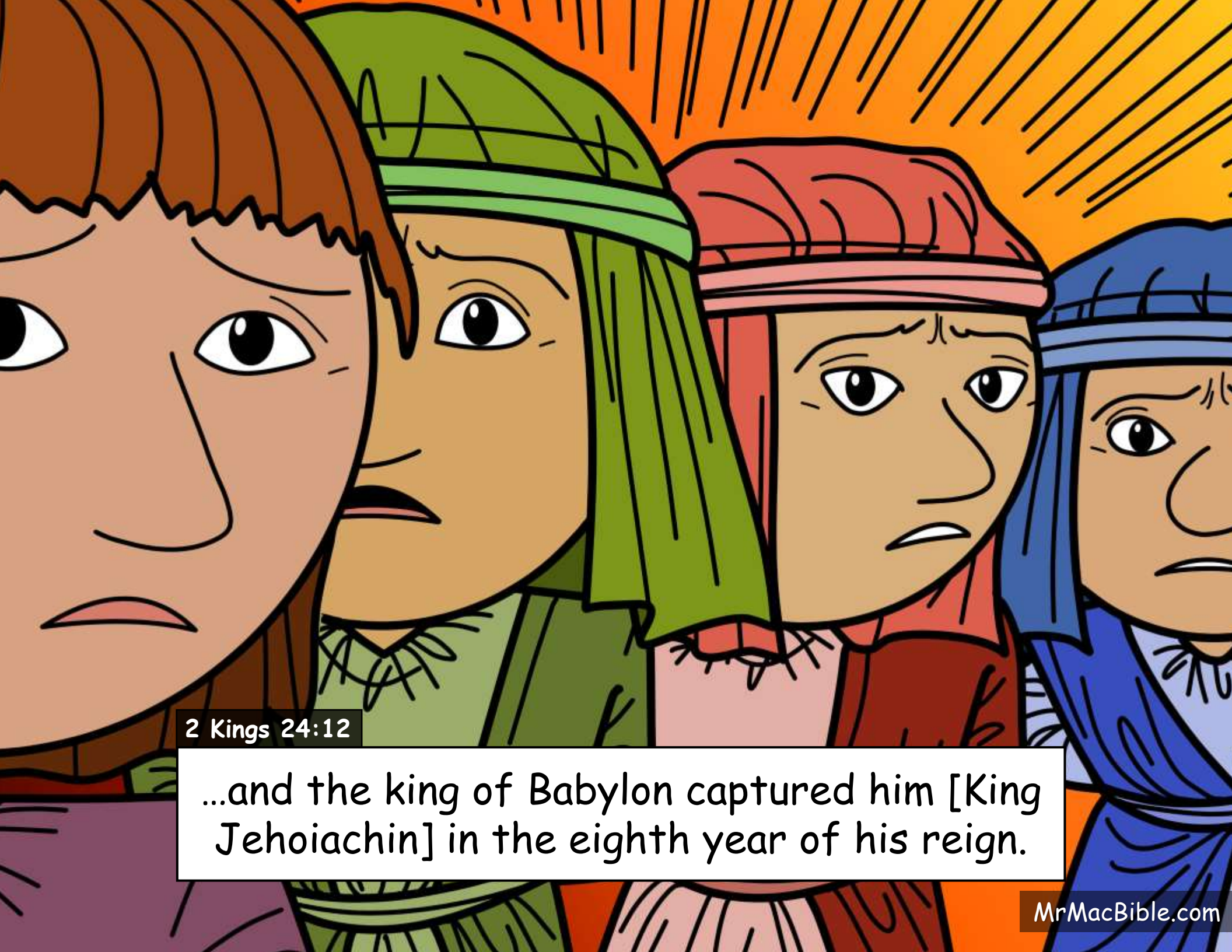

He carried away all Jerusalem, and all the princes, and all the mighty men of valour, even ten thousand captives, and all the craftsmen and the smiths.



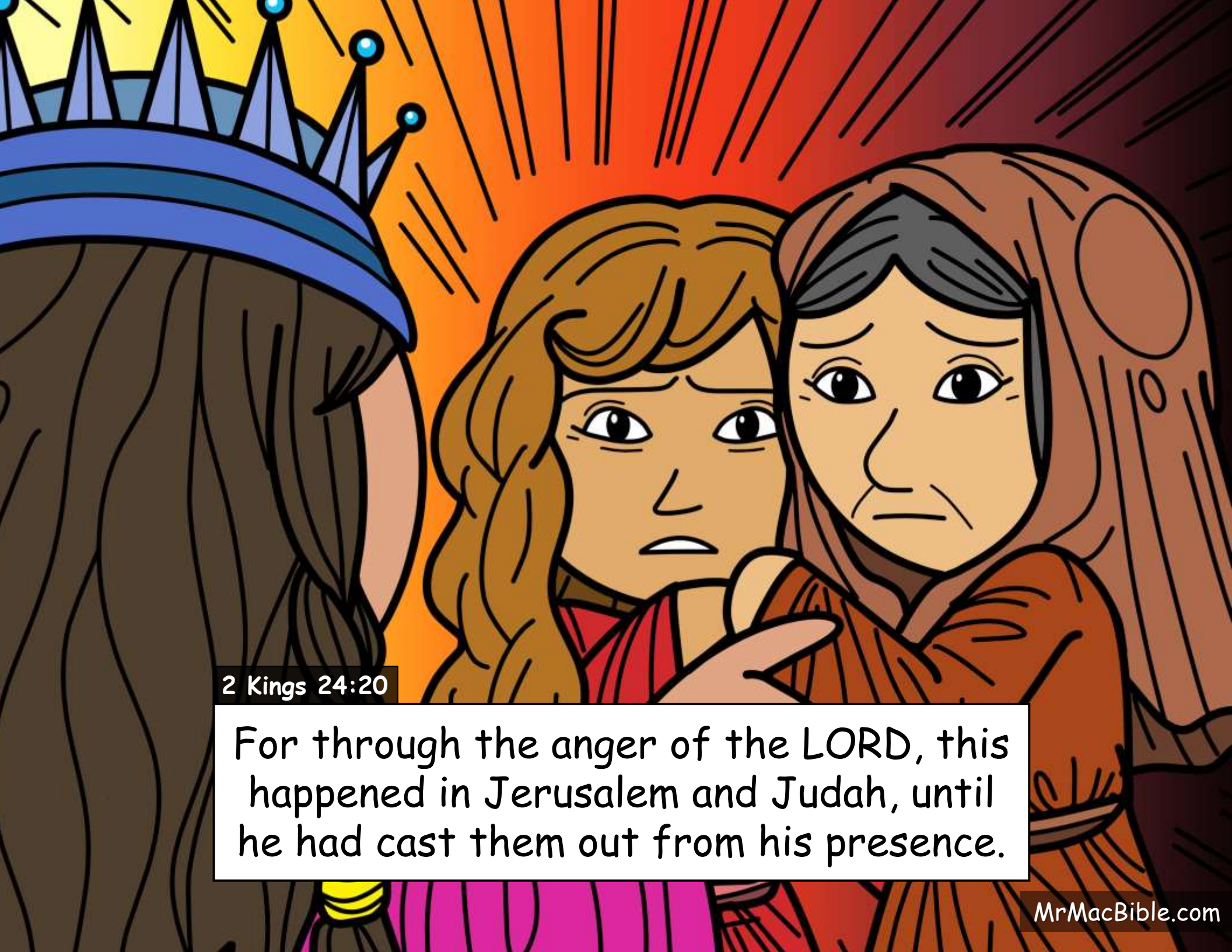
2 Kings 24:17

The king of Babylon made Mattaniah, Jehoiachin's father's brother, king in his place, and changed his name to Zedekiah.



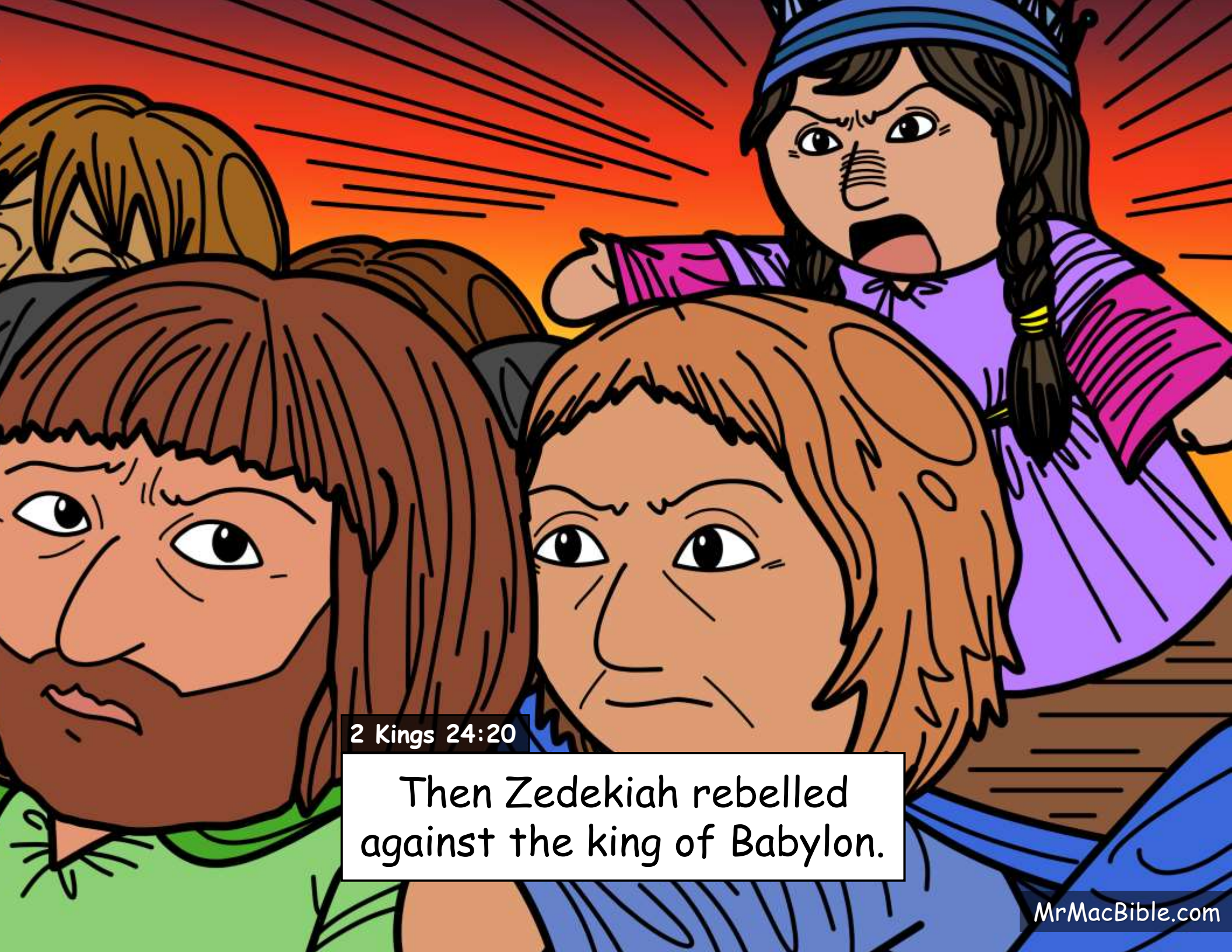

But the Chaldean army pursued the king, and overtook him in the plains of Jericho; and all his army was scattered from him.



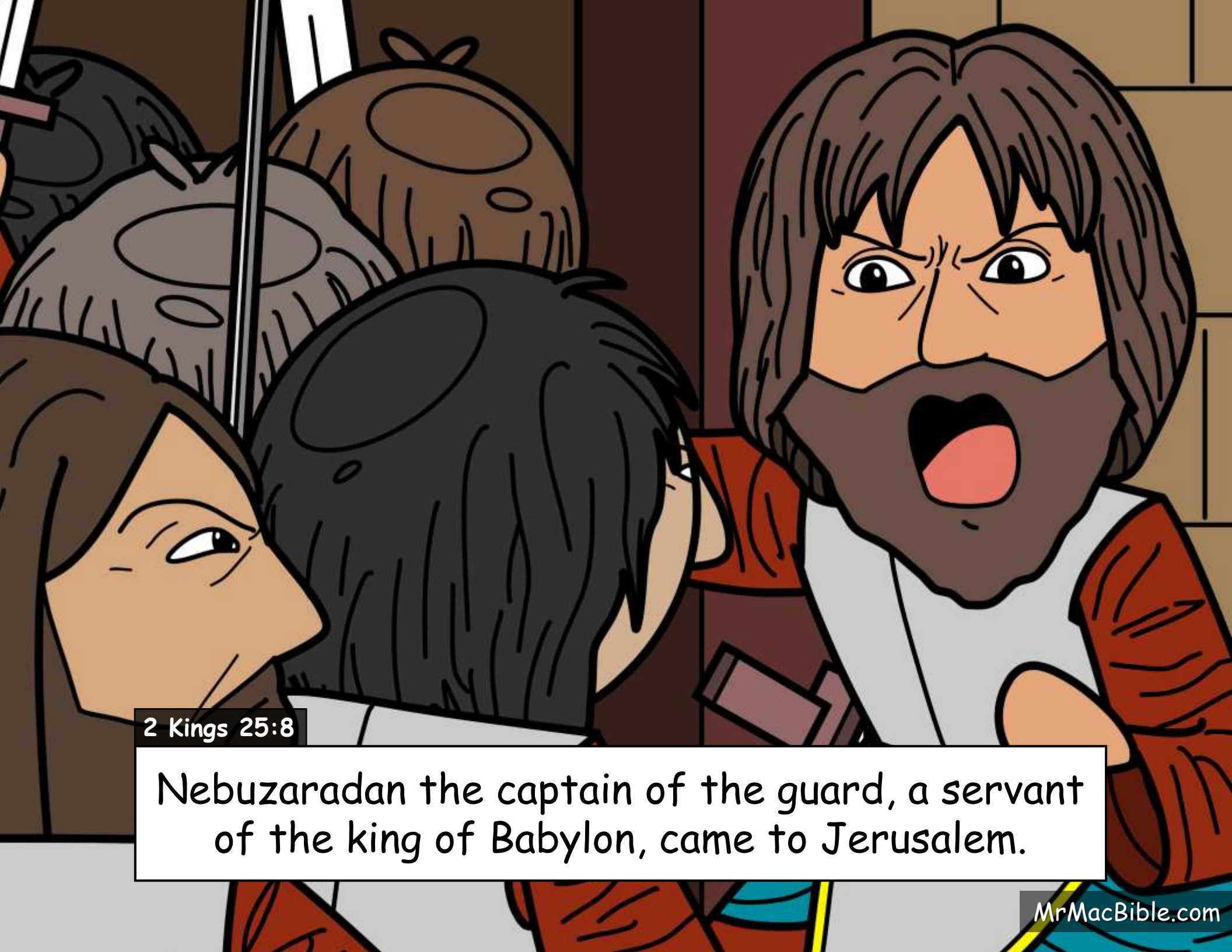
2 Kings 25:6

They killed Zedekiah's sons before his eyes, then put out Zedekiah's eyes, bound him in fetters, and carried him to Babylon.



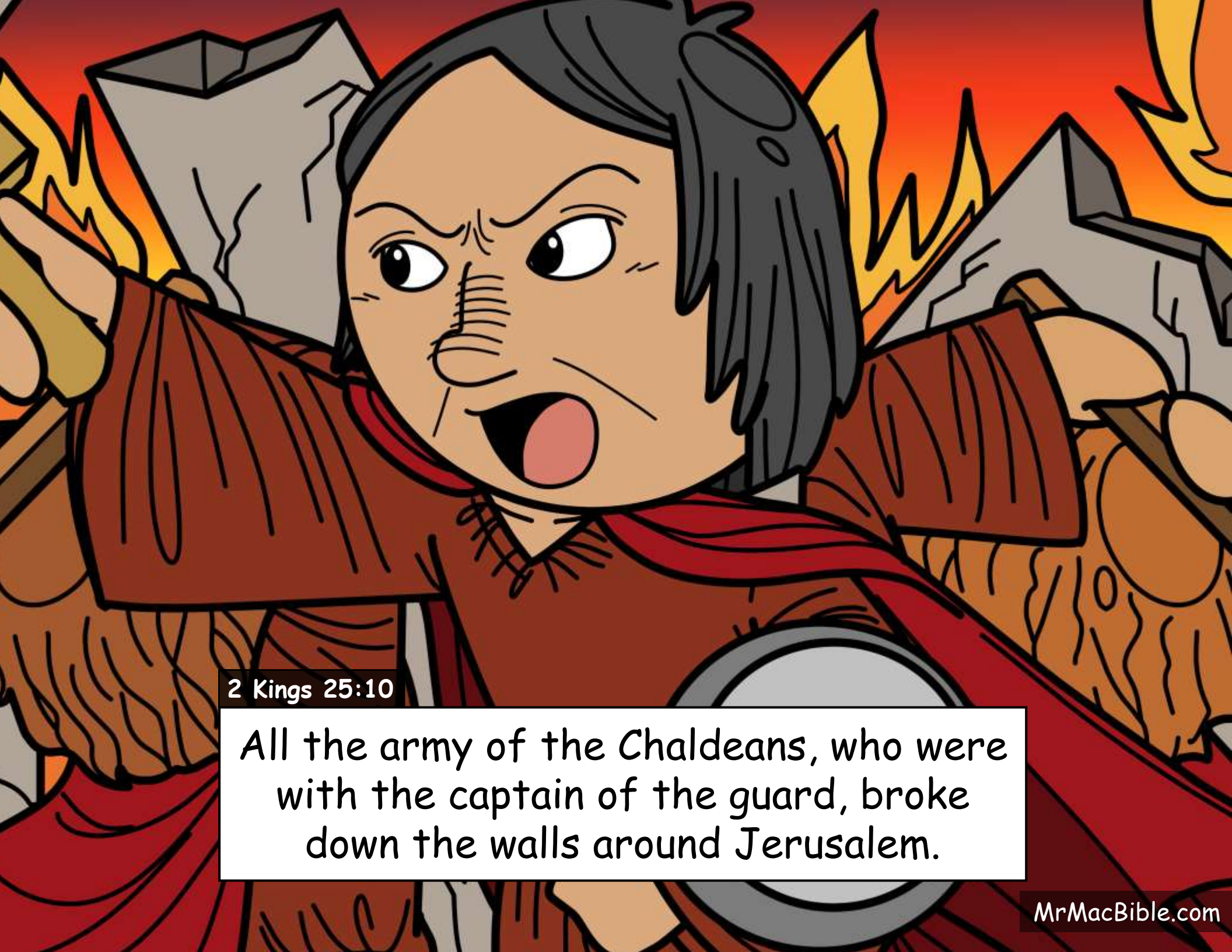
2 Kings 25:8

The king spoke to Ashpenaz, the master of his eunuchs, that he should bring in some of the children of Israel, even of the royal offspring and of the nobles:



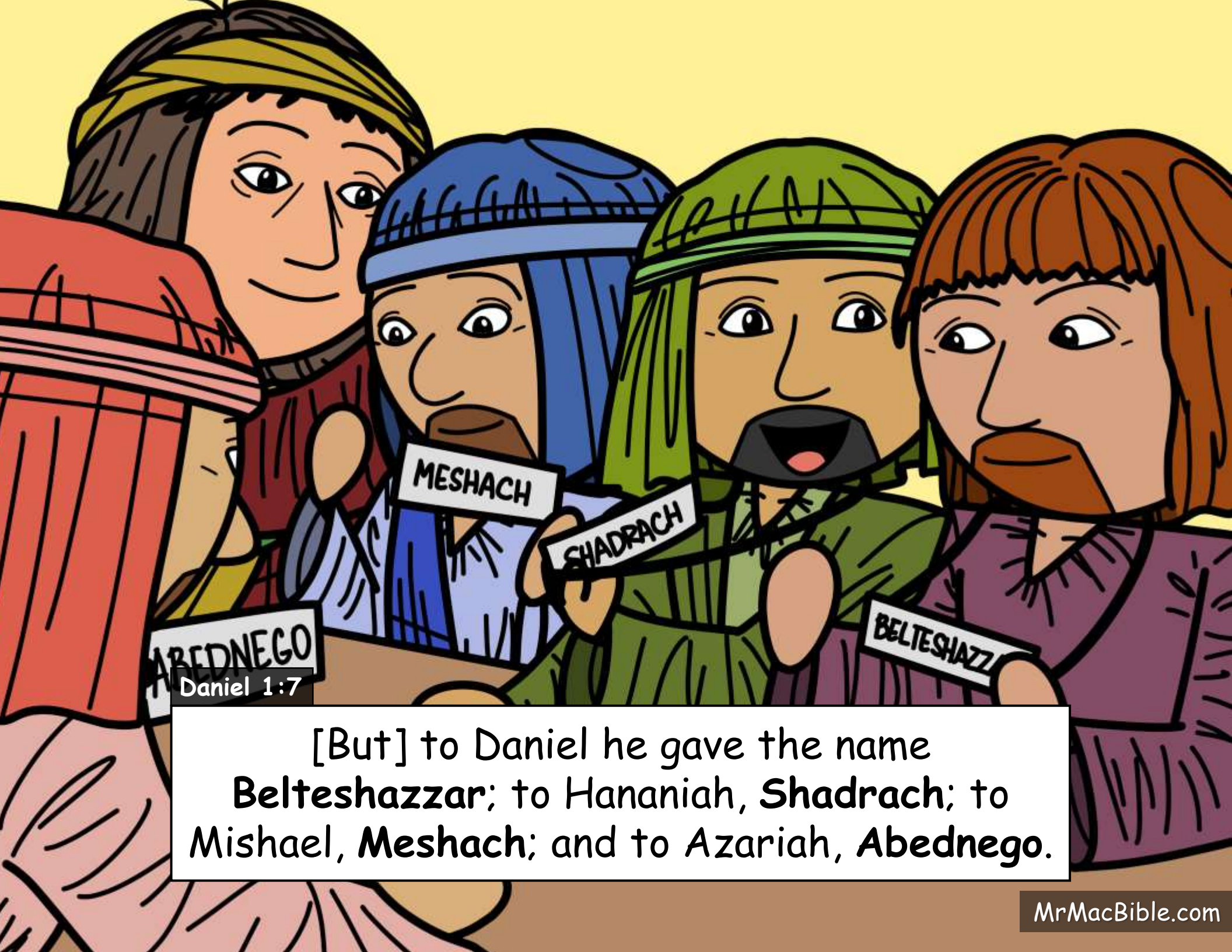
Daniel 1:4

...and that he should teach them the learning and the language of the Chaldeans.



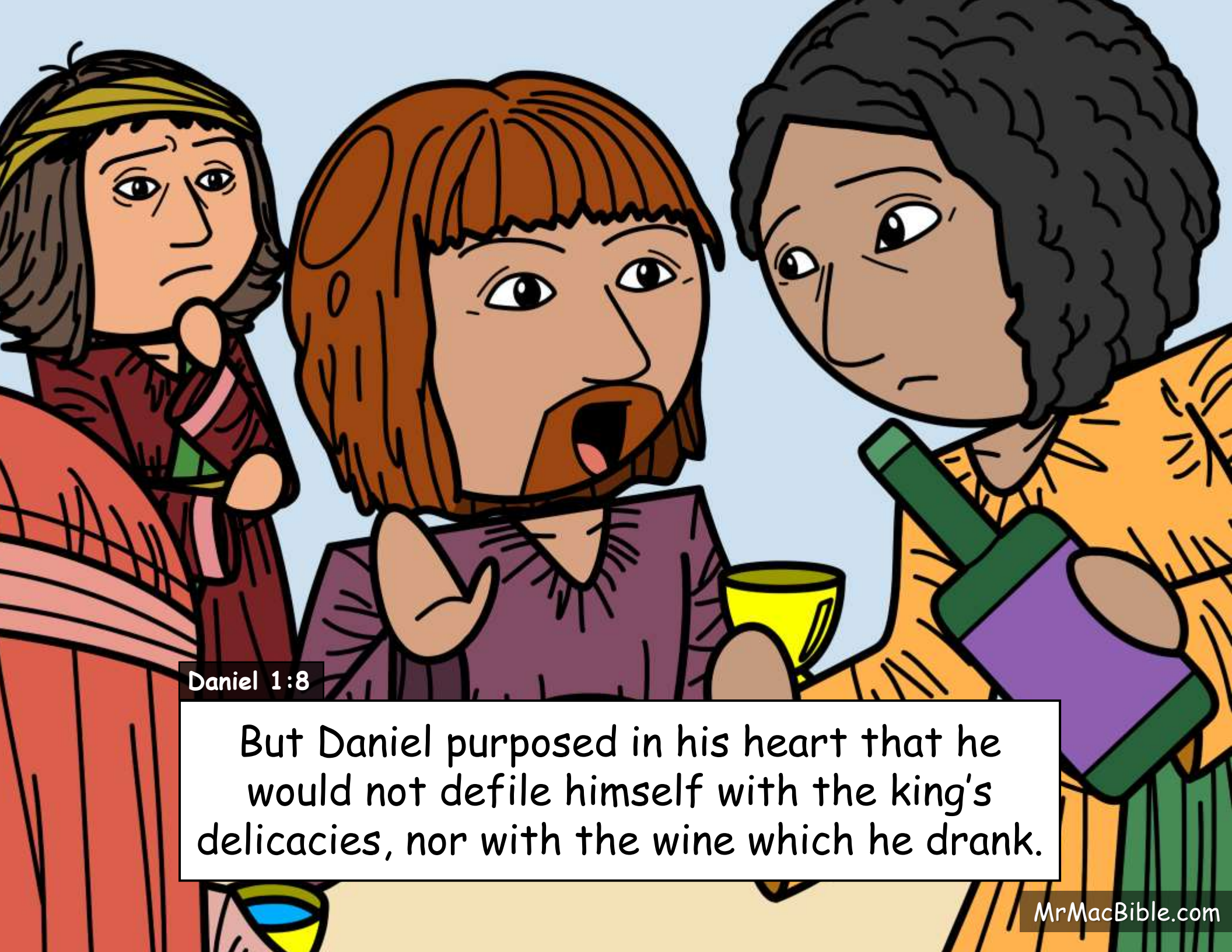
Daniel 1:6

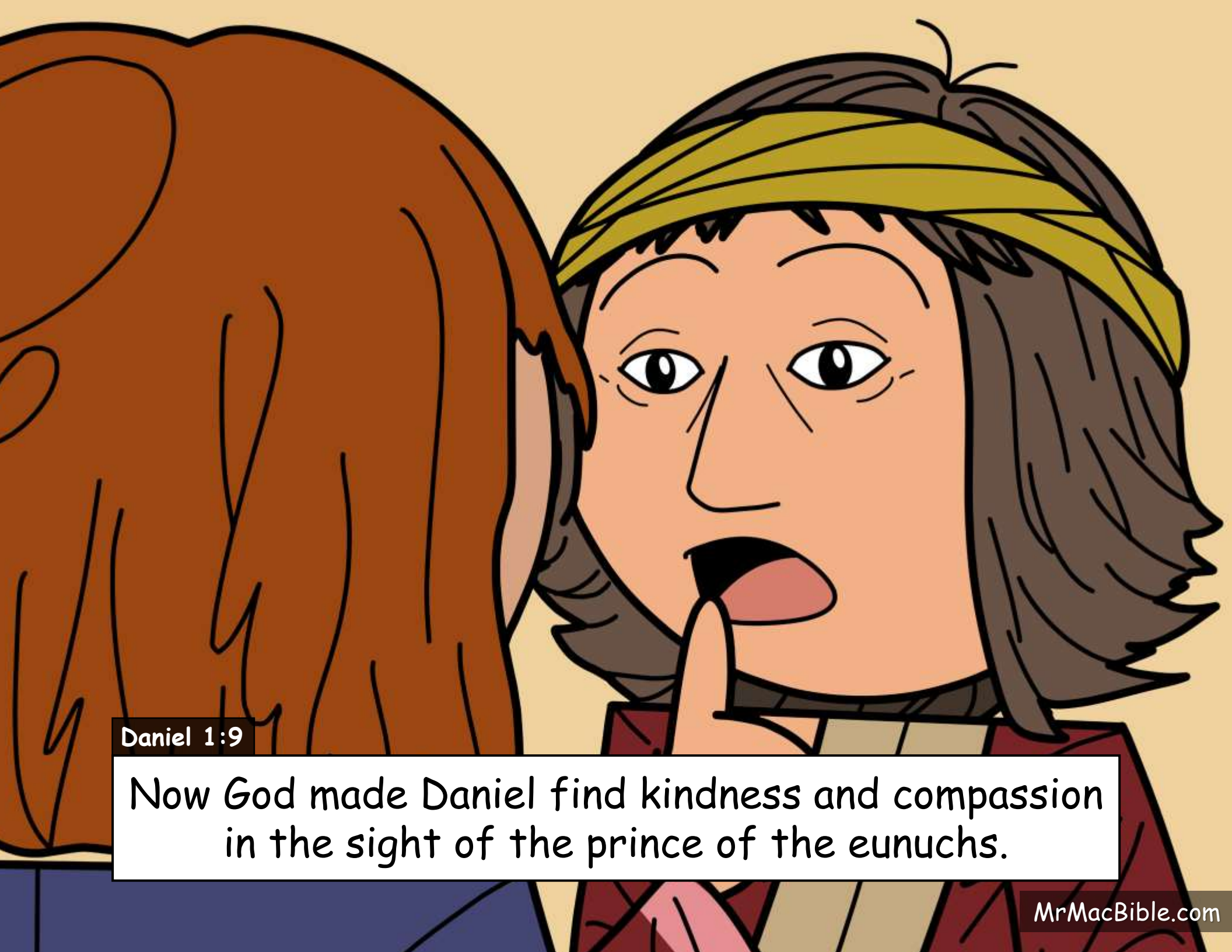
Daniel 1:8

But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank.



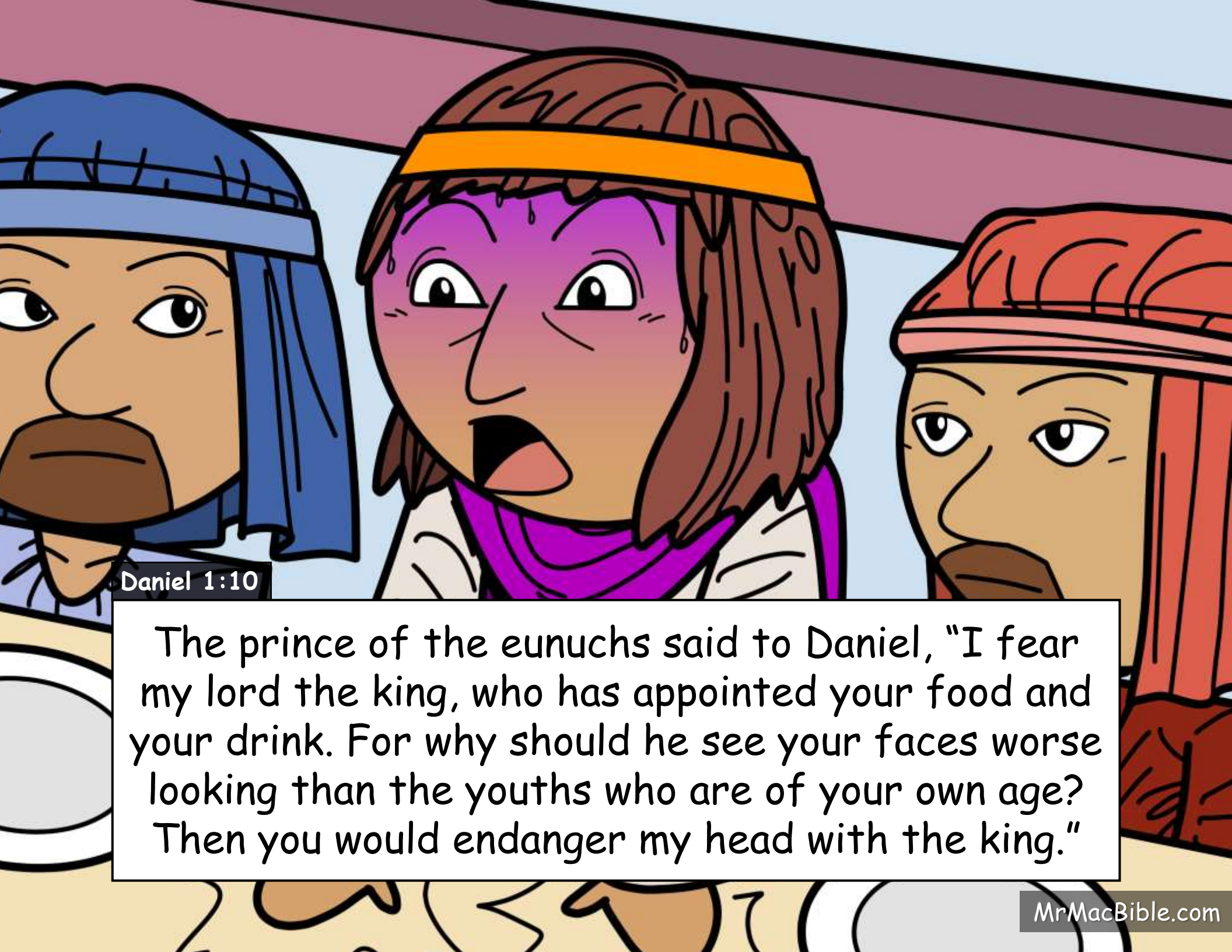
Daniel 1:8

"Then let our faces be examined before you, and the face of the youths who eat of the king's delicacies; and as you see, deal with your servants."

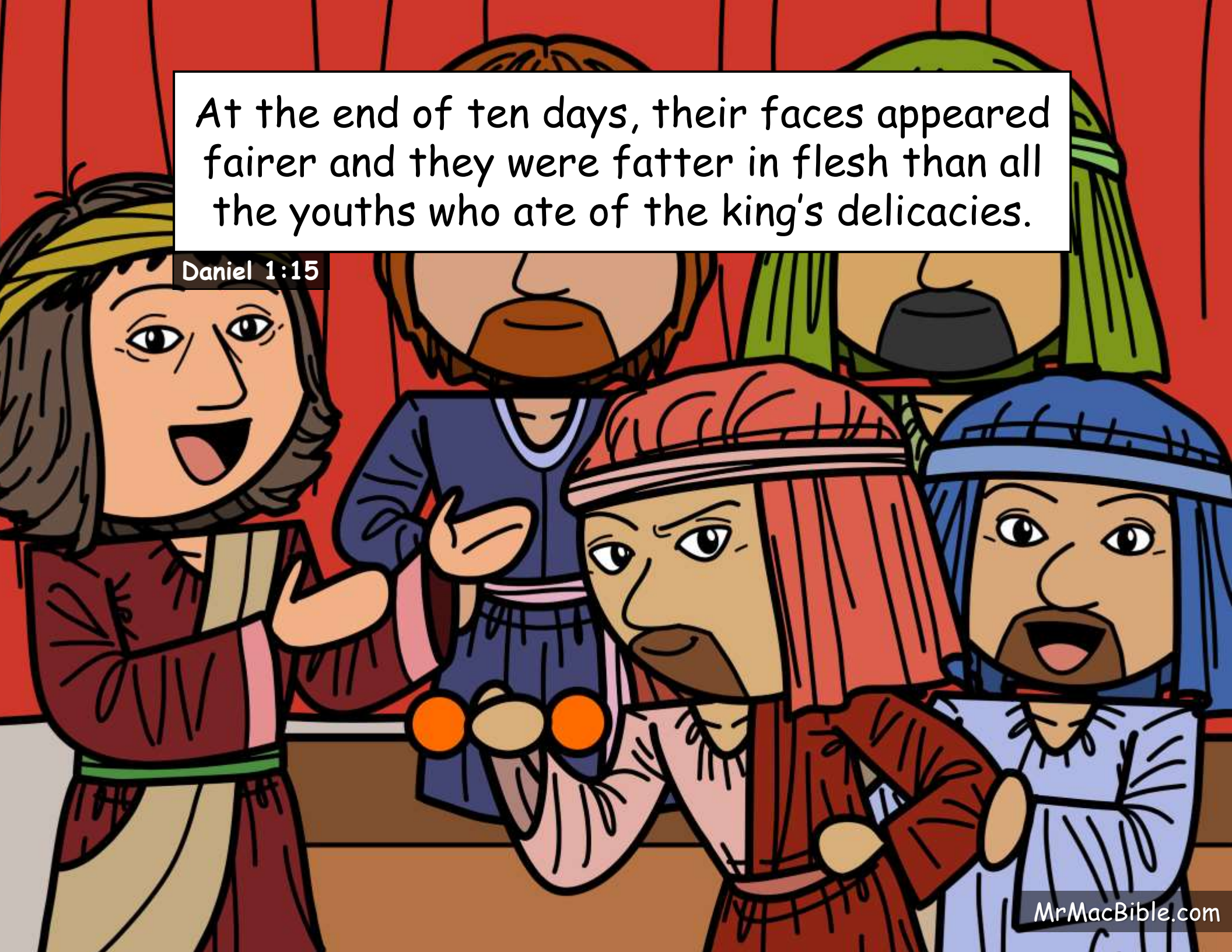
So he listened to them in this matter,

At the end of ten days, their faces appeared fairer and they were fatter in flesh than all the youths who ate of the king's delicacies.

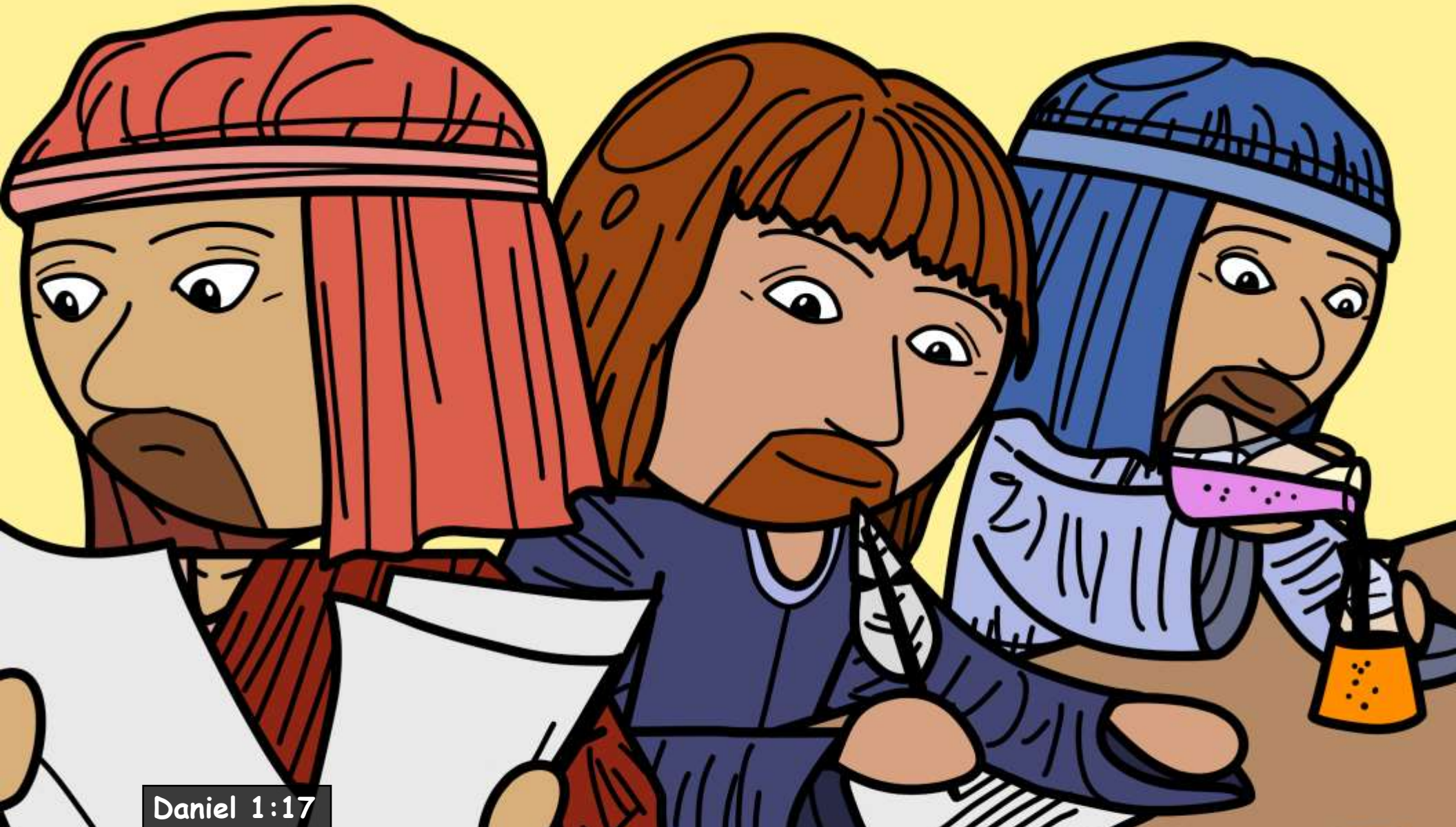

Daniel 1:19


The king talked with them; and amongst them all was found no one like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. Therefore stood they before the king.

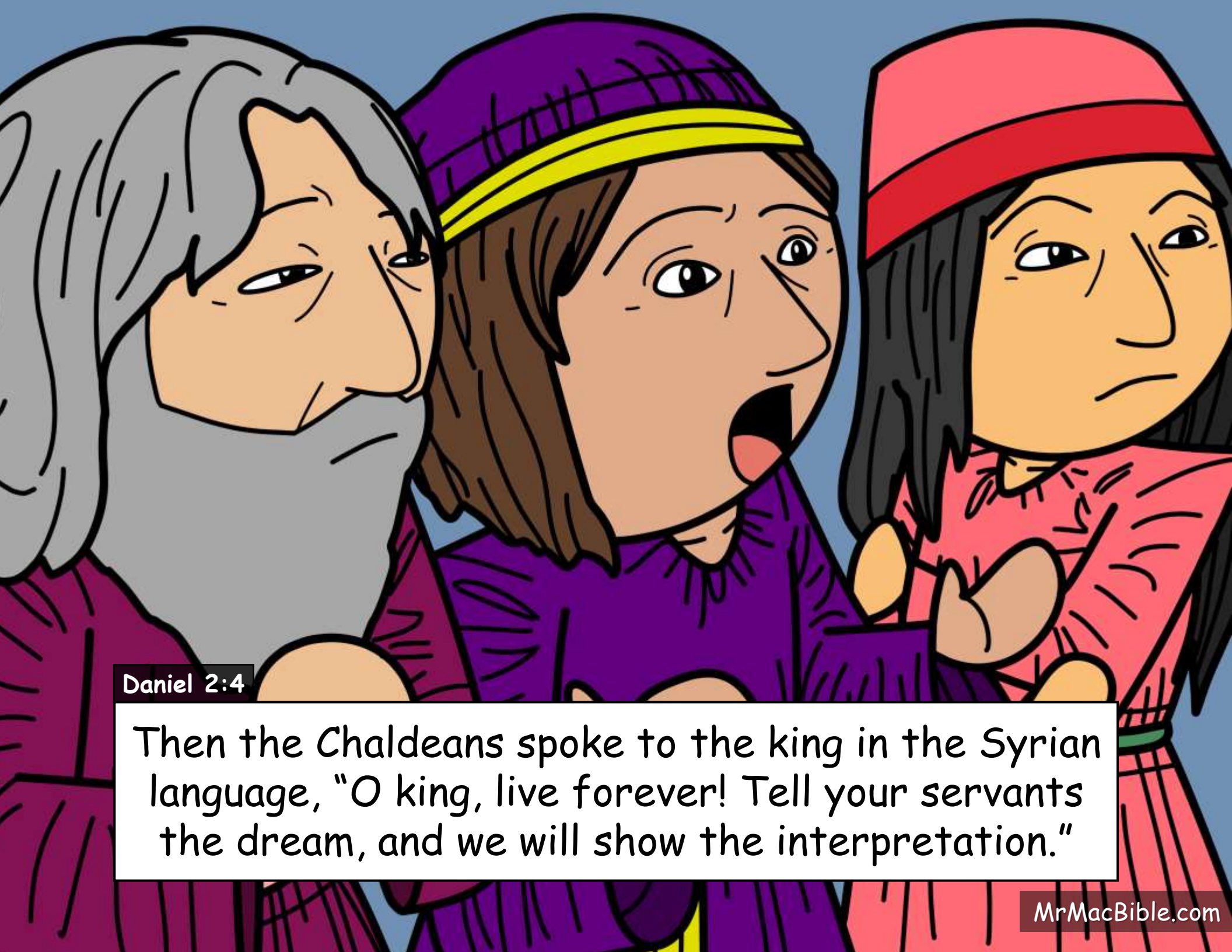
Daniel 2:1

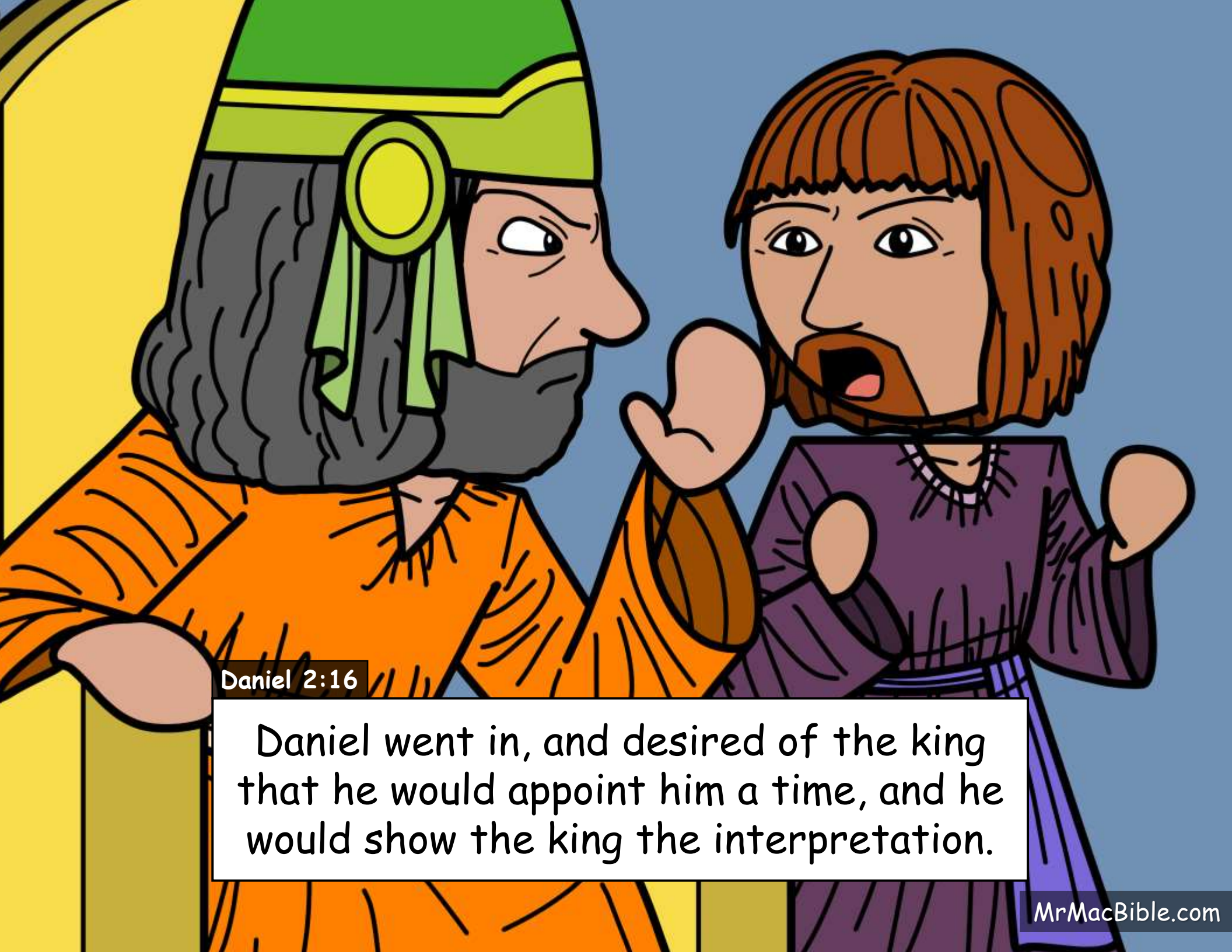
Daniel 2:12

...that they would desire mercies of the God of heaven concerning this secret, that Daniel and his companions would not perish with the rest of the wise men of Babylon.



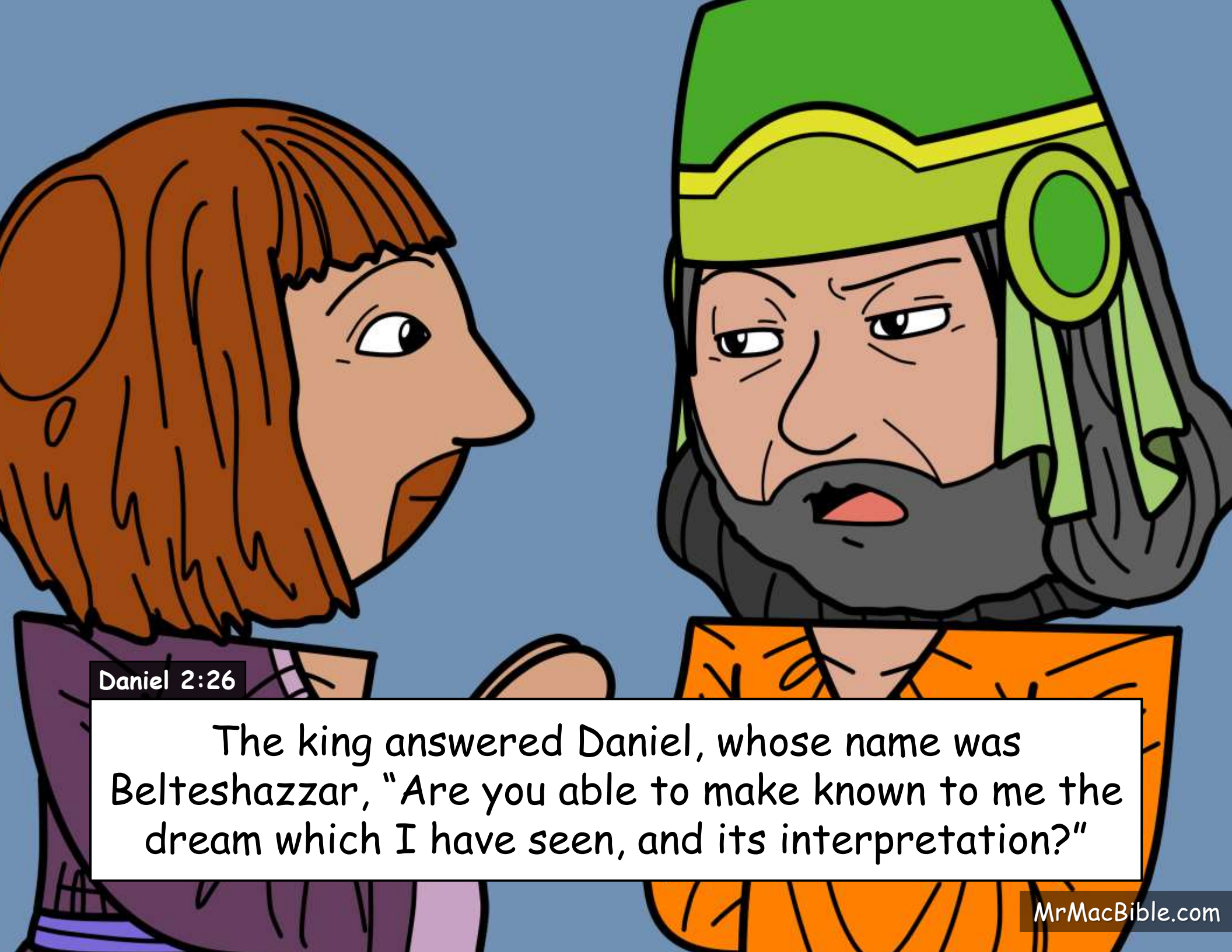
Daniel 2:19

Then Arioch brought in Daniel before the king in haste, and said this to him: "I have found a man of the children of the captivity of Judah who will make known to the king the interpretation."



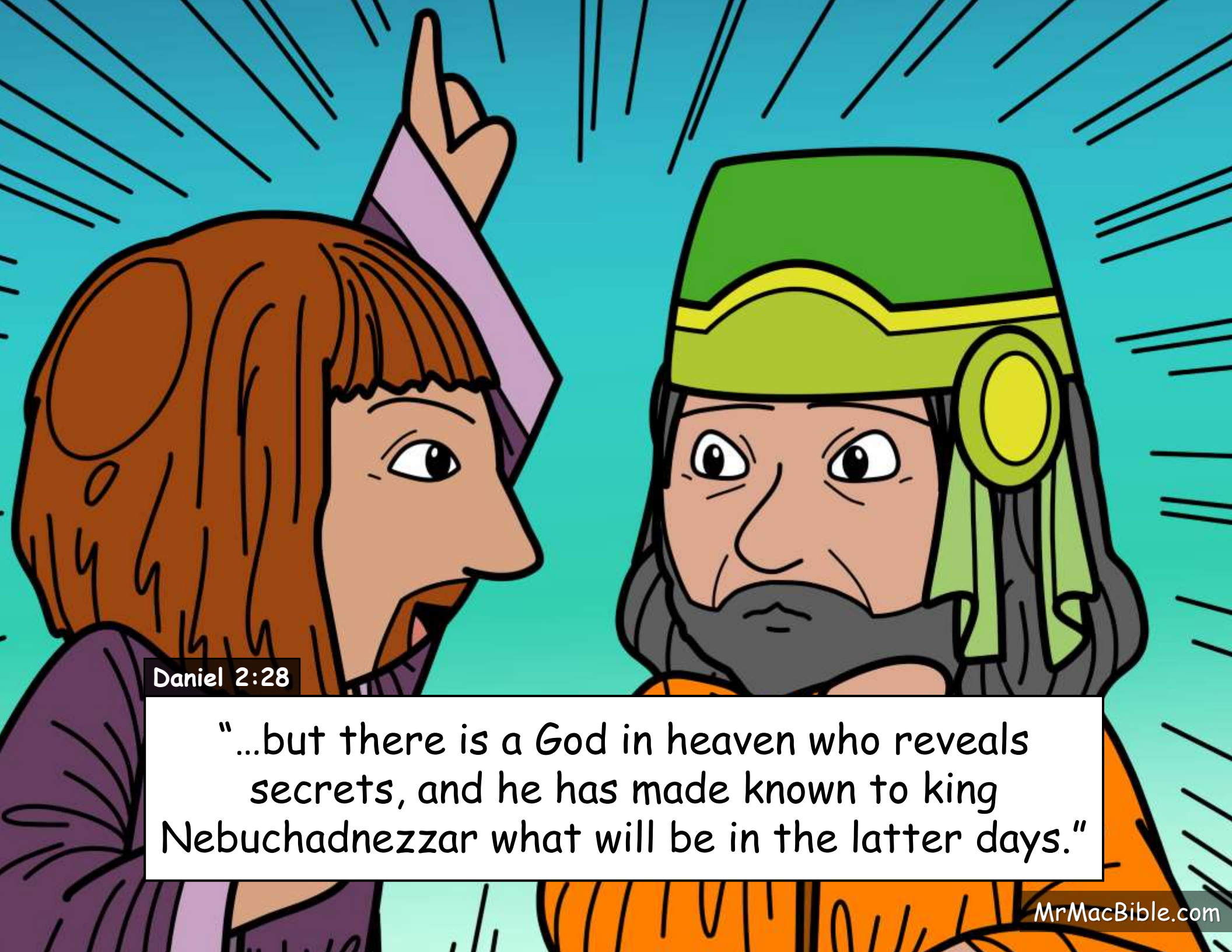
Daniel 2:26

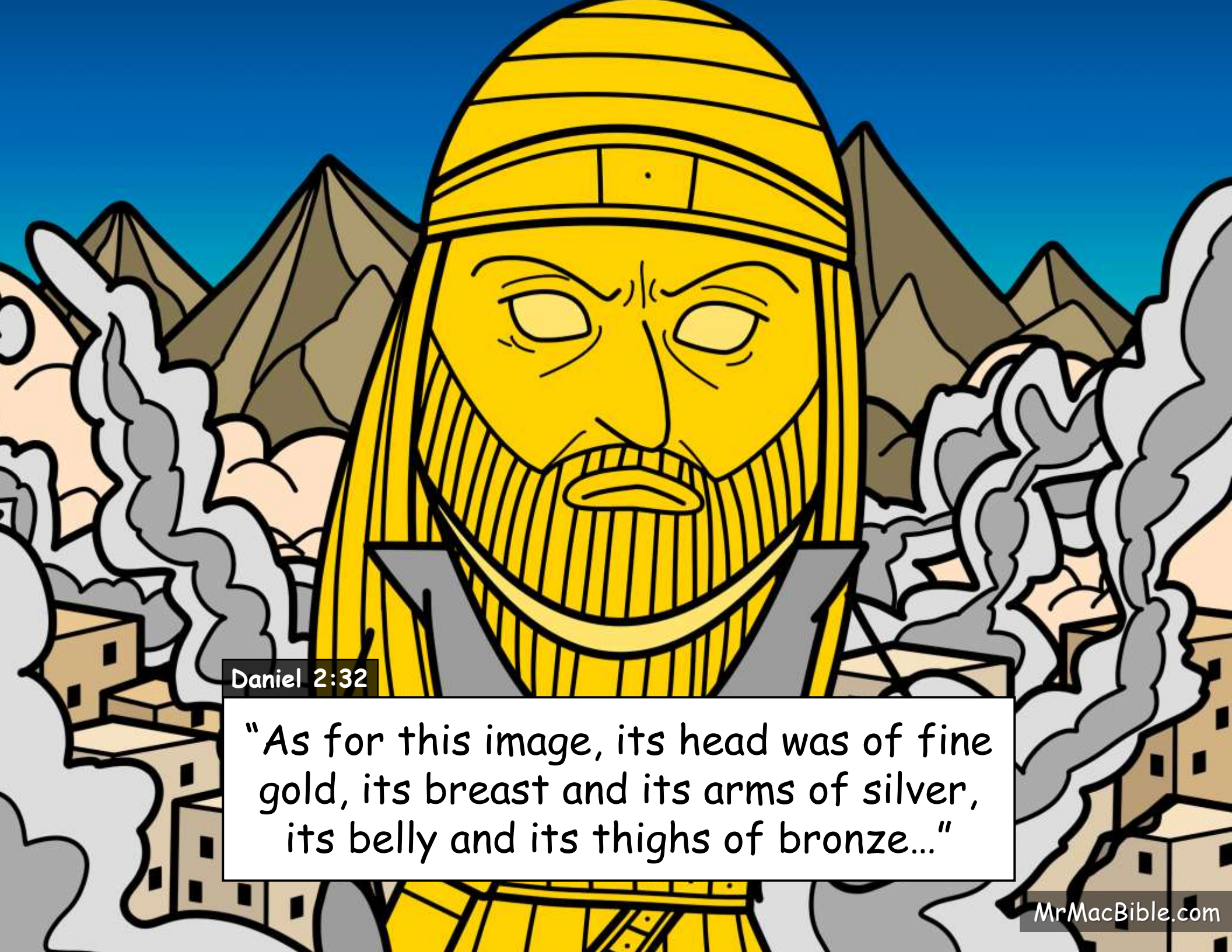

"This image, which was mighty, and whose brightness was excellent, stood before you; and its appearance was terrifying."



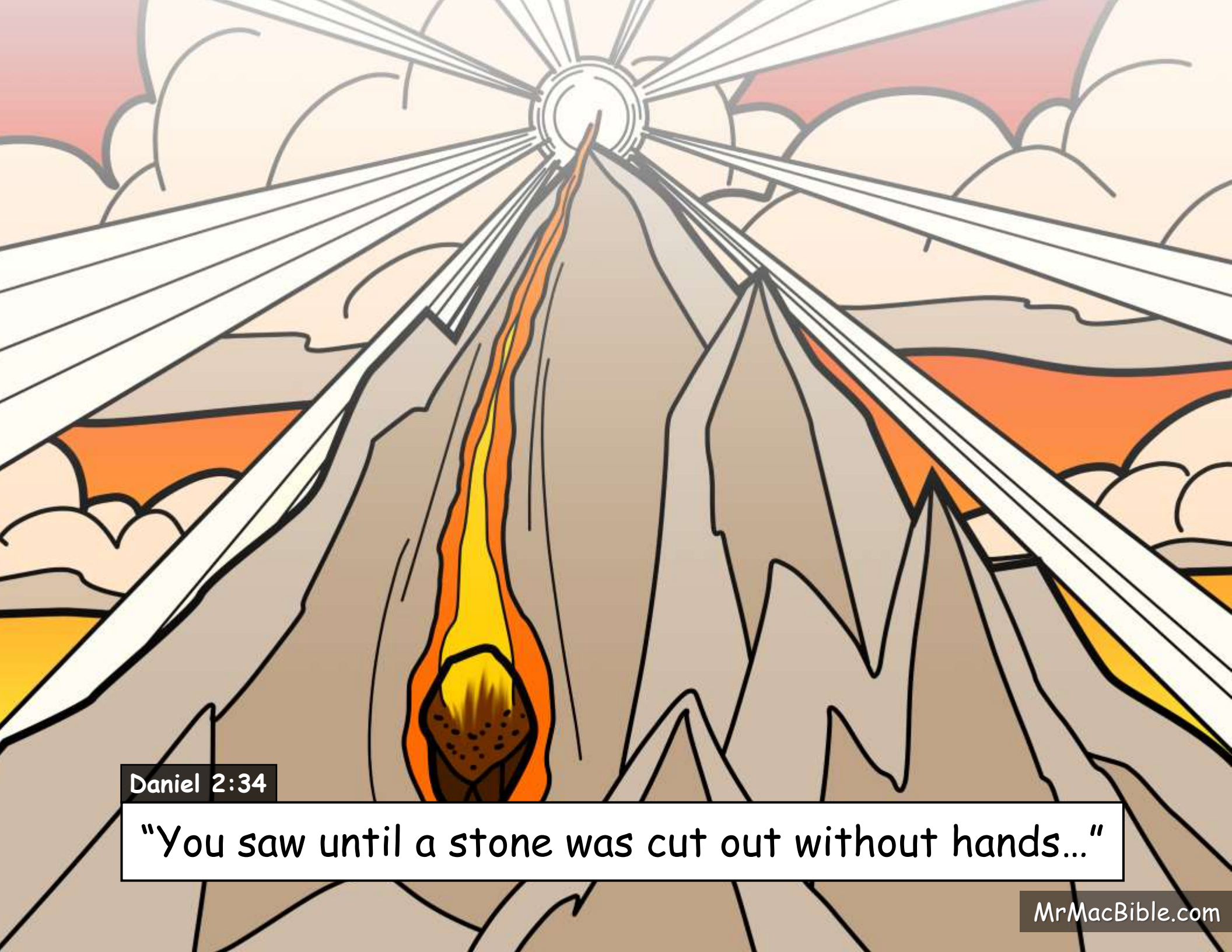
